A pilgrimage to the Holy Land has been arranged from 3rd - 14th October 2019. Flights from Manchester to Tel Aviv with Easyjet. We will stay in the Manger Square Hotel Bethlehem, 2 minute walk from where Jesus was born and the Ron Beach Hotel Tiberius which is situated on the shore of the Sea of Galilee.



We will visit the major sites associated with Jesus,
Mary and the apostles in Bethlehem, Jerusalem, Galilee & Nazareth.
Other highlights include: Sunday Mass in a local parish so we can meet
the local Christian community, a visit to the Christian ladies of St.
Martha's House and a meeting with Archbishop Pierbattista Pizzaballa at
the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem.

The cost of the pilgrimage is £1899 which includes the flight, 12 days full board, tips and gratuities, full guided tour and staying in 2 very good hotels. Single room supplement is £400.

NEIGHBOURS FROM...?



You can usually see Alex with a can of beer in his hand on the bench outside the market. The smell isn't very nice and he could do with a new set of clothes. Not that he would buy any himself since most of his state benefits are divided equally

between the off-licence and the Black Bull. He's not originally from round here; he seems to have appeared a few years ago, lives in one the flats on the estate and has no family that anyone knows of.

Everyone at our church knows Rita. She turns up for everything and has joined almost every group going. She's a pleasant enough soul, very willing, but can be a bit clingy. This is probably due to her living alone. She does have a granddaughter somewhere but they rarely see each other.



Akim and Kwame live in Abuja. They're thirteen and eleven years old and have to look after each other now that both their parents have died from AIDS. They don't complain, since many of their friends are in the same boat. It seems that there are more people in their village with AIDS than there are without it. Their patchy health service does its best but the problem is so vast.

Life couldn't be different for the gang of kids who hang around our local chip shop at nights. Left to their own devices by their parents, they make a lot of noise and can seem a bit intimidating to older people. In fact, they're harmless enough apart from the occasional broken bench and the hoard of litter they create.

And so the list goes on at home and abroad. Lupita and Toni are grandparents who work in a sweatshop on the outskirts of Manila... Abdhel and Ibrahim are twins who beg for food in Darfur... Louise lives in our town and longs for her husband to be out of prison... Magodonga lives near Harare and wants nothing more than a decent education... Craig has all the advantages of Los Angeles but doesn't know it because he spends most of his time on drugs...

Near or far, who is my neighbour?

The Cafod shop on St Johns Road, Waterloo which had to close last Christmas due to a shortage of volunteers is set to be officially reopened on Wednesday 17 July by Bishop Tom Williams.



Renovation work has been taking place on the

building and a group will be helping to set the shop up in the days before the launch. The shop originally opened in 1992 and to date has raised nearly £800,000 towards the work of Cafod. It is the only shop in the country dedicated to raising funds and spreading the word for the charity.

More volunteers are still needed to help, even if only for a couple of hours once a week or every two weeks. Basic training will be given. Anyone who is willing to help in any way please contact Pat Murphy Tel: 0151 931 5778.

THE MINISTRY OF SACRISTAN
