My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me."

On this Good Shepherd Sunday, the Church turns its gaze to Christ, the Good Shepherd who knows each of us by name, who walks before us, and who lays down His life for His flock. His voice is steady and sure, calling us to follow Him in faith and trust, even in uncertain times.

This year, we hear that voice echoed in a powerful new way as we welcome the election of Pope Leo XIV, our new Holy Father. His election comes as a moment of profound joy and hope for the Church. A member of the Augustinian order, Pope Leo XIV brings with him a rich spiritual heritage shaped by one of the Church's greatest shepherds, St. Augustine.

In his first address as pope, Leo XIV echoed Augustine's timeless words: "For you, I am a bishop. With you, I am a Christian." Though he leads the flock, he remains a fellow pilgrim - walking with us, not above us - always seeking the face of the Good Shepherd.

May he be a shepherd after Christ's own heart - wise, courageous, compassionate - and may his voice help us to recognise more clearly the voice of Jesus in our lives. Lord Jesus, bless Pope Leo XIV. Strengthen him with your grace, guide him with your Spirit, and through his leadership, lead your Church ever closer to your heart.

WHAT THE CATHOLIC CHURCH TEACHES ABOUT MASS OFFERINGS

The faithful who make an offering so that Mass can be celebrated for their intention, contribute to the good of the Church, and by that offering they share in the Church's concern for the support of its ministers and its activities. Code of Canon Law, Canon 946

A Mass offering is a donation given to the parish so that a priest can celebrate or concelebrate Mass with a particular intention. Every Mass is offered for the whole Church, living and dead, as expressed in the Eucharistic Prayer. The priest does not keep the Mass offering; it goes into the parish account.

A priest must offer an intention each time that he celebrates a Mass.

Missa pro Populo

Every Sunday, a Parish Priest must ensure that one Mass is said for the intention of all the people in the parish. This is called the Missa pro Populo. When the Parish Priest is not celebrating Sunday Mass in the parish, this Mass is not said in the parish but is said by the Parish Priest wherever he may be.

Should the intention be announced at Mass?

The priest has no obligation under Canon Law to mention the name or the particular intention, and the Church recommends that this should not be the practice. The priest is required to 'have it in his mind'. The Mass intention is not for the people but for the priest only. Any concelebrating priests will also have particular intentions. Although the priest does not mention the intention, he has it firmly in mind and prays for it during Mass. Priests who say the Mass intention are doing so unofficially and are not keeping to the official practice of the Church. Priests should not be pressured to do something that is not the Church's official practice. The Church recommends publishing that week's Mass intentions in weekly newsletters or notice boards.

ASSISTED SUICIDE LEGISLATION

The important vote for all MPs on the assisted suicide legislation, known as the Terminally Ill Adults (End of Life) Bill, has been postponed for a few weeks but we are still urged to appeal to our MP to vote against it when it comes to the House of Commons. The next vote is on **16th May**

Despite a disappointing initial vote of 330–275 in favour, there is now a realistic chance the Bill can be defeated. The Independent newspaper reports that 142 MPs who initially backed the Bill could withdraw their support. NOW is the time for Catholics to make their voices heard.

If assisted suicide becomes law in England & Wales:

1. Hospice [and palliative care] provision will be undermined
2. Suicide prevention efforts will be weakened
3. Elderly and disabled people will feel pressure to take their own lives*

In the US state of Oregon, almost half of those who have died by assisted suicide cited fear of being a burden on their families or carers as a reason for choosing to die. Only 1-in-3 people cite fear of pain.

Please take a postcard from the back of church, complete it and send it to Mr Peter Dowd, MP for Bootle, who voted in favour of Bill last November.

The charity Right to Life UK has a simple online mechanism to allow people to contact their Member of Parliament and it only takes a few moments to submit a message to ask an MP to stop assisted suicide being rushed into law. It can be accessed here: www.righttolife.org.uk/asvote.

Please also consider signing the Care Not Killing petition. There are only a few more days before the next vote

Statement on the announcement of Pope Leo XIV from the Archdiocese of Liverpool

Archbishop Malcolm McMahon OP, Apostolic Administrator of Liverpool said:

Dear brothers and sisters,

It is with a profound sense of joy and thanksgiving to God that we welcome the news of the election of Cardinal Robert Prevost as the Holy Father Pope Leo XIV, the 267th successor of St Peter.

The Cardinal Electors, inspired by the Holy Spirit, have chosen a gifted and prayerful pastor to walk in the shoes of the fisherman to be a focus of unity for the Church today.

After the call and legacy of the late Pope Francis calling the Church to be missionary disciples and proclaim the joy of the Gospel, we as the Catholic community of the Archdiocese of Liverpool pledge our closeness in prayer and our support to Our Holy Father the Pope.

I invite all the faithful of the archdiocese, and men and women of good will to pray with me at this time.

O God pastor and ruler of all the faithful, look with mercy upon Pope Leo XIV who you have appointed to shepherd the Universal Church. Renew deep within him the spirit of Holiness to be the shepherd, the guide of the Church for the needs of the world today in 2025.

Through Christ our Lord Amen.

Pope Leo XIV's Biography from Catholic Bishop's Conference

Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost, O.S.A., Prefect of the Dicastery for Bishops, Archbishop-emeritus of Chiclayo, was born on 14 September 1955 in Chicago (Illinois, United States). IN 1977 he entered the novitiate of the Order of Saint Augustine (O.S.A.) in the province of Our Lady of Good Counsel, in Saint Louis. On 29 August 1981 he gave his solemn vows. He studied at the Catholic Theological Union of Chicago, receiving a diploma in theology.

At the age of 27 he was sent by the Order to Rome to study canon law at the Pontifical Saint Thomas Aquinas University (Angelicum). He received priestly ordination on 19 June 1982. He received his licentiate in 1984, and was then sent to work in the mission of Chulucanas, in Piura, Peru (1985-1986).

In 1987 he was awarded a doctorate with the thesis: "The role of the local prior in the Order of Saint Augustine". In the same year he was elected director of vocations and director of the missions of the Augustinian province of "Mother of Good Counsel" of Olympia Fields, Illinois, United States of America. In 1988 he was sent to the mission of Trujillo as director of the joint formation project for Augustinian aspirants in the Vicariates of Chulucanas, Iquitos and Apurímac. There he served as community prior (1988-1992), director of formation (1988-1998) and teacher of the professed (1992-1998). In the archdiocese of Trujillo he was judicial vicar (1989-1998), and professor of canon, patristic and moral law in the "San Carlos e San Marcelo" Major Seminary.

In 1999 he was elected provincial prior of the "Mother of Good Counsel" province, Chicago. After two and a half years, the ordinary general Chapter elected him prior general, a ministry again entrusted to him in the 2007 ordinary general Chapter. In October 2013 he returned to his province (Chicago) to serve as teacher of the professed and provincial vicar, roles he held 3 November 2014, when Pope Francis appointed him apostolic administrator of the diocese of Chiclayo, Peru, elevating him to the dignity of bishop and assigning him the titular diocese of Sufar. On 7 November he took canonical possession of the diocese in the presence of the apostolic nuncio James Patrick Green; he was ordained a bishop on 12 December, Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, in the cathedral of his diocese. He served as bishop of Chiclayo from 26 November 2015. In March 2018 he became second vice president of the Peruvian Episcopal Conference. Pope Francis appointed him a member of the Congregation for the Clergy in 2019, and member of the Congregation for Bishops in 2020.

On 15 April 2020, the Pope appointed him apostolic administrator of the diocese of Callao. On 30 January 2023 Pope Francis appointed Cardinal Prevost as prefect of the Dicastery for Bishops and president of the Pontifical Commission for Latin America.

Created and proclaimed Cardinal by Pope Francis in the Consistory of 30 September 2023, of the Deaconry of Santa Monica.

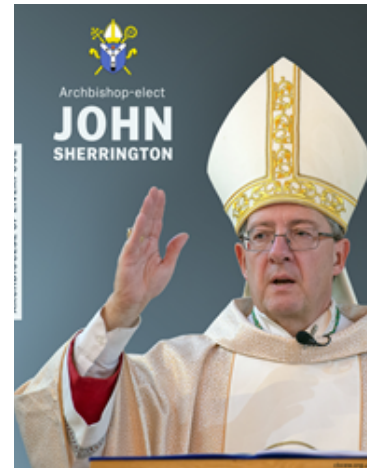
