

SUNDAY THOUGHTS

For all our differences, we humans have one thing in common; we all think we are right. We all think we have the answer and we base all of our values and decisions on it. The clashes and conflicts that result from the strength of our convictions can tear families and communities apart. Today's readings extol the virtue of wisdom. The attentiveness and awareness of the hostess Wisdom in the first reading is presented to us as a model. She does not shun those whom she does not consider to be her intellectual or spiritual equal, she invites them, but, crucially does not force them, to dialogue with her.

In the Gospel, Jesus does not become affronted when his listeners question his teaching. Instead he sought to explain it to them without demanding that they come over to his side of the fence. In our desire to be right and in our noble efforts to do



right, we may find ourselves trampling on others as the attempt to do the same. The depth of our faith in particular can motivate us to share it with others. It is natural to want to impart to the world the belief that gives us joy and purpose. However, we must be mindful that we invite, not demand; that we are not affronted, but patient enough to explain.

The popular phrase 'You can't put an old head on young shoulders' is particularly apt in matters of faith, because in matters of faith we are all



young. We are little children finding our way, discovering as we go, as puzzled as ever by the Christ who gives us his flesh and blood as food and drink, yet equally in awe and inspired to walk with him. There are others on this path. They are ahead of us, behind us, walking in the opposite direction, dawdling along the side. Wisdom

teaches us that we can't all keep the same pace , but we can encourage and support our fellows.

St George's Maghull are arranging some sessions for anyone interested in becoming Catholic. They have arranged a short series of preparation sessions on the first four Sundays of September. ADOREMUS 2024 - Updated details

The 2024 National Eucharistic Congress takes place at St Mary's College, Oscott on Saturday 14 September 2024. There is still time to book for those who would like to go. A coach will depart from St Margaret Clitherow Centre, Croxteth Drive, at 8.00am in time for a 10.15 arrival at Oscott with events beginning at 11.00am. The last event finishes at 6.00pm and we are aiming to return to the Margaret Clitherow Centre by 8.00pm. Following the national Adoremus gathering, the Archbishop has decided that we will have a similar event within the archdiocese. This will take place at the Metropolitan Cathedral and at the Co-Cathedral of Saint Mary of the Isle on 21 September 2024. The event itself is free and available to all. There will be Eucharistic Adoration throughout the day from 10am until 5pm, Holy Mass, opportunities for confession, a variety of workshops and a shared time of prayer during the day for all.

The workshops provide an opportunity for developing our own spirituality, and to discern what the Jubilee year might mean for us in our own lives. Timetable of the day is:

9am – Holy Mass and Exposition

10.15 – Workshop 1 - Care for Creation: Discovering God's beauty through praying for the Earth

11.15 – Workshop 2 - Listening to the still small voice: How do we pay attention to the God who is never not speaking to us

12.15 – Workshop 3 - Discerning, Choosing, Deciding - Input on Ignatian discernment and decision making

13.15 - Workshop 4 - Praying with Carlo Acutis

14.00 Holy Hour, Eucharistic Procession and Benediction

15.15– Workshop 5 - Young Adult Lection Divina: aimed at 18-35 year olds 17.00 Mass & Children's Liturgy (5-11 year olds)

Tea and coffee will be available in the Gibberd Room for those attending the event but food will not be available so you are welcome to bring a packed lunch.
