TIER 2 GUIDELINES

From Wednesday 2nd December we fall into Tier 2 of restrictions and this will have an effect on what we do in church:

30 people maximum at a Funeral Mass/ Service.

Only 15 people allowed to attend Wedding Mass/Service.

Only 1 household allowed to attend Baptisms. (Godparents will have to be by proxy).

No congregational singing allowed even at Christmas.

All other rules and regulations regarding the wearing of face masks, hand santitising and how Mass is celebrated remain unchanged.

SUNDAY THOUGHTS



We want to be in control of our own lives as much as possible. We long to be the homeowner in the Gospel, organising our responsibilities for ourselves or others to handle. But there is only so much we can do. We can adopt a healthy diet and lifestyle, but that doesn't guarantee we will live to be a hundred. In the end, we are the clay and not the potter. We pray for the grace to accept how the Lord is moulding us.

'We have all withered like leaves' is an apt image at this time of the year (Isaiah 64:5). Leaves have fallen from the trees, their life drained. How appropriate we hear these words at this celebration of the Eucharist, when we will receive the bread of life, the Body and Blood of eternal life, which can transform our lifeless withered spirits into vessels of the living Christ.

Our lives are filled with schedules. We may have a different calendars for the various aspects of our lives: work, social. Family activities etc. We check the TV schedule or maybe our sports team's schedule. And parishes have Mass schedules as well.

God does not work on schedules.

Jesus has a habit of bursting into our lives when we least expect and certainly not according to a prearranged timetable. As he told his disciples, '*You never know when the time will come*' (Mark 13:33). It is important that we are prepared at all times. The end of our lives may come tonight. The end of the world may

come tomorrow. Jesus' arrival into our lives in an unexpected way may come at any time.

Advent gives us the time and space to get our lives in order for the Lord's return so that we are ready to greet Him. Will we take this opportunity?

CHRISTMAS 2020

The way in which we will celebrate Christmas this year will be very different and the Archbishop has asked all parishes to follow the same set of guidelines.

Masses on Christmas Eve & Christmas Day will be ticket-only and this is to ensure that we keep to the maximum number of people allowed in church during the pandemic. Two types of ticket will be available: a single ticket which admits one person or a family ticket which admits upto four people living in the same household.

Tickets will be available from the church door or Parish Office from Saturday 5th December. Regular Mass-goers will have the first opportunity to obtain tickets before they are widely distributed. Entrance to the Masses on these two days will be ticket only. Tickets cannot be reserved to be collected at a later date but they must be collected as you request them.

Fr Mark will arrange another Christmas morning Mass if all tickets are distributed and there is need for more Masses. All Masses at English Martyrs.

This arrangement for ticket only Masses applies to all parishes within the Archdiocese.

The Archbishop has also decided that there will be NO Saturday evening Masses on 26th December within the Archdiocese to allow the priests and parish stewards some rest time. There will be midday Mass on 26th December.

The obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holydays is still not reinstated. The week between Christmas Day - New Years Day is the Christmas octave which means that you can come to Mass anytime that week to celebrate the birth of the Lord and to visit the Christmas Crib.

Sadly because of national restrictions, Masses over the Christmas period will be different as we are still not allowed to sing and the Archbishop has reminded the priests that Masses must still be short. We will have the parish Christmas Crib but this must also be different this year.

NEWS FROM JOSPICE

St. Joseph's Hospice is planning its usual Christmas events this year and hopes that you can join in from your homes.

Both the Christmas ladies Day and Light up a Life service will take place between now and December 4th.

On 29th November, when Christmas Ladies Day would have taken place, the hospice will stage activities on its Facebook page including a raffle, the prize draw and an online Christmas market.

The annual Light up a Life appeal will take place on 4th December with a service when the hospice's Christmas tree lights will be switched on. You can contact the hospice and dedicate a light to a loved one who has died.

FEAST OF THE WEEK St John Almond - A Scouse Saint!



John Almond was born in Allerton near of Catholic parents about 1565 and went to school in Woolton. After studying at Reims he went to the English College in Rome, where in due course he was ordained priest. In 1602 he returned to England as a secular priest and ministered to Catholics there. He was arrested briefly in 1608, and then again in 1612. In November of that year,

seven priests had escaped from prison, and this may have sharpened the zeal of those who interrogated him. He displayed to the last great skill in argument; the account of his death describes him as "a reprover of sin, a good example to follow, of an ingenious and acute understanding, sharp and apprehensive in his conceits and answers, yet complete with modesty, full of courage and ready to suffer for Christ, that suffered for him." He refused to sign the Oath of Allegiance in the form in which it was offered him, but offered to swear that he bore in his heart "so much allegiance to King James as he, or any Christian king, could expect by the law of nature, or the positive law of the true Church, be it which it will, ours or yours." He was committed to Newgate and within a few months was brought to trial as a seminary priest. Having been duly convicted he was hanged, drawn, and quartered on 5 December 1612 at Tyburn, London.


A MESSAGE FROM MARY'S MEALS
