SUNDAY THOUGHTS

As Christians, we do not have to grieve 'like the other people, who have no hope'. We are blessed with hope, hope in the promise of life everlasting, hope that one day we may be invited to the banquet, hope that our loved ones who have passed away already dwell in the presence of the Lord. As Paul writes, if we believe that Jesus was truly raised from the dead, then death is not the final chapter.



A lot is packed into Matthew's short parable in today's Gospel, in which a wedding feast is compared to the kingdom of heaven. The ones who wisely plan ahead are rewarded; the unprepared are rejected. All the women, even the wise ones, fall asleep while waiting for the pivotal moment. The wise ones cannot share with the foolish ones; what is required to enter the feast must be what you have brought or what you have done yourself. No second chance is given to the ones who ran out of oil. Their need to buy more proves fatal. A few weeks ago the rejected guests were those without a wedding garment, now it's the ones without working lamps. At baptism we were clothed in Christ and were given a lighted candle. Only those who put on Christ and light the way are welcomed to the kingdom. We must live out our baptism.



'Stay awake, because you do not know either the day or the hour,' may have been repeated quite frequently in the days and years immediately after Jesus' death and resurrection (Matthew 25:13). The early church assumed that Christ would return very soon. They believed that the Second Coming was right around the corner. But it wasn't. An intervening two thousand years has made us complacent. But like a lucky number in the

lottery, the end days are as likely to come tomorrow as they are any other day. Let God-given wisdom give us the urgency we need each and every day.

FEAST OF THE WEEK -


ST DYFRIG (November 14th)

Dyfrig (also known as Dubricius) was born in the sixth century in the Wye Valley, where he also received his formation in the monastic life.

He founded a great monastery at Moccas in Herefordshire and rose to considerable influence as abbot and bishop. He is said to have brought St Illtud to repentance, to have ordained St Samson (also connected with Dol in Brittany) to the priesthood, and to have ordained St Deiniol as Bishop of Bangor.

He took himself off in prayer to Caldey Island and in old age he retired to the Island of Bardsey, off the Llyn Peninsula in North Wales where he died.
Subsequently Bardsey became famous as the island of Saints, and as a place of burial and pilgrimage.
