CAFOD's Sudan Crisis Appeal

CORPUS CHRISTI

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ will be celebrated on Sunday 2nd June. This is a day when we give thanks for Jesus in the most holy sacrament and for leaving us this very special gift.

Following the 10.30 am Mass, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will take place for the day, culminating in a Holy Hour at 5 pm. In order to do this we need people who are willing to spend at least 30 minutes in church. You will find a list at the back of the church for you to sign up and commit to spending a time of prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament.

SUNDAY THOUGHTS

Because God is Father, Son, and Spirit - three persons in one God - God is by nature relational. Also, each relationship among the three persons is unique. For instance, the relationship between Jesus and the Father is different from the relationship between Jesus and the Holy Spirit. When God created the world, God created humans in God's own image. This means that we are also relational beings, with a unique relationship to each other, as well as a unique relationship with God. We imitate God when we treat others with love and mercy, for God treats us with love and mercy. But more than that we imitate the relationship of the three persons of the Trinity.

Sad to say, in Ancient Rome, infants who were found abandoned were as likely to be "adopted" as slaves as adopted as children. So when Saint Paul writes to the Romans that they received a "Spirit of adoption," not a "spirit of slavery," he is distinguishing between two different ways in which children could be brought into a family. Indeed, he says those who have "adopted" Christianity, so to speak, can call God, "Abba, Father!" That is, they can use the words children would use to address their own fathers -their birth fathers or adoptive fathers. The bond between the Christians of Rome and God is a bond of love, like the bond between children and parents.

This too is our bond with God. We are bound to God with love, as we are with our own parents, or children, or spouse. These bonds of love suggest the bonds between Father, Son, and Spirit. When we were baptised in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, we were bound with all three persons in God. Called to live out that bond, we express it with the love that in turn binds us with others. Bonded with those we love and with those who love us, we form an ever-widening family, rooted in the bonds of the Trinity

CATHEDRAL RECRUITMENT

Young people are at the forefront of music at the Metropolitan Cathedral. The Cathedral Choir sings at seven choral services each week, leading the congregation in the singing of hymns and psalms, and offering repertoire from the treasury of sacred music to enhance the liturgical celebrations and raise the hearts and minds of those present to God. It is through their ministry of music that many people who enter the cathedral come to know the beauty of God. The Metropolitan Cathedral is the only Roman Catholic cathedral in the UK that offers both boys and girls an equal opportunity to undertake a full choir school chorister experience – at no cost to parents. Children are recruited from Liverpool and surrounding areas, with choristers coming from as far afield as Widnes, Southport and St Helens. Opportunities to sing are offered to young people from age 7 to 18 and beyond.

Being a chorister is a unique opportunity for a boy or girl in our Archdiocese, allowing them to engage with music, to live the Catholic faith in the daily celebration of the liturgy, and bring joy and hope to many. The high musical standards that the choir achieves on a daily basis do not happen without sacrifice: many hours are spent in rehearsal, with liturgies taking place almost every day. But for those who are fortunate enough to have the experience of being a chorister, it is a life-shaping one.

Do you know a child who would like to be a chorister at the Metropolitan Cathedral of Christ the King here in Liverpool? The search is now on for our next generation of boy and girl choristers.

All choristers are educated at Runnymede St Edward's Catholic Primary School and St Edward's College meaning that a first-class Catholic chorister education for boys and girls in Liverpool is available at no cost. FEAST OF THE WEEK

Pope St Paul VI (1897-1978)

Giovanni Battista Montini was born on 26 September 1897 in the village of Concesio, Lombardy. He was ordained priest on 29 May 1920 and worked in the Roman Curia, the Vatican civil service, until he was made Archbishop of Milan



in 1954. He was elected Pope on 21 June 1963, successfully saw the Vatican Council through to its completion, promoted the renewal of the Church's life and especially of the liturgy. He also promoted ecumenical dialogue and the proclamation of the Gospel to the modern world. He died on 6 August 1978. He was canonised by Pope Francis in 2018. His feast day is celebrated on Wednesday.

When the Holy Spirit chose him as the Successor of Saint Peter, someone already taken by the figure and apostolic activity of Saint Paul, he did not spare his energies in the service of the Gospel of Christ, of the Church and of humanity, seen in the light of the divine plan of salvation. As his teachings show he was a defender of human life, peace and true human progress. He wanted the Church, inspired by the Council and implementing its normative principles, to rediscover ever more her identity, overcoming the divisions of the past and by being ever more attentive to the new age. He wanted the Church of Christ to place the centrality of God and the preaching of the Gospel in the first place, even when she spends herself in the service of the brothers and sisters, in order to build that "civilisation of love" begun by the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

In his last will and testament, Paul VI wrote: "No monument for me". The true monument to Saint Paul VI is the one built by his witness, his works, his apostolic journeys, his ecumenism, in the Liturgical renewal and his many teachings and examples by which he showed forth the face of Christ, the mission of the Church, the vocation of contemporary humanity and reconciling Christian thought with the requirements of the difficult moment in which he, with much suffering, had to guide the Church.

THE NEW LECTIONARY

The Lectionary, which is the book that contains the Scripture readings for Mass and the Sacraments, is changing as part of the continuing process of revising liturgical translations. The process began with the Roman Missal in 2011 and has continued with all the other liturgical texts.



For over 50 years, the Church in England & Wales has been using the Jerusalem Bible as its definitive translation for liturgical use; the new Lectionary will use both the English Standard Version - Catholic Edition (ECV-CE) and the Abbey Psalter for the psalms.

The changes are intended to make the biblical translations more faithful to the original languages, to reflect current biblical scholarship, and to provide a text for use in a liturgical setting that is more easily proclaimed.

The Lectionary will become mandatory for use in all Catholic parishes and Mass centres in England, Wales and Scotland from Sunday 1st December 2024.

The CTS have been appointed to publish the new Lectionary and they have now released further information and cost.



Currently, the Lectionary is in 3 volumes, but the new Lectionary will be in 4 volumes at a cost of £695 (£173.75 each) and Fr Mark is grateful for the offers of sponsorship. Three of the volumes have been taken with just one more volume left for a chance to be sponsored. The CTS will

provide a special 'Donor Bookplate' in which the donor's name will be placed in the Lectionary and will be there for future years to come. If you would like to do this, please have a word with Fr Mark for more details.

Fr Mark has ordered some leaflets to explain the new Lectionary and why the translation is changing and these will be available in a few weeks time.
