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#### **QUESTION OF THE WEEK**

#### WEEKDAY MASS

#### **ADVICE TO PARISHES**

We ask you to keep in mind the rules that are still in place in places of worship:

That people displaying any symptoms of Covid-19 should stay at home and not travel to church or participate in person.

That hand sanitiser is available to those attending the Church.

That there is good ventilation and air throughout the building.

- There is now very strong evidence to support that the main mode of this variant's viral transmission is through aerosols, and that the risk from surface and touch transmission is very small indeed. Wearing a mask must be done properly i.e. over mouth and nose.
- The Sign of Peace is restored to its traditional form but it's left to people whether they offer a hand shake or simply bow to people around them. Please be sensitive to people's wishes.
- Holy Water is now restored and in the stoups in the church porch.
- That people who are engaged in a form of pastoral ministry which involves ministry to the housebound, sick and vulnerable, should take regular lateral flow tests to ensure they are safe to do so.

#### SHOULD I COME TO MASS?

The statement released by the Bishops' of England & Wales last Autumn reflected the pastoral situation of public worship in the light of the pandemic at this time. The Bishops have asked for all Catholics to reflect on their pastoral circumstances with respect to their attendance at Mass on Sunday. Questions have been raised regarding the status of the Sunday Obligation. The Code of Canon Law states that 'Sunday is the primordial holy day obligation' (Can. 1246.1) and 'the faithful are obliged to participate in the Mass' (Can. 1247).

At the beginning of the pandemic, the Bishops recognised that the participation in the Sunday Mass was prevented due to grave cause because of the emergence of the Covid-19 pandemic and stated that the Sunday obligation could not be fulfilled due to the inherent danger of people gathering in churches for Mass. On 23rd March 2020, the Government mandated the closure of places of worship.

The Bishops, now having reflected on the current situation recognise that the causes and effects of the pandemic are still present to such a degree that the *absolute* duty for all to freely attend Sunday Mass cannot yet be fulfilled.

As such, they have asked all Catholics now reflect on the centrality of the Eucharist to their own life of faith and take into consideration their personal circumstances and the reasons as to whether they can now attend Sunday Mass or otherwise.

Should a person feel that they still cannot genuinely attend Sunday Mass, there is no sin associated with their non-attendance and they are encouraged to devote themselves to prayer at home. This may be achieved either through personal prayer or be participating with a live-streamed celebration of Mass from a Church.

#### WRAP UP WARM!

Please remember that we have to follow Government guidance about ventilation during this time of Covid. Whilst the heating is on in church, we still have to keep doors/windows open so please wrap up warm for Mass.

#### St Josephine Bakhita

Born in Darfur, Sudan, in 1868 she was kidnapped by slave traders when she was only nine. Having been abused terribly she was rescued by the Italian consul and taken to Italy where she worked as a maid. Eventually she became a Christian and took the name Josephine as a sign of her new life. She entered the convent of the Canossian Daughters of Charity in Venice and spent fifty years as a Sister with a great reputation for holiness and ended her life in 1947. She is thought to be the only canonised saint originally from Sudan. Her feast day is on Tuesday.

Following on from the Scripture Study Course last Autumn, a new course will be offered as part of our Lenten journey.



#### SUNDAY THOUGHTS

What links Isaiah and the disciples of today's gospel? They were both overawed when faced with the presence of God. Isaiah had a vision of God and the overwhelming feeling was one of holiness. Angels kept singing the word 'holy', making Isaiah feel even more unclean and sinful. Similarly, when Peter, James and John saw how many fish they'd netted they were overcome with awe. This wasn't because they'd caught lots of fish but because they realised they were in the presence of someone special.

Holiness is God's trademark. Yes, there's love, mercy, justice, compassion etc. But it's holiness that marks God out as special. In fact, holiness means being set apart, being different from, being completely other. Some people never grasp the holiness of God. They practise their religion as if they were doing God a favour. After all, they could stop coming to church and offer their services to some local or national charity instead. I'm sure the Hospice



Shop or Rotary would welcome them with open arms. But this is to miss the point.

True faith comes as a response to God's holiness. It's a result of realising immenseness of God's glory and grandeur, of his 'otherness'. And to glimpse God's holiness means to be drawn into the only possible response: to try and be as like God as is humanly possible. When Isaiah had his moment his reaction was first to say 'I'm a man of unclean lips' and only later was he able to say 'Send me.' Peter's reaction to the holiness of Jesus was to shout out, 'Leave me, Lord; I'm a sinful man' and only later follow him.

When we attend church we're not doing God a favour. We're not showing others how good we are, how loyal is our brand of Christianity. We come because we've experienced something of God's holiness in our lives and feel moved to react. That's why at our liturgy we first listen to God's 'holy' word and only then respond in praise. It's not so much what we do as what we allow God's holiness to provoke within us. We can only worship God when we've been overcome by holiness.

#### **Universal Synod on Synodality**

Submissions: 10 January 2022 – 10 March 2022

Synod 2021-2023 for a synodal church: communion, participation, mission called by Pope Francis for 2023 was opened on 9 October 2021. Due to the proximity of the launch of our own Archdiocesan Pastoral Plan, the start of our reflection process was delayed in Liverpool until the New Year.

As an archdiocese, we are providing opportunities to participate, albeit in a somewhat "lighter" way than our recent Synod 2020 listening and discussion processes. Resources and submissions are online from Monday 10 January – Thursday 10 March 2022. The submissions received for the universal Synod will be combined with those from Synod 2020 and will form our archdiocesan response.

We have streamlined the submission process as much as possible without losing the breadth of focus that has been provided by the Vatican Synod Office. The preferred method of submitting responses is online <a href="https://www.liverpoolcatholicresources.com/synod2023">www.liverpoolcatholicresources.com/synod2023</a> although email and postal submissions are, of course, possible. The deadline for all responses is 10 March 2022.
