What can I give that demonstrates my acceptance of Jesus' challenge to his disciples, to give without reservation?

ADVICE TO PARISHES

Due to the fact that the pandemic is far from over it is not the intention to restore an obligation to the attendance at Sunday Mass at this point. Please remember the importance of keeping Sunday holy and if possible attending Mass weekly.

- 1. Face coverings must still be worn for all those coming to church. (Exemptions for genuine medical reasons excluded)
- 2. Social distancing will not be mandatory in our churches but please be mindful of other people who may want to keep a distance.
- 3. You must sanitise your hands before you enter a church. There will be no need to sanitise your hands as you leave.
- 4. The numbers for weddings, funerals and baptisms are limited to a safe capacity of each church building.
- 5. Holy Communion is now restored to its traditional place. People should approach Holy Communion row by row and not in a haphazard way.
- 6. Holy Communion is to be given on the hand. Holy Communion under both kinds will not be re-introduced at this time.
- 7. The sign of peace can be restored but without any touching, ie by a handshake.
- 8. Ministers of the Eucharist can take Holy Communion to the sick & housebound but with the appropriate caution.

REMEMBRANCE MASS FOR PRIESTS

On Friday 12 November at 7pm at the Cathedral, Archbishop Malcolm will be celebrating a Mass for all those priests who have died, from Covid or other causes, since the beginning of the pandemic including Bishop Vincent Malone who died in May 2020. This will be a chance for us to come together as an archdiocese to pray for those priests whose funerals we could not attend because of Covid restrictions. This is a Diocesan occasion so all are welcome.

ADVENT & CHRISTMAS BOOK

A new book called 'Christmas Voices from the Holy Land' has been published and Fr Mark has ordered some copies. The book contains poems and reflections written especially for the Holy Land by Fr Richard



Nesbitt with contributions from Christians living in the Holy Land.

Proceeds of the book will go to 'Friends of the Holy Land'. The book is £9.99 and you can order your copy from the Piety Stall or Parish Office and they will arrive in time for the start of Advent.

FACE MASKS

We remind you of the current rule, issued by the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England & Wales and endorsed by the Archdiocese, with regards to the wearing of face masks:

"Face coverings will remain mandatory for all those coming to Mass and/or a church service. (Exemptions for genuine medical reasons excluded.) We must ensure that people wear face coverings properly over both nose & mouth which will reduce aerosol or droplet spread." We ask everyone coming to church to follow this rule. Thank you.

TEST & TRACE

In order to support the NHS Test and Trace programme, we are taking contact details for all those coming to church. If you have downloaded the NHS Test & Trace App on your smart phone you can scan the QR code instead which is displayed in church.

In line with guidance issued by the Department for Health and Social Care, we will keep your details safely and in compliance with GDPR legislation for 21 days before securely disposing of or deleting them. We will only share your details with NHS Test and Trace, if asked, in the event that it is needed to help stop the spread of coronavirus. We will not use your details for any other purposes or pass them on to anyone else.

PARISH VOLUNTEERS

The Archdiocese has asked Parish Priests to remind people that any work undertaken on church or parish hall premises must have the agreement of the Parish Priest. Work, especially any maintenance, must not be carried out without his consent and knowledge.

LAUDATE SI' ACTION PLATFORM

On the 25 May 2021, at the close of the Laudato Si' Special Anniversary Year, Pope Francis gifted us the Laudato Si' Action Platform (LSAP), a seven-year journey of ecological conversion in action. The seven-year journey is inspired by the seven Laudato Si' goals: Cry of the Earth, Cry of the Poor, Ecological Economics, Simple Lifestyles, Ecological Education, Ecological Spirituality, and Community Engagement with Participatory Action. The LSAP will create a space for the universal Church to respond to the global emergency we are facing. Through it we can learn and grow together as we take decisive action to build a better future in the spirit of Laudato Si'.

SUNDAY THOUGHTS

Elijah, one of the greatest prophets of the Old Testament, makes his first appearance in the Bible in the midst of a terrible drought and famine. The Lord has promised to watch over him. But this does not mean that Elijah can sit back and wait for food and water to magically appear. No, God sends him out on a mission. God calls him to persuade the people who have lost their faith in God and begun to worship Baal, the Canaanite god of rain, storms, and fertility. At the same time, God deputises others to care for Elijah. In the passage preceding today's reading, ravens — associated with the spirit world — help lead him to a stream of running water and feed him bread and meat. Today we hear of a widow who shares what she thinks will be her last morsel of food with him. In a foreign land, Elijah is taught by God to rely on generous, hospitable strangers to sustain his life.

The two widows we meet today are faces of Christ, particularly of the ultimate sacrifice he will make. These widows had no "safety net" to rely on, from either government assistance or institutional programmes. Without an income or social standing, they were left to rely on the generosity of others. Yet, it was their own generosity that made them models of Jesus' self-sacrifice. Each willingly gives her only asset, 'everything she possessed' to the Lord. In our acquisitive culture, in which society judges us by our possessions and we are always encouraged to buy the newest, the latest, the hottest, giving from our want is countercultural, even crazy.

As Jesus leaves the temple in the very next verse of Mark's Gospel, he tells his disciples that the temple will soon be destroyed. They realised only later that he was referring to the temple of his body. In a sense, then, this poor widow was doing the same thing: giving her whole life to the body of Christ, the Church, the people of God. If we saw Jesus himself—in his human body—sitting down opposite the collection box, we certainly would increase our offering, perhaps even to more than we think we can afford. We need to be reminded that what we do for the least of our sisters and brothers, we do for him. Anna, another widow of immense faith, encountered the infant Jesus during his first appearance in the temple. This widow stood in the presence of the Messiah, the Christ, during his final appearance there.

A reminder that the Archbishop informed the priests in 2020 that following a request for clarification on the issue of secular/non-religious music in church,. it has been agreed by him and the Archbishop's Council that there is now a policy across the Archdiocese of no secular music in Church Services i.e. Funerals, Weddings etc. This follows the Church's general principle of only sacred music within the liturgy.

FEAST OF THE WEEK Dedication of the Lateran Basilica - Tuesday 9 November

The Lateran Basilica was built by the Emperor Constantine on the Lateran Hill in Rome in about 324. The feast of its dedication has been celebrated in Rome on this date since the twelfth century. In honour of the basilica, "the mother and head of all the churches of the City and the World," the feast has been extended to the



whole Catholic Church as a sign of unity and love towards the See of Peter (the Papacy, which, as St Ignatius of Antioch said in the second century, "presides over the whole assembly of charity."
