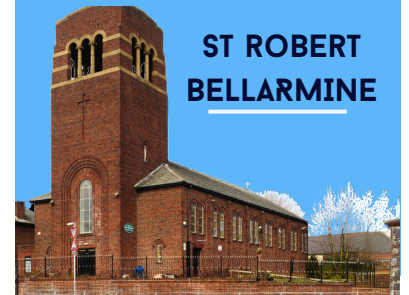

This week I am writing my weekly reflection from the Holy Land, sitting on a rooftop overlooking Bethlehem, where I am staying at the Latin Patriarchate Seminary to attend the ordination of three new priests. There is something profoundly moving about being here, just ten minutes from where Jesus was born. It is also a place that constantly reminds us that, even in the midst of suffering, God continues to call people to follow him.

In this Sunday's Gospel Jesus says: "Come to me, all you who labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest." Those words have echoed in my heart throughout this week. They are an invitation to trust that the Lord is always faithful, even when the road ahead is uncertain.

One of the joys of my visit has been meeting the fifteen boys who have entered the Minor Seminary, the first such group here for six years. Aged between 13 and 18, they are beginning to ask whether God might be calling them to the priesthood. Watching them has taken me back 44 years to my own days in the Minor Seminary, when I too first began to hear that quiet call of the Lord.

It has also been a reflective week for another reason. Next week, I will celebrate the 30th anniversary of my ordination to the priesthood. Looking back, I could never have imagined where that first "yes" would lead me. It has been a journey filled with unexpected blessings, challenges, wonderful people and countless reminders of God's faithfulness.

This week I will also bring Salameh, one of the seminarians, back to spend some time with us in the parish. I know you will make him feel very welcome. Please keep the newly ordained priests, these young seminarians, and all those discerning their vocation in your prayers. And perhaps this Gospel invites each of us to ask once again: where is Jesus calling me to place my trust, and how might I respond with a generous heart?

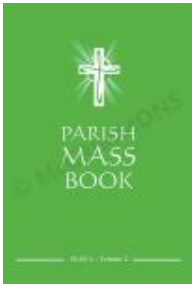

SALAMEH AZAR

Fr Mark was delighted to receive some good news that, after a period of uncertainty, Salameh Azar, a seminarian from the Latin Patriarchal Seminary in Bethlehem, has been granted a visa to visit us in July.

Salameh is 26 years old and comes from the town of Beit Jala, situated just outside Bethlehem. He is currently studying for the priesthood for the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem and is looking forward to spending some time with us here in the parish.



Fr Mark and Salameh will arrive home on 7 July, and Salameh will remain with us until the final week of July. During his visit, he hopes to experience the life of the Church outside the Holy Land, improve his English, and enjoy a period of rest and relaxation before continuing his formation for the priesthood.

God willing, Salameh will be ordained to the Diaconate shortly before Christmas as he enters the final stages of preparation for his priestly ordination, hopefully in the Summer of 2027. We are privileged to accompany him for a small part of that journey and to support him with our friendship and prayers.

His visit is also a reminder of some of the realities faced by Palestinians in the Holy Land. Although Salameh lives less than an hour from Tel Aviv Airport, he is not permitted to travel through it. Instead, he and Fr Mark will have to travel into Jordan and fly from Amman, adding an extra day or two to their journey. It is one of the many practical difficulties that affect everyday life for Palestinians.

Over the ten years that Fr Mark has served in Litherland, the parish has welcomed many seminarians and priests from the Holy Land. Many parishioners will remember meeting them, sharing stories with them, and supporting them with prayers and friendship. Salameh will be the last seminarian to visit the parish before Fr Mark moves to St Paul's, West Derby, in September, making this visit particularly special.

The Christian community in the Holy Land faces many challenges, and opportunities such as this are both valuable and encouraging for seminarians preparing for ministry. We hope that Salameh will feel at home among us and will take away happy memories of his time in Liverpool.

Please join us in extending a warm welcome to Salameh when he arrives. Keep him in your prayers as he continues his journey towards ordination, and please make him feel very much part of our parish family during his stay.

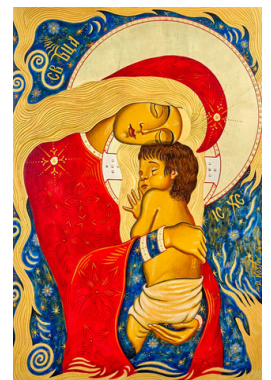
