

PASCHAL CANDLE 2023.

We hope you like this year's Paschal Candle which is called 'Merciful Lamb'. The Merciful Lamb Paschal Candle is hand-crafted to showcase the sculpted Agnus Dei medallion in brilliant white Beeswax with gold-leaf trim. The candle's wax date is presented in the tradition arrangement around the striking silver cross. With delicate detailing and fine craftsmanship, the Merciful Lamb is our tribute to the sacrifice that Jesus Christ, Lamb of God, made for our eternal salvation. The candle is positioned next to the Lectern and will be lit every day for the next 50 days before it's moved to the font and will then be lit at every baptism and funeral celebration.

COMMUNION UNDER BOTH KINDS

Receiving Holy Communion from the chalice was re-introduced across parishes in England & Wales last week. The Archbishop has asked the priests to make one important point.

The Bishops of England & Wales do not allow the Sacred Host to be dipped into the chalice (this is called intinction). This has never been allowed in England & Wales as the Roman Rite does not permit that communicants themselves dip the host into the Precious Blood.


If you wish to receive the Precious Blood you must take the chalice in both hands and drink from the chalice. The Minister of Holy Communion will then carefully wipe the chalice with a purificator.


FUNERAL MASS

SUNDAY THOUGHTS

John wrote that the first thing Jesus did after greeting the apostles was show them his hands and his side. He showed them his wounds. Not only did that prove that he really was the Lord, it also showed them that the wounds had a real and lasting effect on his body. His body was not restored to an unblemished state. It was Jesus' wounded body that was raised from the dead, that was taken to heaven, and that remains there now. The wounds on Christ's body are not symbolic or superficial. Similarly, the body of Christ - the Church - is wounded, and those wounds are real.

We have the opportunity to see Christ's risen body as well, just not in the same way that the apostles did. With the eyes of faith - through Thomas's eyes, if you will - we can perceive his risen body, wounds and all, in the Church, in the world, in our community, in our parish, in each other. That faith-filled vision allowed the early Christian community to live and thrive despite the persecution they endured, even eating their daily meals "with exultation and sincerity of heart, praising God and enjoying favor with all the people" (Acts 2:46–47). They saw Christ's risen body in their community: in the wounds they suffered and in the fellowship they shared.

Significantly, Jesus' first words to his disciples after his resurrection were "Peace be with you" This simple greeting, which may sound ordinary or even trite, meant a lot to the disciples, for they had all abandoned him as he suffered and died on the cross. But when Jesus returned, he came not only with the gift of the Holy Spirit, but also with the gift of reconciliation, restoring the bond between him and them. When he showed them his hands and his side, he was not reminding them of what they had left him to go through alone. He was giving them a share in his triumph over sin and death.

THE CORONATION OF KING CHARLES III

On Friday 5 May at 5pm there is a Vigil Mass at the Metropolitan Cathedral to celebrate the Coronation of His Majesty the King Charles III. All are welcome to attend. Parishes have been sent special texts for Masses to be



celebrated on 5 May for the Coronation. Mass in our parish will be at 12noon on that day and you are encouraged to come along and join with our fellow Catholics around the country to pray for the King's intentions. Special Coronation prayer cards will also be available.

FROM THE ARCHBISHOP

As the evenings become brighter and there is sunshine in early morning, I notice life in my garden here at Archbishop's House. The various birds and animals that make their homes in the trees and in the flowerbeds seem to be more alive. My garden took on a greater significance for me during the pandemic. It was a place I could walk and sit down in the fresh air.

The annual feast of Easter reminds us so much of those things of the garden where the Lord was buried. It seemed that the darkness of Good Friday would eclipse all in its shade as Jesus was placed in the tomb, which was sealed, such darkness is felt in Ukraine and in other parts of the world where there is war, violence, and suffering. The quietness of that feast of Passover which is described as 'when the King sleeps' reminds us of the silence of helplessness and death present in all our lives. But the garden also reminds of us the new and abundant life that bursts forth on Easter Day, the life which cannot be put back in the tomb.

The life of Jesus, poured into each of us in our baptism is a reason for hope this Easter Day. As we continue to see so much uncertainty in the political sphere, both local and global, we are called to return to the source, to the risen Jesus, who reminds us that there will be suffering, but ultimately glory; the glory of the life of God given to each of us in His son, Jesus Christ.

The glory given to us is the culmination of a journey – a journey of hope. The disciples hoped for the Messiah and found him in Jesus, yet their journey wasn't an easy one. They experienced that darkness of Good Friday and felt lost as their hope turned to despair, as their lives were turned upside down. Yet, three days later on Easter morning their lives were completely transformed as the tomb was empty and the risen Lord was truly with them again.


It is hope which is part of the journey of so many - refugees and asylum seekers longing for peace, safety and a better life – may we welcome them with the peace of the risen Christ. May we bring light to the darkness of the people of Ukraine and join with them in their hope for peace and may our own journey lead us to give hope to the lonely, those who mourn, those in poverty and the oppressed.

May we welcome the light of the Risen Christ into the darkness of our lives so that we can see what hope his call holds for us and on this great feast of Easter let us remember that Jesus has won the victory and extends life to all.
