

PASCHAL CANDLE 2024

Eaves. May he rest in peace.

This year's Paschal Candle, solemnly blessed on Saturday, is called 'Evangelium'

The "Evangelium is a Beeswax Paschal Candle - in tribute to the writers of the four Gospels. This beautiful iconic design rendered in bronze toned wax, gilded with 24 karat gold leaf dramatically offsets the natural hues of the Beeswax Paschal Candle.



Mathew, Mark, Luke and John - Early, traditional Christian art has long depicted, in beautiful iconic fashion, these four writers of the Gospels as the four "living creatures" that surround God's throne. Mathew (Human), Mark (Lion), Luke (Ox) and John (Eagle). The Evangelium Candle has been meticulously assembled using hand-cast wax ornaments, trimmed with 24 karat gold leaf then inlaid beneath the surface of the highest quality Beeswax candle. Complete with wax incense pins. The Evangelium...distinguished, unparalleled, extraordinary.

SUNDAY THOUGHTS

For years, Jesus had confounded even his closest disciples. He insisted the crowds stay for a meal when all they had were a few loaves and fish. He told them to turn the other cheek, that it is the poor and downtrodden that are blessed, and that each of them had a cross to carry. He revealed that he would be condemned to death. Now he's disappeared from the tomb they'd buried him in just three days before. Mary Magdalene is frantic. Peter and John are rendered speechless. All three are confused. What has happened? None of them yet understood that they had to look for him in a different way. Jesus may confound us as well. We may not find him where we expect, or when we expect, or in the way we expect. But let us take comfort in the confidence that no matter where we go, no matter how confounded we are, he will find us.

In his letter to the Colossians, Paul gives us a clue as to finding the risen Lord: "Seek what is above". If we have died with Christ, as we did in baptism, then we have been raised with Christ. This ought to be our perspective. There is a permanence to what is above that cannot be achieved on earth. How relatively fleeting even our happiest times have been: our wedding day, the birth of a child, a career accomplishment. The Resurrection frees us to seek love and mercy and life in a way that outlasts what is on earth.

The Resurrection transforms us. Holding the promise of resurrection for ourselves and those we love gives hope and meaning to our life. It transforms us. But we are also transformed by the power God has to raise us from our graves of sinfulness and our tombs of despair. In many ways, our lives are reborn by the Resurrection, like a fresh batch of dough, as Paul told the Corinthians, and by focusing our minds on what is above, as he told the Colossians. A God who has the power to. transform death to new life has the power to transform our ordinary, difficult lives to new lives as well. May we recognise that our lives stand ever ready for transformation.

CONGRATULATIONS

To Fr Philip Inch, parish priest of Holy Rosary, who has been appointed a Chaplain to His Holiness the Pope. This is a title of distinction given by the Pope in recognition of a priest's service to the Church. In 2013 Pope Francis changed the rules that all such priests receiving this honour must be at least 65 years old. The honour allows the priest to use the title of 'Monsignor' and we congratulate Mgr Philip for this well deserved honour in recognition of the years of service to our Diocese. Out of the eight priests in our deanery, 2 are now Monsignors, and 2 are Canons!

Two other priests of the Diocese were also awarded with this honour on Wednesday: Mgr Philip Gregory. (Episcopal Vicar for Priests) and Mgr Stephen Maloney (Episcopal Vicar for Retired and Sick Priests).

REGULAR GIVING TO THE CHURCH

The best way to give regularly to the parish is with a Standing Order so that your contribution is paid by your bank to the parish account. This reduces the cash that has to be handled. Envelopes will always remain available but please consider the use of Standing Orders. Please contact the parish office if you would like one. If you are a tax payer please consider joining the Gift Aid Scheme as this is a way of increasing our income without having to ask people for more money. For every £1 you give 25p extra will be claimed back by the parish.

FR BARRY MCALLISTER

Please pray for the repose of the soul of Father Barry McAllister, parish priest of St Elizabeth & St Robert Bellarmine, who died last week.

Vigil Mass: Wednesday 10th April 7.30 p.m at St Elizabeth's. The Canons of the Chapter will lead Evening Prayer from the Office for the Dead at 7.00 p.m. and the reception of the body and the Vigil Mass will follow at 7.30 p.m. The Requiem Mass: Thursday 11th April 12 noon at St John's Church, Standishgate, Wigan, before burial in Ireland. May he rest in peace.



Fr Barry was born in Wigan on 21st March 1960 and was ordained to the priesthood at St Mary's, Wigan, by Archbishop Derek Worlock on 6th December 1986. Following ordination, Fr Barry served as assistant priest in several parishes across the archdiocese: St Cuthbert, Pemberton; Sacred Heart and St Alban, Warrington; and briefly at St Mary, Chorley, in early 1995. In September 1995, he took up his first appointment as parish priest, moving to St Elizabeth, Litherland. Like many priests, he was asked to take on additional responsibility for another parish. Thus, in September 2011, he became parish priest of St Robert Bellarmine and he served as the Area Dean between 2006 and 2021. His strong faith sustained him as he faced treatment for cancer, and the eventual terminal diagnosis, with immense courage and patience. He died at Wigan and Leigh Hospice on Friday 22nd March, the day after his 64th birthday. He was in the 38th year of the priesthood. May he rest in peace.

Archbishop Malcolm McMahon Easter Message 2024

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we start going out, and coming home in the light again, it usually means one thing; Easter is around the corner. As we leave Winter and enter Spring, we are also reminded of the new life that starts at this time of year. Whether that be the plants in your garden, the leaves on trees, or the caterpillars and butterflies that start showing their faces again. This time of year is an incredibly important one in our faith. We remind ourselves that Jesus Christ died for our sins, descended into Hell, and rose from the dead. It is a reminder that there is always hope, even in the depths of despair. When Jesus was betrayed by Judas and ultimately crucified on Good Friday, it felt like hope was lost. But on the third day, Christ rose from the depths of Hell and things were looking light again.




