#### **MAINTENANCE UPDATE**

We are waiting a date for work to begin to replace all the gutters around the church building. The present gutters are the original and have served us well for over 80 years but are now badly corroded and need to be changed.



Work will begin to repaint the back of the sanctuary where the plaster has flaked and also around the church walls. This work will be carried out over the coming weeks and it may cause some slight disruption. We will keep you informed.

#### PARISH PILGRIMAGE

A pilgrimage to the Holy Land has been arranged from 3rd - 14th October 2019. Flights from Manchester to Tel Aviv with Easyjet. We will stay in the Manger Square Hotel Bethlehem, 2 minute walk from where Jesus was born and the Ron Beach Hotel Tiberius which is situated on the shore of the Sea of Galilee.



We will visit the major sites associated with Jesus,
Mary and the apostles in Bethlehem, Jerusalem, Galilee & Nazareth.
Other highlights include: Sunday Mass in a local parish so we can meet
the local Christian community, a visit to the Christian ladies of St.
Martha's House, a meeting with Archbishop Pierbattista Pizzaballa at
the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem and dinner with the Rector, staff and
seminarians in the local Seminary.

The total cost of the pilgrimage, including flights, is now confirmed as £1,887. This includes 12 days full board, tips and gratuities, full guided tour and staying in 2 excellent hotels. #### EASTER READINGS

Did you know that the readings at Mass each Sunday during the Easter Season follow a set pattern and lead us on a journey.

The 2nd and 3rd Sunday readings remind us of the occasions when Jesus appeared to the disciples after his resurrection and before his ascension to Heaven.

The 4th Sunday readings brings us into the arms of Jesus the Good Shepherd.

The Gospels of the 5th, 6th & 7th Sunday are drawn from Jesus' Farewell Speech to his disciples and often focus on Christian love and God's love for his children.

These readings lead us to the culmination of the Easter Season when we celebrate the great Feast of Pentecost when we remember God's gift to the Church of the Holy Spirit.

#### **GLORIFIED CHRISTIANS**

If you take a look at education, health, social services, childcare, international development etc you will find that it was originally the Church that began this work in most countries. Then gradually the state moved in and took over. So we now find that religious hospitals,



religious schools, religious adoption agencies etc are very much in the minority. You could argue that this is no bad thing. It's the job of the Church to respond to need and if that need is satisfied by other bodies then we should rejoice.

The danger, of course, is that the Church is seen (and even sometimes sees itself) as just another agency. And Christians can end up thinking that they exist solely for this world. But Christians are not just would-be social workers. They are called to something greater.

In today's gospel we hear how Jesus has been glorified by his Father and will in turn glorify those who follow him faithfully. And our reading from Apocalypse (Revelation) gives us a glimpse of what that glory will be like, a new creation where there is no mourning or sadness.

It's easy to fall into the trap of thinking that Christianity is a

philosophy, an opinion, a useful fashion like Feng Shui, colonic irrigation or aromatherapy. But it isn't a fashion. It's a matter of life and death: the life and death of Christ as well as our own journeys from womb to tomb. Christians are fully immersed in this world and its problems but they live with a promise of a future that will dwarf the ambitions of this world.

At the heart of Easter is the message that we have to go beyond the merely material, beyond what we can see, smell, hear, touch and eat. Our baptism destines us for a life that does not end in the grave but beckons us to an eternity with our God, an everlasting life where the joys and pleasures of this life take on their full meaning as we see God's glory face to face.



#### THE APOSTLES CREED

During Lent & Easter, the Church recommends we pray the Apostles Creed at Mass rather than the Nicene Creed, the version usually prayed at Mass. The reason this option is recommended particularly for Lent/Easter Time is because of its close relationship with baptism. The Apostles' Creed is the basis for the baptismal promises made by the elect before they are baptised. It is also used for the renewal of baptismal promises at Easter and by parents and godparents when bringing a child for baptism.

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, At the words that follow, up to and including 'the Virgin Mary', all bow.

who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.
