


# **Racial Justice Sunday**


#### **OVERCOME**

What links Isaiah and the disciples? They were both overawed when faced with the presence of God. Isaiah had a vision of God and the overwhelming feeling was one of holiness. Angels kept singing the word 'holy', making Isaiah feel even more unclean and sinful. Similarly, when Peter, James and John saw how many fish they'd netted they were overcome with awe. This wasn't because they'd caught lots of fish but because they realised they were in the presence of someone special.

Holiness is God's trademark. Yes, there's love, mercy, justice, compassion etc. But it's holiness that marks God out as special. In fact, holiness means being set apart, being different from, being completely other. Some people never grasp the holiness of God. They practise their religion as if they were doing God a favour. After all, they could stop coming to church and offer their services to some local or national charity instead. I'm sure the Hospice Shop or Rotary would welcome them with open arms. But this is to miss the point.

True faith comes as a response to God's holiness. It's a result of realising the immenseness of God's glory and grandeur, of his 'otherness'. And to glimpse God's holiness means to be drawn into the only possible response: to try and be as like God as is humanly possible. When Isaiah had his moment his reaction was first to say 'I'm a man of unclean lips' and only later was he able to say 'Send me.' Peter's reaction to the holiness of Jesus was to shout out, 'Leave me, Lord; I'm a sinful man' and only later follow him. When we attend church we're not doing God a favour. We're not showing

others how good we are, how loyal is our brand of Christianity. We come because we've experienced something of God's holiness in our lives and feel moved to react. That's why at our liturgy we first listen to God's 'holy' word and only then respond in praise. It's not so much what we do as what we allow God's holiness to provoke within us. We can only worship God when we've been overcome by holiness.



#### UNLOCKING THE MYSTERY OF THE BIBLE

Many Catholics want to read the Bible but get bogged down by the long passages that seem not to make sense or get lost among the sea of Biblical names and places. *Unlocking the Mystery of the Bible*, an eight-part

#### ST JOSEPHINE BAKHITA

You've probably never heard of Josephine Bakhita. That's because she is one of the many 20th century saints canonised by Pope John Paul II. In fact she's only been a saint officially since 2000.

Born in Darfur, Sudan, in 1868 she was kidnapped by slave traders when she was only nine. Having been abused terribly she was rescued by the Italian consul and taken to Italy where she worked as a maid. Eventually she became a Christian and took the name Josephine as a sign of her new life. She entered the convent of the Canossian Daughters of Charity in Venice and spent fifty years as a Sister with a great reputation for holiness and ended her life in 1947. She is thought to be the only canonised saint originally from Sudan. Her Feast Day was celebrated on Saturday.
