PARISH PILGRIMAGE LAST FEW PLACES!!!

A pilgrimage to the Holy Land has been arranged from 3rd - 14th October 2019. Flights from Manchester to Tel Aviv with Easyjet. We will stay in the Manger Square Hotel Bethlehem, 2 minute walk from where Jesus was born and the Ron Beach Hotel Tiberius which is situated on the shore of the Sea of Galilee.

We will visit the major sites associated with Jesus, Mary and the apostles in Bethlehem, Jerusalem, Galilee & Nazareth. Other highlights include: Sunday Mass in a local parish so we can meet the local Christian community, a visit to the Christian ladies of St. Martha's House and a meeting with Archbishop Pierbattista Pizzaballa at the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem.

The cost of the pilgrimage is ± 1897 which includes the flight, 12 days full board, tips and gratuities, full guided tour and staying in 2 very good hotels. Single room supplement is ± 400 .

THE AUCTION

Once upon a time a woman died while giving birth to her only son.



Her husband, an art dealer, never remarried and he did his best to bring up the boy by himself as the child grew to maturity in the family home. He taught his son all about the paintings and sculptures that he had collected, and the lad came to appreciate art himself and

worked in his father's shop

War broke out and the boy was called up to fight for his country. He went off as a soldier to serve his nation but was killed in action abroad. The father was devastated at the loss of his son. A few months later there was a knock at the father's door and a young man stood there with a brown paper parcel under his hand. It turned out that he served in the same unit as the dealer's son and they had become friends. He was an amateur artist himself and they

often talked about art. The parcel was a portrait of the dead boy that he had done from a photo. It was poor quality but he said he'd done it because the boy was his friend. He would take no money for it.

Several years later the father died and his great fortune was being auctioned off. The place was full of other dealers hoping to snap up some bargains.



The auctioneer began by announcing that in his will the dealer had specified that the poor painting of his son was to be auctioned first. This frustrated the dealers who were anxious to get on to the real treasures. 'Who'll give me £100? No one? Well am I bid £20? None of the dealers was interested. At the back of the room stood the young man who had painted it. He bid £20 and bought back his own painting.

At that moment a lawyer stood up and said, 'Ladies and gentlemen, that concludes the bidding. My client left instructions that whoever bought the painting of his son should receive all the other works at no extra cost. So they all go to the gentleman at the back. Thank you.' As the will and testament said, 'Whoever chooses my son gets it all.'

SAINT OF THE WEEK THEODORE OF CANTERBURY (September 19th) Although known as Theodore of Canterbury, he was actually born



in Tarsus, Cilicia, in 602 and was appointed by Pope Vitalian to the Diocese of Canterbury where he arrived as an old man in 669. He was well received by the peoples of Britain and he set himself the task of organising the church by creating new dioceses and appointing bishops to them, as well as fostering learning.

Although Theodore was the first bishop to rule the whole English Church, a dispute arose with St Wilfrid who resisted the attempt to split his diocese (all the area north of the Humber). Wilfrid appealed to Rome who found in his favour and against Theodore. Nevertheless, Theodore went ahead with his plan and a rift was caused that was only healed just before Wilfrid died when he was restored to his diocese.

Theodore established centres of learning for training the clergy and with the help of Hadrian and Benet Biscop several seminaries were set up in some of the monasteries. He died in 690.
