

UNLOCKING THE MYSTERY OF THE BIBLE

Many Catholics want to read the Bible but get bogged down by the long passages that seem not to make sense or get lost among the sea of Biblical names and places. *Unlocking the Mystery of the Bible*, an eight-part Bible study, helps you uncover the story woven



throughout Scripture, so you can get the "big picture" of the Bible and understand what it's all about.

Aided by a unique color-coded *Bible Timeline* Chart that arranges the key people, places, and events of the Bible in chronological order, *Unlocking the Mystery of the Bible* will help you pick up the Bible with confidence and understand how you fit into God's plan.

THE REDEDICATION OF ENGLAND TO MARY

WHAT IS THE REDEDICATION?

This Re-dedication on March 29th is a both a personal promise of the people of our country, and a renewal of the entrustment vows made by King Richard II in 1381.



THE ORIGINAL DEDICATION

The first dedication was made by King Richard II in Westminster Abbey as he sought the protection of Our Lady in the face of great political turmoil. At this point, England received the title 'Mary's Dowry'; meaning that England was 'set aside' as a gift, a dowry, for Our Lady under her guidance and protection.

THE REDEDICATION

On Sunday 29th March at 12noon, The Rededication will take place throughout the country. As King Richard II once gave England as a gift to Our Lady, so we are invited to give ourselves, as the people of this country, to Mary. We respond to this invitation on the day of Rededication in two ways; by making a personal promise and a communal entrustment.

Our **personal promise** brings us closer to Mary, the first disciple of Christ. in this we unite in her joy by following her opens to God's call.

Our **communal entrustment** unites us together as the people of our country in prayer, by renewing the vows of dedication made to Mary by our ancestors.

Beginning on Friday 21st and for the next 33 days we are encouraged to pray the Angelus everyday in preparation for the Rededication Day and we will do so at Mass each day. Copies are available for you at the back of church to also pray the Angelus in your own homes. On Sunday 28th March we will join Catholics around the country to rededicate our county and ourselves to Mary.

HUMAN SLAVERY

Most people think slavery only exists overseas, however modern slavery in the UK is very much real and sadly thriving. The British Government estimates that tens of thousands of people are subject to modern slavery in the UK today. Most people are trafficked into the UK from overseas, but there is also a significant number of British nationals in slavery as well.

Pope Francis describes trafficking as "an open wound on the body of contemporary society". He asked the Catholic Church in England & Wales to lead the initiatives to try and combat modern slavery in the world. The Santa Marta Group was established comprising of Church & Civil Leaders along with Police Chiefs from around the world. Visit the Santa Marta website for more information www.santamartagroup.com

The UK Government estimates there are tens of thousands people in slavery in Britain today.

In 2017, over 5,000 people were referred to British Authorities as potential victims of slavery up a third from 2016. This includes 2,000 children.

Referrals included possible victims from 116 countries

46% of people referred were in labour exploitation and 34% were in sexual exploitation

34% of victims of slavery are estimated to be re-trafficked

UK nationals make the biggest group of potential victims
