HOLY LAND CHRISTMAS CARD CAMPAIGN

This Diocesan campaign sees 100's of Christmas cards being sent to parishes across the Holy Land. Last year we sent cards to the Seminary Community near Bethlehem, this year we will send cards to the parish of Our Lady of Fatima in Beit Sahour.

Beit Sahour is a suburb of Bethlehem and it's believed the shepherds who visited Baby Jesus on Christmas night came from the village. We celebrated Sunday Mass with the parishioners during our recent pilgrimage to the Holy Land.



Beit Sahour, the land of the Shepherds has one of the largest Christian community in the Palestinian Territories. The Parish was established in 1859, with only 80 families. Today, it is one of the most active parishes in the area with pastoral initiatives for various activities and groups: three youth groups, a choir, young couples and scouts.

Archbishop Malcolm is encouraging parishioners to get involved:

"I wholeheartedly endorse the Diocesan Holy Land Christmas Card campaign and I would encourage our parishes and justice and peace groups to send Christmas cards to our brothers and sisters in the Holy Land. On my visits to the Holy Land people often remark how supported they feel when they receive a Christmas card from our diocese, and I believe it to be a real sign of our solidarity with those who live there. It's also a promise of our prayers for them at Christmas, and this means so much to them."

FEAST OF THE WEEK

St. Ambrose (December 7th)



Saints become patrons of all sorts of people and circumstances. St Ambrose's patronage seems to centre on honey, wax and bees. When he was a baby a swarm of bees landed on his face, but instead of stinging him they left a little patch of honey. His father saw this as an omen that he would be able to 'sweet talk' his way in life.

Well, he certainly grew up to be an eloquent man. Ambrose was a Roman citizen born in Germany about 340. He studied law and public speaking, taking up a government position in Milan. He was so popular that when he went to intervene in a dispute about who should become the next bishop, the crowd shouted out that Ambrose should be bishop. He proved a strong opponent of various heresies and of the Roman Emperor's usurping tendencies, was a much loved bishop and died on Holy Saturday 397.

SYNOD 2020

The listening journey that we are on will identify some significant priorities in our Archdiocese. It will also be a journey that Archbishop Malcolm will be sharing with the appropriate authorities in Rome in response to Pope Francis's call to listen.



The next task is to generate the proposals for action within each Theme. These proposals will be taken forward to the Synod day in October 2020 when they will be voted upon. The Themes are:

18th Nov -16th Dec:	Sharing the Mission of Jesus
20th Jan -17th Feb:	How we pray together
17th Feb -17th March:	Building Community, nurturing belonging

We encourage you to visit the Prayer Station in English Martyrs church, take a proposal slip, write a proposal and to place it in the box.

We are now in our period of exploration of our second Synod Theme, *Sharing the mission of Jesus*. You are invited once again to share your Proposals for Action on this Theme as we continue to discern the Church God is calling us to be. There are leaflets at the back of Church to help you.

CHRIST WILL COME AGAIN?

Christians seem to have lost any sense of expectation that Christ's second coming should feature in their daily lives. The Jews longed for the 'anointed one of God' who would come and lead them into prosperity, but we're detached from any sense of urgency when it comes to Christ, the Messiah, retuning among us.

Is this because we think the odds are stacked against it happening during our lifetime? Is it because we just don't care? Or is it perhaps because we haven't really understood what the coming of Jesus really means?

It's easy to think that Advent is simply a time for contemplating the end of the world. But, of course, it isn't. It's about preparing for the definitive establishing of God's kingdom on earth.



When we celebrate the liturgy of Advent we are not simply recalling the first coming of Jesus in Bethlehem and vaguely acknowledging that he will come again. This is not true worship. It's simply cosy remembrance of the past and insurance brokering for the future of our souls. It's not worship from the heart.

Our Advent liturgy demands that we take our baptismal promises seriously and that we act. What are we doing to bring Christ into our world? How do we make him present in the little worlds of our existence: family, work, friends etc?

All our Advent prayers and songs are discordant if they do not reflect what's going on in our lives. We can, and must, make Jesus come again by the way we live. Instead of thinking about fanciful scenes in the moon and stars, ought we not to realise that Christ comes again when his kingdom is established? And if we're not wholehearted about being part of this then what value do our prayers and songs have?

We can sing 'O come, O come, Emmanuel' until the cows come home, but it will be empty worship if we are not pledged to co-operate with God's Spirit in ushering in the kingdom by the way we live. Liturgy is about life. And Advent liturgy is about the kingdom coming. Now.
