#### **ADVICE TO PARISHES**

With the continuing threat of the Omicron variation, the Bishops' Conference of England & Wales have issued new guidelines to parishes.

From Friday 10 December 2021 HM Government made the wearing of face masks mandatory in Places of Worship. However, there will be exemptions for those leading worship, public proclamation of scriptural readings or prayers, and those who are genuinely unable to wear face coverings and are exempt.

With respect to the current situation with the Omicron variant it is important to ensure the following points are followed in all churches:

That people displaying any symptoms of Covid-19 should stay at home and not travel to church or participate in person.

That hand sanitiser is available to those attending the Church.

That there is good ventilation and air throughput in the building; in this case, because of climatic conditions, it would be important to remind people to wrap up well in church.

There is now very strong evidence to support that the main mode of this variant's viral transmission is through aerosols, and that the risk from surface and touch transmission is very small indeed. Wearing a mask must be done properly i.e. over mouth and nose.

That people who are engaged in a form of pastoral ministry which involves ministry to the housebound, sick and vulnerable, should take regular lateral flow tests to ensure they are safe to do so. These are free from the NHS.

#### FEAST OF THE WEEK

St Antony (17 January)

St Antony is the originator of the monastic life. He was born in Egypt: when his parents died, he listened to the words of the Gospel and gave all his

belongings to the poor. He went out into the wilderness to begin a life of penitence, living in absolute poverty, praying, meditating, and supporting himself by manual work. He suffered many temptations, both physical and spiritual, but he overcame them. Disciples gathered round him, attracted by his wisdom and holiness. He gave support to the victims of the persecutions of Diocletian, and helping St Athanasius in his fight against the Arians. He lived to be over a hundred years old, and died in 356.

Her newest book. Climate Generation: Awakening to Our Children's Future (NCP) 2018), was described by Naomi Klein as "an anguished journey into the heart of the climate crisis." It tells her personal story of waking up to the ecological emergency as a mother, academic and activist. Her academic research interests include the just transition, civil society movements and the role of faith groups in climate activism and she lectures part time at Maynooth University, Ireland. She is a leading voice on faith-consistent investing within the Catholic Church and supported the Irish Bishops' Conference to divest from fossil fuels in 2018. #### SUNDAY THOUGHTS

Strange, isn't it, how we don't know the names of the couple who were getting married at Cana? In fact, we hear nothing about them at all, not



even when the chief steward compliments the groom on the quality of the wine.

St John's emphasis is on the presence of Jesus at the wedding. All throughout the Old Testament the prophets had spoken about God's relationship with his people as that of a bride and groom. God speaks about taking Israel as his bride in a wedding feast that would outshine all others and in a love that was everlasting and unparalleled.

So when St John gives his account of Jesus's first miracle (or 'signs' as he calls them) he is trying to tell us that the marriage between God and us has now begun. The changing of water into wine is a 'sign' that the kingdom of God is now among us.

Sometimes people have used Mary's request to Jesus as an indication of her power with her Son. But there is really something deeper going on in the story. Mary represents the Jewish people or humanity that is about to learn of the explosion of the kingdom upon the earth. She is about to learn that the real groom is Jesus, whose wedding with humanity is just beginning and will be consummated in his death and resurrection. In Jesus God has visited his people to take it as his spouse and lead it definitively into a life of everlasting love.

At Cana, Jesus of Nazareth reveals himself for the first time in John's gospel as the Son of God with all the creative power that was needed to fashion heaven and earth. And the changing of water into wine is a 'sign' of this revelation.

What about today? Whose wedding is Jesus at? Well, he's at yours and mine. By coming among us, as one of us, Jesus invites the Church to be his bride. It's our wedding that he wants to celebrate daily, our wedding with him, with the Father and the Spirit. It's to us that he proposes marriage; it's our water that he promises to turn into wine. And each time we eat and drink the bread of his body and the wine of his blood we renew our marriage vows with him.

It is wonderful to have our parish Christmas Crib back after the previous scaled down version. The crib will be in place until Wednesday 2nd February. It is customary to make a donation to the 'Crib Collection' which this year will



go to The Rosary Sisters School in Gaza. This Christian School run by the Sisters was badly affected in the bombing of Gaza earlier this year. people from across the Archdiocese have donated nearly £3000 to help rebuild the school and community. Fr Mark knows the community well and he knows how grateful they will be of our help.

#### **Universal Synod on Synodality**

Submissions: 10 January 2022 - 10 March 2022

Synod 2021-2023 for a synodal church: communion, participation, mission called by Pope Francis for 2023 was opened on 9 October 2021. Due to the proximity of the launch of our own Archdiocesan Pastoral Plan, the start of our reflection process was delayed in Liverpool until the New Year.

As an archdiocese, we are providing opportunities to participate, albeit in a somewhat "lighter" way than our recent Synod 2020 listening and discussion processes. Resources and submissions are online from Monday 10 January – Thursday 10 March 2022. The submissions received for the universal Synod will be combined with those from Synod 2020 and will form our archdiocesan response.

We have streamlined the submission process as much as possible without losing the breadth of focus that has been provided by the Vatican Synod Office. The preferred method of submitting responses is online <a href="https://www.liverpoolcatholicresources.com/synod2023">www.liverpoolcatholicresources.com/synod2023</a> although email and postal submissions are, of course, possible. The deadline for all responses is 10 March 2022.
