HOLY LAND CHRISTMAS CARD CAMPAIGN

This Diocesan campaign sees 100's of Christmas cards being sent to parishes across the Holy Land. Last year we sent cards to the Seminary Community near Bethlehem, this year we will send cards to the parish of Our Lady of Fatima in Beit Sahour.

Beit Sahour is a suburb of Bethlehem and it's believed the shepherds who visited Baby Jesus on Christmas night came from the village. We celebrated Sunday Mass with the parishioners during our recent pilgrimage to the Holy Land.





Beit Sahour, the land of the Shepherds has one of the largest Christian community in the Palestinian Territories. The Parish was established in 1859, with only 80 families. Today, it is one of the most active parishes in the area with pastoral initiatives for various activities and groups: three youth groups, a choir, young couples and scouts.

Archbishop Malcolm is encouraging parishioners to get involved: "I wholeheartedly endorse the Diocesan Holy Land Christmas Card campaign and I would encourage our parishes and justice and peace groups to send Christmas cards to our brothers and sisters in the Holy Land. On my visits to the Holy Land people often remark how supported they feel when they receive a Christmas card from our diocese, and I believe it to be a real sign of our solidarity with those who live there. It's also a promise of our prayers for them at Christmas, and this means so much to them."

'highly favoured'). This means that Mary received the divine help necessary for her task. The Church was led by the Spirit to realise that Mary had to be the most perfect work of God next to the incarnation. Or rather, Mary's intimate association with the incarnation called for the special involvement of God in her whole life. The Church taught that Mary was full of grace and free of sin from the first moment of her existence. This great privilege of Mary is the highlight of all that God has done in Jesus, and the incomparable holiness of Mary shows the incomparable goodness of God. This day is a solemnity and Mass will be celebrated on Monday at 9.15 a.m. All are welcome.

THE GOD WHO SPEAKS

Scripture is at the centre of everything the Church does. The word of God shapes our prayer and worship. The Bible shows us how to understand the world, how we are called to live and relate to each other.

2020 is the 10th anniversary of Verbum Domini – Pope Benedict XVI's Apostolic Exhortation on 'The Word of the Lord' and the 1,600 anniversary of St Jerome's death. These dates have inspired the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales to dedicate 2020 as a year of focus on the Bible and **'The God Who Speaks'**.

During the year, we will be celebrating, living and sharing God's word with an exciting new Scripture initiative. It's an opportunity to enrich current practice and to develop and explore new ways of responding to 'The God who Speaks'.

Throughout 2020 there will be a range of events, activities and resources to participate in all around the country. To help achieve transformation in our hearts and in our communities there will be three themes of celebrating, living and sharing God's word.We will have a Bible Study course in the parish during 2020 and further details will be given on this. Other events will be taking place around the Archdiocese.

THE GENERAL ELECTION

The Catholic Bishops' of England & Wales have issued a statement on the General Election which takes place on Thursday. They are encouraging all Catholics to vote as it is our duty as good citizens to do so.

The statement concentrates on key issues - not parties or manifestos offering a series of points which we need to reflect upon when deciding who we should vote for. The Bishops highlight the duty of all citizens - not just Catholics - to help shape politics that are **"rooted in the service of human rights and peace"**.

In making judgements about how to vote, the Bishops ask that the following are carefully considered:

* The innate dignity of every human being; defending both the child in the womb, the good of the mother and an understanding of the immeasurable good of a child not yet born.

* The dignified care for those who are terminally ill and dying which resisting the false compassion of assisted suicide and euthanasia.

* The needs of those who are frequently discarded by society such as people with disabilities, travellers, older people, the homeless, prisoners and those trapped in modern slavery.

* The process of integration of migrants and refugees who have made their home here, challenging the global rise of xenophobia and racism that is so radically incompatible with our faith.

* The rights of those who "can see no end to the tunnel of extreme poverty", providing them with assistance and confronting the structural injustices that compound their suffering.

* Care for our common home and tackle the climate emergency which threatens the future of our entire human family.

* Freedom of religion and belief, ensuring that everyone has the right to exercise their conscience and prance their creed freely without fear.

* The cherishing of marriage, recognising the essential place of the family in the service of life and of society.

* The rights of parents to educate their children in accordance with their faith and support the work of Catholic schools in their contribution to society and their promotion of the common good.




CONFIRMATIONS 2020

Part of the new Confirmation scheme for 2020 is High School based. If a child:

DOES NOT ATTEND a Catholic School Is currently in Year 8 HAS NOT been Confirmed-WANTS to be Confirmed in 2020

They are invited to sign up for the Preparation Day which will take place in St. Mary's Lowe House, St Helens on 29th February. They must register via Eventbrite (search for 'Animate Youth Ministries). Please note: this Preparation Day is **ONLY** for those currently in Year 8 who have not been Confirmed and want to be Confirmed in 2020 and are **NOT** in a Catholic School. HALF MEASURES?

There are some people for whom half measures just aren't good enough.



We all know of people who put us to shame by their indefatigable commitment to the cause they have espoused. It might be someone who has been cured of cancer and now spends all their time raising funds

for research. Perhaps it's a politician risking their life by opposing corruption in their country, or someone campaigning tirelessly for the voiceless. Maybe it's just an ordinary person who spends their entire life looking after a bed-ridden family member. Whatever they do, they put all their energy into it.

John the Baptist was such a person. He was no quiet preacher, not content to give his message in an unobtrusive way nor unconcerned by those who rejected it or failed to hear it. He was a disturbing character. Living on the edge of the desert, wearing strange clothes and eating a weird diet, his message struck panic into people, causing vast crowds to repent and to come and be baptised in the Jordan. That the kingdom of heaven is close at hand was his rally call.

When the Pharisees and Sadducees claimed to have repented he turned on them. Produce the evidence. If you really knew what this kingdom of heaven was all about then you wouldn't be so self-satisfied. They had learnt how to practise their religion half-heartedly while seeming to keep all the rules.

So what about us? As Advent begins do we feel any sense of urgency about our need for continual repentance, or do we think of it as just another milestone in the calendar? Will the word of God this Advent make any difference to our attitude? Will it affect the way we behave towards God and each other? Do we most resemble the Jewish leaders taking their religion in their stride or the crowds who heard John's message and realised that there can be no half measures when it comes to changing the way we live? Advent is the time for making our choice.
