

Now, as we gather again, we look forward to the months ahead with fresh energy and hope.

The Gospel this Sunday may sound demanding: Jesus asks us to put Him before every relationship, possession, and plan. STATEMENT REGARDING MISINFORMATION ABOUT ST. ELIZABETH'S CHURCH AND PRIMARY SCHOOL

We are aware of misinformation currently circulating on social media concerning St. Elizabeth's Church and St. Elizabeth's Catholic Primary School in Litherland. We would like to clarify the following:

- St. Elizabeth's Church is being used by the Knanaya Catholic community, which is part of the Syro-Malabar Catholic Church, and is in full communion with the Roman Catholic Church. Members of the community have been working hard to clean up the church grounds, which had become overgrown with weeds. During this work, they discovered the grotto and statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The statue was broken beyond repair and was missing its head. In response, the Knanaya community has taken the initiative to restore the area by preparing the grounds for a new grotto, which will feature a replacement statue.
- St Elizabeth's Primary School continues to flourish and serve the local community.

Regrettably, this misinformation has led to acts of vandalism at the church. The archdiocese strongly condemns such behaviour. Vandalism is a criminal offence, and anyone found engaging in such acts will be reported to the police.


We urge everyone to verify information through official channels and to respect the integrity of our religious and educational institutions.

ST CARLO ACUTIS & ST PIER GIORGIO FRASSATI

This morning, Pope Leo will preside over his first canonisations since his election as Pope earlier this year. How fitting that he should declare two incredible people as saints for the Church; St Carlo Acutis and St Pier Giorgio Frassati.



Saint Carlo Acutis (1991 -2006) was born in

London. His family then moved to Italy. He will be the first millennial saint and in his short life developed a deep devotion to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament and the Eucharist. He often said 'The Eucharist is my highway to heaven'. He wanted to receive Jesus in Holy Communion every day and was always kind and generous to the the poor people he met. Many came to his funeral. Fascinated by the digital world, he built a website devoted to Eucharistic miracles. He is an example to inspire young people. He is probably the first saint to wear trainers and jeans. Carlo pointed out that we shouldn't be photocopies of others, the Lord didn't create us to be the same as everyone else, but to be our true selves with Jesus at the heart of ourselves.

Saint Pier Giorgio Frassati (1901-1924) was a Italian Catholic activist for justice and member of the Third Order of Dominicans. He joined organisations like Catholic Action and the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. He was prayerful and always concerned with justice and the poor. A passionate mountaineer and athlete, he said 'Charity is not enough; we need social reform' and worked hard to bring about the social reforms in the world of work which Pope Leo XIII had written about in Rerum Novarum. He will inspire prayer and the work of justice which is much needed in our unjust world of war and violence."

Archbishop John says: "I am delighted that both Carlo Acutis and Pier Giorgio Frassati have been canonised and recognised in the communion of saints. I hope that across the archdiocese, people will give thanks to God and ask their intercession for our young people. These two new saints can inspire young people to be more active in the mission of the Church as well as develop a life of prayer and adoration."

This week, Fr Mark will lead thirty parishioners on a Jubilee Pilgrimage to Italy. Their journey will begin in Rome, where they will walk the Jubilee Path to the Holy Door of St Peter's Basilica and visit the other great Major Basilicas. They will also join the Holy Father for his General Audience on Wednesday, before praying at the tomb of Pope Francis in St Mary Major.

From Rome, the pilgrims will travel to Subiaco, the birthplace of St Benedict's monastic life, and then continue to San Giovanni Rotondo for two nights at the shrine of St Padre Pio. Next Saturday they will pause in Lanciano, the site of the famous Eucharistic Miracle where the bread and wine became real flesh and blood—a sign

The final stage of the pilgrimage will be in Assisi, where the group will stay for two nights, visiting the Basilicas of St Francis and St Clare, and, if possible, praying before the tomb of Blessed Carlo Acutis.

Our pilgrims will return home next Monday. Each day they have promised to carry our parish in prayer, asking the saints whose shrines they visit to intercede for us. Let us, in turn, pray for them—that their journey will be filled with grace, joy, and renewal, and that the fruits of their pilgrimage will enrich our whole parish family.

As part of the Catholic Safeguarding Standards Agency's (CSSA) focus on survivor engagement and support, they have created a public survey inviting survivors to contribute their experiences.

The purpose of this public call is to gather information from anyone who has had recent contact with a diocese or a Religious Life Group. This includes experiences that are new or ongoing, as well as those connected to non-recent abuse.
