

FEAST OF THE WEEK St John Ogilvie (1579-1615)

John Ogilvie was born of noble Calvinist parents in 1579 at Drum-na-Keith in Banffshire, Scotland. As a boy he was sent to the continent to further his education. With the help of Father Cornelius van den Steen he was

received into the Catholic Church. He entered the Society of Jesus on the 5th November 1599, and was ordained priest at Paris in 1610. He returned to his native country, but his ministry was cut short by his betrayal and capture in Glasgow. After extreme suffering he was hanged on the 10th of March 1615. The principal cause of his martyrdom was his insistence on the primacy of the Pope in spiritual matters, a primacy he affirmed with great constancy to the very end. His last words were "If there be here any hidden Catholics, let them pray for me but the prayers of heretics I will not have." After he was pushed from the ladder, he threw his hidden Rosary beads out into the crowd. One of his enemies caught them, and he became a devout Catholic for the rest of his life.

SUNDAY THOUGHTS

God speaks from the cloud at the Transfiguration, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him". Those last three words were given to his disciples as a command then, and they are given to us as well, for we too are his disciples.



Are we listening to Jesus today? Are we making the effort to listen for Jesus' voice during this holy season? Whether we look inside ourselves or out into the world, we can see plenty of things that could be done, plenty of things that we should do, plenty of things that Jesus is asking us to do.

Just before this scene, Jesus had told his disciples that he will be persecuted by the authorities and put to death. Peter had immediately rebuked him, to which Jesus responded, "Get behind me, Satan! . . . You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do". Significantly, Peter is one of the three who now hear God say about Jesus, "Listen to him." It's almost as if God is saying: My Son is telling you the truth. You better listen! You need to understand this!

After confronting Peter's rebuke, Jesus speaks to the other disciples, telling them, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny [themselves], take up [their] cross, and follow me". God affirms this statement in commanding Peter, James, and John to listen to Jesus. This command is addressed to us as well. If we are to come after Jesus, if we are to be raised to eternal life with him, we must deny our own desires, take up our crosses, and follow him.."

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

At a recent meeting of the Deanery priests they decided to offer the sacrament of the sick after Friday Mass each week in Lent. This is not for multiple anointings - it is to awaken awareness of this wonderful healing sacrament and to invite anyone who is sick, going into hospital, anxious or mentally frail to come and receive Gods help and strength. Every Friday after morning Mass (about 10.30am).

Quiet days in Lent: [Wed 1st, Mon 6th, Friday 24th, Monday 27th March] Individuals can spend a day or half a day organising their own prayer / reading or make use of suggested scripture passages suitable for Lent / Holy Week and walk in the woods.

Lent as a season of growth: [Mon 13th ; Wed 22nd March] Guided day of reflection and sharing, reflecting on how the disciplines of prayer and fasting were an integral part of Jesus' life helps us to see Lent as a period of growth.

Eden to Gethsemane via the desert: [Wed 15th March; Thursday 23rd March]

Guided day of reflection and sharing: Temptation in the two gardens. A day spent in the two scriptural gardens to understand the nature of temptation and ways of responding to it in the light of Jesus' 40 days in the desert.

SANCTUARY LAMP

Did you know that this candle is one of the most important candles lit in Roman Catholic Churches? The General Instruction of the Roman Missal states: "In accordance with tradition, near the tabernacle a special lamp should be kept alight to indicate and honour the presence of Christ in the tabernacle". It is a sign that the Lord is present in the tabernacle and a reminder of Christ's abiding love for us. This candle is continuously lit except from Holy Thursday evening - Holy Saturday night. Each candle lasts approximately 7 days before it is renewed.

Would you like to dedicate the Sanctuary Lamp to a loved one, living or dead. or for a specific intention? The cost is just £5. If you would like a dedication for a week, place your £5 and the intention inside an envelope with SANCTUARY LAMP on the envelope and we will publish the intention each week in the parish newsletter.

ST OSCAR ROMERO MASS

To mark the feast of St Oscar Romero, there is a Mass followed by talk "Responding to the Cry of the Poor Today" at 7:00pm on Thursday 23 March 2023, in Saint Edmund of Canterbury Church, Waterloo.

Outside of El Salvador, the Archdiocese of Liverpool is the only place to hold a Mass to mark the martyrdom of Archbishop Romero every year since his assassination. This is the 43rd anniversary mass to be held.

After the Mass, there will be refreshments and a talk by Peggy Healy.

Pathways to social action: Supporting refugees and asylum seekers "This is church..."

My work this month has taken me to Support and Helping Asylum seekers and Refugees (SHARe) Knowsley. This project started at St Aidan's when parishioners started helping asylum seekers in the Huyton area. They've gone from volunteers serving hot drinks, to 5 staff seeing hundreds of people a week. They offer English classes, welfare support and a warm welcome to people of all faiths and none. While they don't press any faith, one participant said, "this is what church feels like".

MICAH LIVERPOOL

Micah Liverpool is a social justice charity that has been set up by Liverpool Cathedral, Liverpool Metropolitan Cathedral of Christ the King and St Bride's Church to relieve Liverpool residents from social injustice and poverty. We are currently running projects to combat unemployment and deliver emergency food aid and affordable food.

They are looking to recruit more volunteers for all of its food aid activity. They run four projects Tuesday to Friday between 10.30am and 12.30pm and are looking for people who would like to get involved and give something back to their communities.

They are also asking for people who have language skills to apply for volunteering roles as we support such a diverse range of people. They have multiple roles including foodbank volunteer, community market volunteer, administration volunteer and stores person volunteer.
