

#### PRISONS WEEK

Prison is, among other things, a safety valve for society's anxieties. There is a desire to forget people who have been found guilty of wrongdoing once the key turns in the locks, and signs of sympathy are regarded as a weakness and a tolerance of what they have done. They are outcasts who do not deserve anything. But a considerable proportion of the prison population in the UK are suffering from mental health problems which left untreated will cause further harm in the future, and as the Church insists, even the worst offenders deserve to be treated as human beings. #### NHS COVID-19 APP

Have you got the new NHS COVID-19 app on your phone? This app uses contact tracing technology to help protect yourself and others so we can all try and get back to the things we love. The app notices and logs other nearby app users. If any of those users later test positive for coronavirus, you'll receive an alert with advice



The Archbishop has asked that all churches make use of the app and the QR code which you will find at the front door.

The Government have placed further restrictions on the number of people attending Places of Worship: Only 6 people allowed at 'Life Cycle events' and this includes: Weddings, Baptisms & First Communion celebrations. 30 people allowed at Funeral Masses and Services.

#### A CAUTIOUS REOPENING OF CHURCH

In order to reopen our church it's important that the many guidelines laid down by the Bishops and the Government are kept to ensure the safety of everyone who comes to church:

- 1. The vulnerable should carefully consider the wisdom of returning to Mass too soon. They are not obliged to do so.
- 2. The Sunday obligation to attend Mass has not been re-instated.
- 3. Those who are able might be encouraged to come to Mass on a weekday rather than a Saturday evening or Sunday, to release the pressure on weekend Masses.
- 4. Each church is limited to how many people they can safely hold at any one gathering. Only one church in a parish may be used.
- 5. All people MUST wear a face mask. Hands must be sanitised as people arrive and leave church and contact details provided.
- 6. Social distancing guidelines are still in force.
- 7. Parish stewards must show people to the church benches, filling from the front and working backwards.
- 8. Church doors and windows should be left open.
- 9. Single use newsletters or other papers may be used but must be taken home.
- 10. Collections should be in a basket on the way in and the way out.
- 11. People MUST leave church immediately after they have received Holy Communion
- 12. Lingering clusters of conversation in the porch or outside the church must be avoided and outside the church gates.
- 13. Toilet facilities are not in use. Piety Shops are to remain closed.
- 14. The church is to be cleaned and sanitised after each Mass/Service.

#### **RESERVING A TABLE**

Two beautiful images of our God are put before us today. The first tells us that God has already prepared a sumptuous banquet of food and fine wine for us. The second is that on the day we are called to share in this everlasting feast he will wipe away every tear from our eyes and take away all our shame.

Everyone likes a good feast but rich food and drink were especially welcomed by people who lived in the arid desert. So Isaiah's words from God were eagerly received by the Jewish people whose nation had been overrun by a foreign power and who had been taken captive into exile. Despite all their present troubles God promises them that in the end they will be triumphant and that he will never abandon them

The Eucharist that Christians celebrate every Sunday is the 'starter course' of this promised banquet. What God has promised us for eternity in heaven has already begun. The Eucharist is the sacred meal shared by those who have been baptised into Christ's death and who now await a full share in his resurrection. The rich food and fine wine is the body and blood of Christ who is really present among us when we gather in his name.



So our liturgy puts us in contact with the eternal presence of God and is not something that we do alone. Here on earth we join the heavenly liturgy of saints and angels who already see God face to face and are moved to constant praise. And that's why God has already begun to wipe away the tears from our eyes, for in our worship we are joined in communion with those who have gone before us and whom we once mourned and grieved for. But liturgy is not simply

what our parish or community is doing. Liturgy is cosmic. We join our voices with choirs of angels and saints of all time in our hymn of praise. Scripture tells us that those of our family and friends who have died are not dead for ever but are indeed alive in Christ. Liturgy joins together the communion of saints on both sides of the grave.

A banquet of rich food and fine wine...our tears dried...our shame taken away...and this is only the starter. Why not reserve a table?
