

The parable of the rich man and Lazarus is one of Jesus 'most striking. We can picture it clearly: the rich man feasting daily, clothed in purple, while poor Lazarus lies at his gate, hungry and covered in sores. After death, their fortunes are reversed – Lazarus is carried to the comfort of Abraham, while the rich man finds himself in torment.

It is not that wealth itself condemns the man, but rather his blindness. Day after day, he walked past Lazarus and failed to see him as a brother. His sin was indifference. He had the means to help, but chose not to.

Jesus tells this parable to awaken us. Who are the "Lazaruses" at our gates? Perhaps they are the homeless on our streets, the lonely neighbour, the refugee seeking safety, or even someone in our own family longing for kindness. The challenge is not simply to feel pity, but to act with love.

Abraham's words are sobering: "They have Moses and the prophets; let them listen to them." We have even more – the Gospel of Christ, which calls us to see and serve him in the poor.

This Sunday is a reminder that heaven begins now, whenever we open our eyes and hearts. To notice, to share, to step out of comfort – this is the way of discipleship. In serving Lazarus, we serve Christ himself.

May we be people who see, love, and act, so that our lives proclaim God's mercy.

FEAST OF THE WEEK ST JEROME

He was born in Strido, in Dalmatia. He studied in Rome and was baptized there. He was attracted by the ascetic life and travelled to the East, where he was (unwillingly) ordained a priest. He was recalled to Rome to act as secretary to Pope Damasus, but on the Pope's death he returned to the East, to Bethlehem, where (with the aid of St Paula and others)



he founded a monastery, a hospice, and a school, and settled down to the most important work of his life, the translation of the Bible into Latin, a translation which, with some revisions, is still in use today. He wrote many works of his own, including letters and commentaries on Holy Scripture. When a time of troubles came upon the world, through barbarian invasions, and to the Church, through internal dissension, he helped the refugees and those in need. He died at Bethlehem.

As part of the Catholic Safeguarding Standards Agency's (CSSA) focus on survivor engagement and support, they have created a public survey inviting survivors to contribute their experiences.

The purpose of this public call is to gather information from anyone who has had recent contact with a diocese or a Religious Life Group. This includes experiences that are new or ongoing, as well as those connected to non-recent abuse.

Their primary focus is the period from July 2024 onwards, but they do not wish to limit what survivors choose to share. More information regarding this survey can be found here: Public Calls for Information
