


As we enter the Fifth Sunday of Lent, the Church brings us to one of the most moving moments in the Gospel: the raising of Lazarus. It is a story full of grief, friendship, and, ultimately, hope.

What is striking is that Jesus does not rush in to fix things. He arrives after Lazarus has died. Martha meets him with a mixture of faith and disappointment: “Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died.” It is a very human response — the kind of prayer we may recognise in our own lives when things do not turn out as we hoped.

And yet, into that moment, Jesus speaks words that change everything: “I am the resurrection and the life.” Not just in the future, not just at the end of time — but now. Even in the midst of loss, confusion, and darkness, he is present as life itself.

Before he raises Lazarus, Jesus weeps. That detail matters. God is not distant from our suffering. He stands with us in it. He shares it. And then he calls Lazarus out of the tomb.

Lent invites us to hear that same call. Each of us has places in our lives that can feel closed off, buried, or lifeless — habits, hurts, fears, or struggles in faith. And Christ speaks into those places: “Come out.”

As we move closer to Holy Week, this Gospel reminds us that Easter is not just something we remember. It is something God wants to do in us — bringing life where we thought there was none, and hope where we thought all was lost.



STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Each Friday in Lent, we walk with Jesus on the road to Calvary. The Stations of the Cross invite us not simply to remember what happened long ago, but to stand close to the Lord in His suffering love. At every fall, every encounter, every moment of pain, we see how far God is willing to go for us.

The Stations teach us that we are never alone in our own crosses. Christ has walked this path before us. When we pray the Stations, we place our struggles, our families, our parish, and our world into His wounded hands. Lent gives us this quiet space to slow down, to reflect, and to let His sacrifice shape our hearts.

FEAST OF THE WEEK

The Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord

The Annunciation is a quiet moment that changes everything. There are no crowds, no miracles, no great signs in the sky – just a young woman, a simple home, and a message from God. And yet, in that hidden moment, the whole of salvation begins to unfold. Appropriate that this is the last feast to be celebrated this side of Easter.



Mary is troubled at the angel’s greeting. She does not immediately understand what is being asked of her. There is uncertainty, even fear. But what stands out is her openness. She listens. She reflects. She asks a question – not out of disbelief, but out of a desire to understand how God is at work in her life.

And then she gives her answer: “Let it be done to me according to your word.” It is one of the most powerful sentences ever spoken. God does not force his way into the world; he waits for a human “yes.” Through Mary’s consent, Christ takes flesh, and God steps into our history in a new and definitive way.

The Annunciation reminds us that God often comes to us not in dramatic or overwhelming ways, but in the ordinary moments of our lives – in a quiet prompting, a word of Scripture, a call to serve, a moment of decision. Like Mary, we may not see the full picture. We may feel uncertain or unprepared.

But faith is not about having all the answers. It is about trust. And each day, in our own small way, we are invited to echo Mary’s response – to say yes to God, and to allow Christ to take shape in us.

Join us for weekly sessions each Monday during Lent for a talk from Fr Chris McCoy on Lent. We will be discussing the meaning of Lent, how to make sense of Holy Week, and the Resurrection. The final session, “Standing up. What about the Resurrection”, will be on Monday 23 March at 7-8pm.

A PRACTICAL WAY TO LIVE THE FIFTH WEEK OF Lent

The Fifth Week of Lent marks a turning point. Churches loom bare without crucifixes and statues, everything looks bare and solemn. It takes us right to the edge of the tomb with Lazarus. It's less about "trying harder" now... and more about letting Christ come into the places we've closed off.

1. Name what feels "buried"

Jesus stands before a tomb this week. Gently ask yourself: What in me feels shut down, stuck, or lifeless? A habit, a hurt, a relationship, even a part of your faith. Don't fix it. Just name it honestly before the Lord.

2. Let Jesus stand there with you

Before anything happens, Jesus weeps. This week, don't rush past that. Spend a few quiet minutes simply letting Christ be present to that "tomb" in your life — not solving, just staying.

3. Pray one simple line each day

"Come out." Hear it not as pressure, but as invitation. Christ doesn't shout in anger — he calls in love.

4. Move one small stone

Lazarus couldn't roll the stone away himself — others had to help. What's one small, practical step you can take? A conversation. A confession. A decision you've been avoiding. Not everything — just the next step.

5. Let others help you live again

"Unbind him, let him go." We don't come back to life alone. Let someone in this week — even in a small way. Grace often comes through other people.


6. End the day with hope, not pressure

Ask:

Where did I sense life today?

Where is Christ still calling me forward?

Even the smallest sign of life matters.
