

CHURCH RE-OPENING

Please note that all restrictions are still in place.

Face masks to be worn properly over the mouth and nose at all times. You need to give your details for track & trace

purposes or use the NHS COVID app on your phone. Please sit where you are asked to by the Parish

Stewards.



Procedures for the reception of Holy Communion are still in place.

Fr Mark has taken the decision not to reinstate the Saturday evening Mass for the time being as the number of people coming to that Mass was low. The Saturday Mass will begin again as soon as we get back to normality.

If you are vulnerable or show COVID symptoms you must stay at home.

Baptisms can resume after 17th May with only the parents and child present.

Taking Holy Communion to the Sick & Housebound cannot resume until the end of June. Any person in danger of death can receive the Sacrament of the Sick and arrangements can be made by contacting the presbytery.

Can we please also ask that, after having your hands sanitised, you immediately enter Church and take your seat as instructed by the stewards. Please do not linger in the porch. The lockdown is easing but we do still need to be careful and observe social distancing when entering and leaving Church

PAPAL PRAYER INITIATIVE FOR MARY

In response to the Holy Father's heartfelt wish, the month of May will be dedicated to a "marathon" of prayer, to ask for the end of the pandemic, which has afflicted the world for more than a year now, and to ask for the resumption of social and work activities. Pope Francis wishes to involve all the Shrines around the world in this initiative, so that they may become vehicles of the prayer of the entire Church. The initiative is being conducted in the light of the biblical expression: "Prayer by the Church was fervently being made to God" (Acts 12:5).

The Pontifical Council for the Promotion of the New Evangelization, entrusted by the Holy Father with the task of organizing the event, has extended this invitation to all the Shrines around the world. in order to promote the diffusion of the initiative in the relevant Regions, so as to reach priests, families, and all the faithful, inviting them to join in this prayer of intercession and hope to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Together with the prayer of the Holy Rosary, each day of the month is characterized by a prayer intention for the various categories of people most affected by the plight of the pandemic: for those who have not been able to say goodbye to their loved ones, for all health care personnel, for the poor, the homeless and those in economic difficulty and for all the deceased. These are some of the intentions that will punctuate our prayer to Our Lady. Every Shrine around the world is invited to pray, in the language and manner used locally, asking for the resumption of social life, work and the many human activities that were suspended during the pandemic.

The official channels of the Holy See will broadcast the prayer said each day in each of these thirty Shrines at 6:00 p.m., according to time scheduled in Rome. WORLD COMMUNICATIONS DAY 2021

This annual day of prayer is celebrated this Sunday, 16th May. The theme for the 2021 World Day of Social Communications, chosen by Pope Francis, echoes the words of the Apostle Philip, recognising that authentic communication leads to "encountering people as and where they are".

On World Communications Day, we take up the command of Jesus to preach the Good News of the Gospel to the whole world. Vital to this is good communication - through our websites, publications and social media channels. The Bishops' Conference works hard to forge positive relationships with media outlets to communicate news relating to every aspect of the life of the Catholic Church and her people.

Feast of the Week St. Dunstan

Born in 909 near
Glastonbury and educated at the abbey. After ordination as priest at Winchester, he returned to Glastonbury briefly, but was so called to the royal court. Dunstan was appointed Abbot of Glastonbury. He set about restoring monastic life, which had been almost extinguished under Danish invasions.

in 995, through intrigue at court, he was exiled to Ghent and he saw for the first time a reformed monastery on the continent.

Recalled by King Edgar at bath, he became successively Bishop of. Worcester, London and Archbishop of Canterbury.

Dunstan died in 988 and his feast day is celebrated on Wednesday.

MARY'S MEALS

The month of May is dedicated to Our Lady and we invite you to consider joining with parishes across the country to pray for the work of Mary's Meals. Our mission is carried out in Our Lady's name to feed children a daily school meal in some of the world's poorest communities.

Mary's Meals grew out of a response to the Bosnian conflict in the early 1990s. Since then we have been involved in emergency relief work in countries including Myanmar, Haiti, India, Kenya and Thailand. Mary's Meals is now providing life-giving and life-changing school meals to more than 1.8 million of the world's poorest children. Around 64 million of the world's hungriest children do not attend school. In order to survive they have to work or beg. Please pray for them as you pray the Rosary.

SUNDAY THOUGHTS

No one has ever seen God,' St. John writes today, which is absolutely true. However, he goes on to reveal how we can come closest to seeing God.

First of all, humans were created in the image of God. No matter our size, shape, or colour, each and every one of us was made in the image of God. Therefore, every person is a reflection of God himself. So when we look at someone with love, we are looking at God. In that sense, when we love one another, when we reach out in love to another person, we are loving God. No wonder St. John goes on to say that 'as long as we love one another, God will live in us. When we truly love someone else, with all the demands and challenges that selfless love brings, we approach God.

Indeed, 'God is love'. John uses the Greek word agape, regarded as the highest form of love: an unconditional, selfless, total devotion to another. Its greatest examples are found in scripture. God remained ever devoted to the Chosen People, despite their faithlessness. Jesus paid the ultimate price for his devotion, accepting death on a cross out of self-sacrificial love for the entire human race.

At the end of Jesus' lengthy farewell speech to his disciples after the Last Supper, he turns his attention to God the Father, making this great prayer (Jesus' High Priestly Prayer) right in front of them, referring to them, often praying specifically for them, as in the passage we hear today. He prays that they—along with all who come to believe through them—may all be one. Obviously, the unity of his followers is very important, as they are consecrated in the image and likeness of God. But there is something else, and that is in the force that binds all disciples together. It is love. Selfless love bound them and binds us together and binds us in Christ to God. When Jesus prays for unity, he is also praying for us to live in the love that keeps us united.

SCHOOL FOUNDATION GOVERNOR

Could you be a Foundation Governor for one of our schools? Service as a foundation governor in a Catholic school is one of the most significant and important ways members of the Catholic Faith community can support the Church's divine mission of helping all to arrive at the fullness of Christian life.

There are few specific requirements. However, a Foundation Governor must:

- Be a Catholic who attends Sunday Mass regularly and gives true witness to the teachings of the Church
- Be prepared to work with discretion as a member of the full governing body and attend training events to help build up a body of knowledge and expertise
- Bring a wider skill set to enhance the wider Governing Body in undertaking its collective duties to lead the school and meet the contemporary requirements of the Department for Education and Ofsted

Our two parish schools currently requires new Foundation Governors and there may be opportunities in other Catholic schools in the area. Please contact Fr Mark directly if you feel able to support our wonderful schools in this way.

STANDING ORDER

Fr Mark explained last weekend the difficulty in banking coins with HSBC from the beginning of August when the counter service at the Bootle branch comes to an end. On average we bank more coins than notes each week.

Standing Order is an easy way of making your weekly donation to the parish. Just one simple form is all it takes and we encourage you to consider this as it has many benefits:

- *You won't need to look for money each week. You can still use your weekly envelopes and place an empty one in the basket. The amount you specify on the form goes from your bank account into the parish account.
- *Reducing the amount of money left on the premises is better for safety.
- *We reduce the amount of coins banked each week.
