SUNDAY THOUGHTS

This feast day, we celebrate a king whose reign was not defined by earthly ambitions supported by powerful armies or the conquest of lands, acquisition of wealth or subjugation of peoples. We celebrate a king who taught us very different values. Who calls us to see his face in the cry of our sisters and brothers who are hungry, thirsty, strangers, lacking clothing, imprisoned; calling us to love them and to respond to their needs.

This week marks the 75th anniversary of the assassination of President JF Kennedy. Shortly before his death he told students in Washington: "let us direct attention to our common interests and to the means by which differences can be resolved. For in the final analysis, our most basic common link is that we inhabit this small planet. We all breathe the same air. We all cherish our children's future. And we are all mortal."

Christ came as king for everyone, his message was not for any particular nation or peoples. He calls on us to respond to the needs of all inhabiting our small planet earth. In a world which seems to be increasingly defined by division, differences, inequalities and injustice among peoples, let us never cease striving to bring about Christ's kingdom, for the benefit and enjoyment of everyone. So that in this life or the next, Christ will look to us and say, "you did not neglect the least of these sisters and brothers of mine. As you did this to one of them, you did it to me."

Farewell to Matthew. Today we end our Sunday-by-Sunday hearing of St. Matthew's Gospel. Matthew has kept our eyes on the Kingdom throughout the year, and our reading culminates in the overwhelming picture painted in today's passage, one of the greatest of the many parables of Jesus he records. Matthew has also given us one of the greatest guides to living, the Beatitudes, which tell us that the meek, the poor in spirit, the peacemakers, the mourners - all the unfortunate and all those who struggle for right - will inherit the kingdom.

'Lord Jesus, King of justice and human dignity, you inspire us to hear the cry of our sisters and brothers. May we strive to work for the common good of all, so everyone may share in the gift of your creation, our planet earth. Amen'



DEANERY NEWS Families of Parishes.

Following the extensive consultation in each of the parishes across the deanery, the priests met last week to look at all the comments and suggestions offered by people and they can confirm that there was widespread agreement with the proposed families of parishes and an acknowledgement that that was the right way forward. The priests have now sent the formal proposal to the Archbishop who will ratify the decision. Our deanery will have two families:

Family 1: Our Lady & The English Martyrs, St Elizabeth of Hungary, St. Robert Bellarmine. St Benets & Our Lady of Walsingham.

Family 2: Holy Rosary, St George, St Mary & Kentigern, St Catherine of Alexandria.

We will continue to work as a deanery but the parishes in both families will work closer together and the priests, the Deanery Synodal Council and parishes will continue to look at the ways in which the families will operate.

Deanery Patron

During the consultation process for Families of Parishes we also invited people to propose a Patron for our Deanery. Overwhelmingly the name that came up most consistently in the area was **St Teresa of Calcutta.** The priests have informed the Episcopal Vicar for Pastoral Organisation with this proposal and he has formally replied to accept it.
