

Next weekend we will welcome Father John Boles who will be making the parish annual mission appeal.

Father John was born, brought up and ordained in Stockport. Before entering the Columban's he worked as a Town and Country Planning Officer. He's spent

nearly all of his priestly life in Latin America, including some 25 years in Peru, from where he returned last year.

The Columban Fathers were founded in 1918 as the Irish (or "Maynooth") Mission to China. Their name changed in 1952 when they were expelled from China, taking as their patron a mediaeval Irish missionary saint. They then began working in other countries around the rim of the Pacific such as the Philippines. Korea, Taiwan, Chile and Peru.

FEAST OF THE WEEK

St Antony (Monday 13 June)

Saint Antony was first of all an Augustinian monk, but he was so impressed by the martyrdom of five Franciscans who had been spreading the faith in Morocco that he became a Franciscan friar himself, so that he could preach the gospel in Africa too.



Illness obliged him to leave Morocco, and a storm then drove his ship to Sicily, so that he found himself taking part in the General Chapter of the Franciscans in 1221, where he met Saint Francis of Assisi himself. His preaching career then took him to northern Italy and southern France, then a stronghold of the Albigensian heresy. Later he returned to Italy, to Padua, where he was an outstanding preacher and the first Franciscan theologian. His sermons are full of gentleness, but he reproved the wicked with fearless severity – especially backsliding clergy and the oppressors of the weak. His shrine is a centre of pilgrimage, and he is also the patron saint of the lost and found.

MUSIC IN CHURCH

A reminder that the Archbishop informed the priests in 2020 that following a request for clarification on the issue of secular/non-religious music in church,. it has been agreed by him and the Archbishop's Council that there is now a policy across the Archdiocese of no secular music in Church Services i.e. Funerals, Weddings etc. This follows the Church's general principle of only sacred music within the liturgy.

Governance Officer.



Under the direction of the Director of Education, the post holder will promote the policies of the Archdiocese in Catholic Schools by providing advice and support to headteachers, staff, governors of and clergy working within these schools. SUNDAY THOUGHTS

Jesus' words to his disciples at the beginning of today's Gospel - 'I still have many things to say to you, but they would be too much for you now' (John 16:12) - can be appreciated much more when we realise that they were spoken on the night before Jesus was arrested, tortured, put on trial, and condemned to death. He was right. They could not bear what they were about to witness. After all, they fled in fear as he was led away. The other evangelists portray Jesus' wish that he did not have to bear it either, along with his resolve that his Father's will be done, no matter how difficult. His trust in the One who

That relationship between the Father and the Son that inspired such trust and confidence in the face of death is matched in their relationship with the Spirit as well. The mutual love each person of the Trinity has for the others is a model of the love we are called to give each other according to the greatest commandment. To love God with our whole heart, mind, strength, and being, and to love our neighbour as ourselves is to mirror the love of our triune God. God is love and love naturally seeks an object of its desire. The Father, Son, and Spirit are bound in a perfect love, love that can then be extended to humanity. Our love of humanity causes us to seek others to whom we can express that selfless, generous, and forgiving love that God lavishes upon us.

St Paul speaks of afflictions, endurance, and character and he certainly grew in all three in his work as the preeminent apostle to the Gentiles. He knows well how these qualities lead to hope, the hope that is grounded in our faith and in God's love for us. Paul describes that love being poured out into us, as a liquid would be, suggesting that it can flow into and out of us. As much as it was flowing into Paul from God, it was flowing out of Paul to people all over the world, from Antioch to Rome, to everywhere in between, and into their hearts, where it could then flow ever outward and onward. The Holy Spirit makes all of us channels of God's love in the world.

 First aid kits and battlefield first aid kits (including sterile dressings, safety pins, antiseptic fluid/cream/spray, disposable gloves, burn free kits, eye wash) Bandages - different widths (including halo chest seals, torniquets, splints, QuikClot Combat Gauze, Steri-Strips, triangular bandages, Tourni-Key Plus) Toiletries (including toothbrushes, toothpaste, soap, shampoo) • Bedding, sleeping bags, blankets, mattresses Generators and different types of chargers Nappy rash creams and baby bath lotions (all ages and sizes) Powdered baby milk and feeding bottles Pain relief (e.g Paracetamol, Ibuprofen) Warm underclothing (including socks) Sanitary products Nappies (all ages and sizes) Rucksacks Please note, as the delivery chain is currently at capacity, we are exploring various options for delivery.
