#### SYNOD2020

There are lots of things going on in the diocese in preparation for Synod 2020. Primary School Headteachers have met and are coming up with creative ideas to involve schools. Similarly, the Secondary School Headteachers are involving their young people.

The diocesan priests are meeting over the next few months to listen to one another and over the coming weeks there will be times of listening in every parish.

We hope you are using the weekly reflections found in the Newsletter which help us to reflect on the Synod questions and in a few weeks you will invited to respond to them. A meeting is also arranged for **Wednesday 19th June, 7 p.m**. in the church hall when we will look at these questions together. All responses will be passed to the diocesan Synod office.

You are encouraged to use the Synod survey which is simply four questions and is completed on line: www.synod2020.co.uk.

The aim of it is to have as broad a constituency of people filling it in. Please encourage friends and family who are not church goers or not Catholics to fill it in. The church is listening to all!

#### EASTER READINGS

Did you know that the readings at Mass each Sunday during the Easter Season follow a set pattern and lead us on a journey.

The 2nd and 3rd Sunday readings remind us of the occasions when Jesus appeared to the disciples after his resurrection and before his ascension to Heaven.

The 4th Sunday readings brings us into the arms of Jesus the Good Shepherd.

The Gospels of the 5th, 6th & 7th Sunday are drawn from Jesus' Farewell Speech to his disciples and often focus on Christian love and God's love for his children.

These readings lead us to the culmination of the Easter Season when we celebrate the great Feast of Pentecost when we remember God's gift to the Church of the Holy Spirit.

#### PARISH PILGRIMAGE

A pilgrimage to the Holy Land has been arranged from 3rd - 14th October 2019. Flights from Manchester to Tel Aviv with Easyjet. We will stay in the Manger Square Hotel Bethlehem, 2 minute walk from where Jesus was born and the Ron Beach Hotel Tiberius which is situated on the shore of the Sea of Galilee.



We will visit the major sites associated with Jesus,
Mary and the apostles in Bethlehem, Jerusalem, Galilee & Nazareth.
Other highlights include: Sunday Mass in a local parish so we can meet
the local Christian community, a visit to the Christian ladies of St.
Martha's House, a meeting with Archbishop Pierbattista Pizzaballa at
the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem and dinner with the Rector, staff and
seminarians in the local Seminary.

The total cost of the pilgrimage, including flights, is now confirmed as £1,887. This includes 12 days full board, tips and gratuities, full guided tour and staying in 2 excellent hotels. #### HIS MASTER'S VOICE

People don't like being called sheep. When the public is sometimes accused of following this or that fashion just like a bunch of sheep we instinctively want to stand out ourselves and protest that we are not like the rest; we've got a mind of our own.



Maybe this is because the sheep or lamb is seen as a cute but rather hapless animal. It simply follows. Would today's gospel seem easier to swallow if it talked about a faithful dog that listened out for its owner's voice and followed the owner everywhere?

The scripture readings for the Sundays of Easter were originally targeted at those people who had been baptised at the Easter Vigil and were undergoing their first period of 'aftercare' as Christians. They also served as an annual 'refresher course' for those who were already members of the believing community. So each of the Sundays celebrates one or more of the key aspects of being a Christian.

Today we hear the word of God reminding us that we are not alone in our faith. It is not something we subscribe to and then are left abandoned in the wilderness. Christ is our shepherd and we belong to his flock which is the Church.

Yet if we are to be the sheep of his flock and enjoy greener pastures and fresh water then we have to listen to his voice. New converts to Christianity have no problem with this since they need no second invitation to discuss and savour their new-found faith. On the other hand, those of us who have been Christians for a longer time are less likely to be aware of the shepherd's voice calling us in the ordinariness of daily life. Is this because we have lost the spark?

The new Christians are being shown that the authentic voice of the shepherd is to be found in God's word and in the assembly of believers: in scripture and in the Church community. If they listen out for that

and in the Church community. If they listen out for that voice then Jesus promises that they will never be lost.

But, of course, what applies to new Christians also applies to us too. So where do the rest of us look and listen out for the voice of the Good Shepherd today?



#### THE APOSTLES CREED

During Lent & Easter, the Church recommends we pray the Apostles Creed at Mass rather than the Nicene Creed, the version usually prayed at Mass. The reason this option is recommended particularly for Lent/Easter Time is because of its close relationship with baptism. The Apostles' Creed is the basis for the baptismal promises made by the elect before they are baptised. It is also used for the renewal of baptismal promises at Easter and by parents and godparents when bringing a child for baptism.

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, At the words that follow, up to and including 'the Virgin Mary', all bow.

who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.
