

CORPUS CHRISTI

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ will be celebrated on Sunday 2nd June. This is a day when we give thanks for Jesus in the most holy sacrament and for leaving us this very special gift.

Following the 10.30 am Mass, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will take place for the day, culminating in a Holy Hour at 5 pm. In order to do this we need people who are willing to spend at least 30 minutes in church. You will find a list at the back of the church for you to sign up and commit to spending a time of prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament.

Please make every effort to make this a special day. Come to church and come along to the time of prayer at 5 pm.

SUNDAY THOUGHTS

We miss this in the selection from Acts that we hear today, but Cornelius is a Roman centurion, employed to exercise the authority of the Roman occupiers over that part of Judea. Most Judeans- whether Jewish or Christian- would avoid him. But Cornelius is no ordinary Roman centurion, as we see in the way he falls on his knees when Peter enters his home. After this display of humility, Peter tells him, "You know that it is unlawful for a Jewish man to associate with, or visit, a Gentile, but God has shown me that I should not call any person profane or unclean". How many of us are willing to say the same about someone on the opposite side, say, of our culture wars or political wars?

"God," Peter points out, "has no favourites" (Acts 10:34). Indeed, while Peter preached about God and Jesus, the Holy Spirit came down upon Cornelius and all the other Gentiles, prompting Peter to see to it that these outsiders were baptised. Remember, Peter was one of those personally told by Jesus, "This is my commandment: love one another as I have loved you". Today we hear him put it into action. May it challenge us to show God's love to one another as well.

Love makes us feel all warm and fuzzy inside, right? But, Jesus tells us, the ultimate show of love is "to lay down one's life for one's friends". That brings us up short. Love is over-the-moon wonderful until you start talking about its cost. Love can cause you to put someone else's life before your own. Love can leave you vulnerable. Love can lead to heartbreak and grief. But this is what Jesus himself did, and what he calls us to do. Self-sacrificing love is the countercultural and, to many, absurd idea of putting others before yourself, for, as John wrote in his letter, God is love, and this, from the start of creation, is what God has done.

CATHEDRAL RECRUITMENT

Young people are at the forefront of music at the Metropolitan Cathedral. The Cathedral Choir sings at seven choral services each week, leading the congregation in the singing of hymns and psalms, and offering repertoire from the treasury of sacred music to enhance the liturgical celebrations and raise the hearts and minds of those present to God. It is through their ministry of music that many people who enter the cathedral come to know the beauty of God. The Metropolitan Cathedral is the only Roman Catholic cathedral in the UK that offers both boys and girls an equal opportunity to undertake a full choir school chorister experience – at no cost to parents. Children are recruited from Liverpool and surrounding areas, with choristers coming from as far afield as Widnes, Southport and St Helens. Opportunities to sing are offered to young people from age 7 to 18 and beyond.

Being a chorister is a unique opportunity for a boy or girl in our Archdiocese, allowing them to engage with music, to live the Catholic faith in the daily celebration of the liturgy, and bring joy and hope to many. The high musical standards that the choir achieves on a daily basis do not happen without sacrifice: many hours are spent in rehearsal, with liturgies taking place almost every day. But for those who are fortunate enough to have the experience of being a chorister, it is a life- shaping one.

Do you know a child who would like to be a chorister at the Metropolitan Cathedral of Christ the King here in Liverpool? The search is now on for our next generation of boy and girl choristers.

All choristers are educated at Runnymede St Edward's Catholic Primary School and St Edward's College meaning that a first-class Catholic chorister education for boys and girls in Liverpool is available at no cost. If you know of a Catholic family who might be interested in this wonderful opportunity, please share this information with them. FEAST OF THE WEEK The English Martyrs

On 4 May 1535, at Tyburn in London, there died three Carthusian monks, the first of many martyrs of the English Reformation. Of these martyrs,



forty-two have been canonised, and a further 242 have been declared Blessed; but the true number of those who died on the scaffold, perished in prison, or were tortured or persecuted for their faith cannot now be reckoned. The persecution lasted a hundred and fifty years and left a permanent mark on English culture: to this day Catholics continue to suffer certain minor disabilities under English law.

The martyrs celebrated today came from every walk of life. There were rich and poor; married and single; men and women. They are remembered for the example they gave of constancy in their faith and courage in the face of persecution.

From 2001, there are also celebrated on this day the forty martyrs of England and Wales who were canonised on 25 October 1970 and formerly celebrated on that day. They include Saints Cuthbert Mayne, John Houghton, Edmund Campion, and Richard Gwynn, as well as Saints John Roberts and Ambrose Barlow from the Benedictine monastery of St Gregory at Douay (now at Downside Abbey in Somerset).

WORLD COMMUNICATION DAY 2024

This annual day of prayer takes place next Sunday, 12 May. The theme for this year, chosen by Pope Francis, is 'Artificial Intelligence and the Wisdom of the Heart: Towards a Fully Human Communication'. In his letter reflecting on this year's theme, Pope Francis says: "Artificial Intelligence is radically affecting the world of information and communication, and through it, certain foundations of life in society". A retiring collection will be taken to support the work of Catholic communication.

O God, whose word is truth and in whose light we see light, guide those who tell the story of our times through word and image. Make them seekers after truth and advocates of human dignity.

Grant discernment to all who rely on their labours, and, as we confront the pain and promise of this world, awaken in us a sense of wonder at your presence and of longing for your peace. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. Amen.

90 YEAR ANNIVERSARY

The Foundation Stone for our beautiful church was laid on 29th April 1934 by the then Archbishop of Liverpool, Richard Downey. It was the first stone laid in honour of The Holy English Martyrs.Parishioners were



very enthusiastic and offered to pay for all the interior fittings at a cost of £950! The Church itself cost £8000 and opened on the Feast of The Annunciation on 25th March 1935. Litherland History Society have kindly provided us with a commemorative display to celebrate the anniversary. You can see it at the back of Church - take a minute to have a look.
