





Together we are Nugent

Nugent is a Merseyside based charity which has been caring, educating, protecting and inspiring those who are vulnerable and at-risk for over 140 years.

We are a multifaceted organisation, supporting children, young people and adults who are vulnerable or at-risk. We are the only charity in the country which runs a secure unit for children and young people who have often been transported from other ends of the country for their own safety due to factors such as criminal exploitation, sexual exploitation, challenging behaviours or often 'missing from care'.

In addition, we run several children's care homes for those who have experienced trauma, adult care homes for those suffering with dementia and brain injuries, a school for those suffering with mental health issues, a new beginnings scheme to support homelessness, an adoption service, and a huge amount of community outreach projects aimed at tackling all forms of poverty.



The Orchards - Supported Living

A learning disability affects the way a person learns new things throughout their lifetime, meaning that they may have difficulties understanding new or complex information, learning new skills and caring for themselves or living alone. Around 1.5 million people in the UK have a learning disability and the figure is increasing.

A learning disability happens when a person's brain development is affected, either before they're born, during their birth or in early childhood. This could be caused by things such as; the mother becoming ill in pregnancy, problems during birth that stop enough oxygen getting to the brain, the unborn baby inheriting certain genes, illness or injury in early childhood. However, sometimes there is no known cause for a learning disability.

It has been proven that the appropriate accommodation and correct social setting has a strong impact on the safety and overall quality of life of those with a learning disability, while also reducing social exclusion.

The Orchards is situated in Billinge at the heart of a village community. Which offers a variety of amenities including shops, restaurants & cafés, a community centre, library as well as access to health services such as GP and dentist.

The homes are 6 bedroomed properties which have en suite facilities in all bedrooms, large living room and kitchen with the ability to use smaller lounges as family rooms or quite lounges for people who prefer to be alone at times.

The scheme will be a supported tenancy, and people will have access to a dedicated team to help support with housing benefits, understanding of tenancy agreements and how to maintain agreements.

Onsite Communal Hub

The onsite communal hub will provide adults with learning, physical disabilities or those suffering with mental health issues a place to learn, develop and grow. It will be a safe space where they can build friendships, develop life skills in order to help them live a more fulfilled life.

My name is Jack and I have several learning disabilities which means I need extra support and care in my day to day life. I have very complex needs and I struggle with looking after myself, dealing with social situations and understanding new information.

In order for me to get the best out of life, I need staff and carers who know my complex needs. Living in a supported living accommodation with staff on hand would enable me to do the things I love.

Joy

My name is Joy and I struggle with learning new things, communication and reading and writing. I need an supported living service where I can do the things I enjoy whilst receive special care and support from dedicated staff.

I enjoy playing board games and making new friends, as well as having the space to enjoy visits from my family and do activities together.

Being supported by staff in the Hub will help me to gain confidence to do carry out day to day tasks on my own. Spending time with people who share similar difficulties to me will help put me at ease and will ensure I make valuable and lasting friendships as well as improve my mental well-being.
