HOLY YEAR PILGRIMAGE - 8-15 September 2025

SUNDAY THOUGHTS

Jesus quotes Isaiah when responding to the Pharisees and scribes: 'This people honours me only with lip-service, while their hearts are far from me' (Mark 7:6). How do we honour the Lord with our hearts rather than our lips? For Moses, it was by obedience. Obedience to God's commandments, whole and entire, is what he demanded from the people. Living in accord with God's commands was possible when one took God's word to heart. It would then in turn inspire nonbelievers because they would recognise the wisdom and intelligence behind these laws after seeing the justice and well-being of the Chosen People.

Jesus paints a vivid picture of hypocrisy by quoting Isaiah's contrast between lips and hearts, between giving lip service and being moved in our hearts to do something. It is not that what we say is unimportant, but it is not nearly as important as our impulses and motivations within our hearts. Jesus lists all sorts of detestable impulses that can come from within our hearts, qualities and behaviour that defile our purity much more seriously than failing to purify our hands or our belongings. If your outward cleanliness does not reflect your inner attitude, it has lost its meaning.

How do we show our gratitude to someone who's given us something wonderful? We may give them something in return or we can share it with someone else. James tells us that every perfect gift comes from God and in fact God has planted the word of truth in each of us. What should we do with that word of God in us? James is clear: 'you must do what the word tells you, and not just listen to it and deceive yourselves' (James 1:22). To thank God for giving us the word, we share it, we put it into action.

This week we welcome back staff and children of our two schools. Hopefully well rested and ready for a new year.

St George's Maghull are arranging some sessions for anyone interested in becoming Catholic. They have arranged a short series of preparation sessions on the first four Sundays of September. ADOREMUS 2024 - Updated details

The 2024 National Eucharistic Congress takes place at St Mary's College, Oscott on Saturday 14 September 2024. There is still time to book for those who would like to go. A coach will depart from St Margaret Clitherow Centre, Croxteth Drive, at 8.00am in time for a 10.15 arrival at Oscott with events beginning at 11.00am. The last event finishes at 6.00pm and we are aiming to return to the Margaret Clitherow Centre by 8.00pm. Cars can be left in the St Margaret Clitherow Centre's secure car park for the duration of the day. The cost per person is £20. To book a place: www.liverpoolcatholic.org.uk/events

Following the national Adoremus gathering, the Archbishop has decided that we will have a similar event within the archdiocese. This will take place at the Metropolitan Cathedral and at the Co-Cathedral of Saint Mary of the Isle on 21 September 2024. The event itself is free and available to all. There will be Eucharistic Adoration throughout the day from 10am until 5pm, Holy Mass, opportunities for confession, a variety of workshops and a shared time of prayer during the day for all.

The workshops provide an opportunity for developing our own spirituality, and to discern what the Jubilee year might mean for us in our own lives. Timetable of the day is:

- 9am Holy Mass and Exposition
- 10.15 Workshop 1 Care for Creation: Discovering God's beauty through praying for the Earth
- 11.15 Workshop 2 Listening to the still small voice: How do we pay attention to the God who is never not speaking to us
- 12.15 Workshop 3 Discerning, Choosing, Deciding Input on Ignatian discernment and decision making
- 13.15 Workshop 4 Praying with Carlo Acutis
- 14.00 Holy Hour, Eucharistic Procession and Benediction
- 15.15– Workshop 5 Young Adult Lection Divina: aimed at 18-35 year olds 17.00 Mass & Children's Liturgy (5-11 year olds)
