#### SUNDAY THOUGHTS

It is not difficult these days to imagine the nation of Israel being threatened from every side. So it was during Jeremiah's time as well. His prophetic messages were alternatively decried or ignored. Eventually the nation was defeated and most of the Jewish people were sent into exile. This is the background behind Jeremiah's incredibly hopeful and consoling oracle we hear today. The LORD will bring back the exiles - the strong and the weak, the young and the old, the blind and the lame - gathering them from near and far, consoling them and guiding them as a parent would a child. As Christians, this reminds us of our journey to the cross, Jesus gathering us all, consoling us and guiding us - as he did Bartimaeus - with the promise of eternal life.

Bartimaeus did not know it at the time, but when he decided to follow Jesus, our Lord was approaching the most difficult part of his journey. Jericho was only about twenty miles from Jerusalem. The verse that immediately follows today's Gospel says that Jesus sent two disciples into Jerusalem to get the beast of burden that would bear Jesus into the holy city. Bartimaeus may have been one of those two! Scripture scholars point out that the fact that his name is given by Mark in this Gospel suggests he became a prominent disciple. His faith is clearly apparent, as he calls Jesus by a messianic title -"Son of David" - and is the only person in Mark to address him as "Master." Though blind, he was able to see Jesus as the Messiah and was willing to throw aside his old life (symbolised by his cloak, where he held the coins he collected) and follow him without knowing where he was leading him.

Bartimaeus's request, "Master, I want to see," can be ours today (Mark 10:51). We may not be physically blind, but we may fail to see the answers to the big questions of life. Jesus offers us the chance to see what may elude us. This can be what we ask for now. We want to see what is truly important in life. We want to see what we are called to do and to be. We want to see the path that Jesus calls us to follow. Note that Bartimaeus immediately followed Jesus on the way; he just wanted to see the way. Like him, we want to see the way.

### FEAST OF THE WEEK The Blessed Martyrs of Douai College

The English College at Douai in Northern France was founded in 1568 to educate English Catholics, and in particular to act as a seminary training priests to enter England covertly, minister to English Catholics, and attempt the re-conversion of England to the faith.

Simply being a Catholic priest was high treason in England at this time, with the penalty of hanging, drawing and quartering, and almost 160 of the priests from Douai were thus executed between 1577 and 1680. Each time the news of another execution reached the College, a solemn Mass of thanksgiving was sung. Many of our English Martyrs trained at Douai.

The College was closed around the time of the French Revolution and the community came back to the Uk and settled in Ware, Hertfordshire, and Crook Hall, County Durham. Those who moved to Crook were to eventually move to Ushaw, County Durham, where Fr Mark and countless others trained for the priesthood.

# WHEN YOU PRAY -A clear path to a deeper relationship with God.

Do you ever hear people talk about prayer but feel like you can't relate?

You know prayer is important, but you still find it challenging. Perhaps it's hard to find time to pray, or you're unsure what to do when you do pray. Or maybe you feel restless and distracted and don't feel close to God.

You might struggle to trust God and surrender to his will. Or maybe you feel discouraged by your many weaknesses and your inability to overcome them. Ultimately, you worry that what you're doing in prayer isn't "working," because you aren't seeing major changes in your life.

If you have any of these feelings, you are not alone. Many of the saints had similar ones. Even the saints struggled in prayer, had complicated problems, and made mistakes. They were like us. But each time they fell, they got up again and learned to rely more on God's grace. And eventually they were changed.

What God did in countless saints, he wants to do in ordinary people like us.

During this Year of Prayer in preparation for the Jubilee Year 2025, Fr Mark will lead this seven-week course on prayer, starting on **Monday, November 4** at 7:00 p.m. in the parish hall. Please sign up at the parish office.

Inspired by the real example of the saints, we will learn how to pray with the same consistency, trust, peace, and passion that led to deep transformation in their souls. When You Pray: A Clear Path to a Deeper Relationship with God will help you begin your journey of prayer, rejuvenate your prayer life, and strengthen your relationship with God so that you can give God your entire heart.

Our two Christmas raffles are also very popular (especially the drinks hamper!) so get your raffle tickets from next week.



# **OPPOSE ASSISTED SUICIDE**

In early September 2024, when parliament returned and a Bill on assisted suicide – so-called assisted dying – started its passage through the House of Lords, our Lead Bishop for Life Issues, Bishop John Sherrington, called for Catholics to unite in prayer and compassionate action. That call is renewed now as last Wednesday, 16 October, the House of Commons heard the first reading of a new bill on assisted suicide tabled by Labour MP Kim Leadbeater. This is another attempt to legalise assisted suicide and we need you to contact your MP to voice your opposition.

#### Act Now! Contact Peter Dowd MP

The charity Right to Life UK has a simple online mechanism to do this. It takes little more than a few minutes to input your postcode, make sure the suggested text suits your viewpoint and submit your message to ask your MP to stop assisted suicide being rushed into law. www.righttolife.org.uk

#### Pray

We are a praying Christian community and, as Bishop Sherrington says, the legalisation of assisted suicide undermines the sanctity and dignity of human life. "The Catholic Church accompanies those suffering and nearing the end of their lives with hope and affection, but also reminds them that their life is precious until the very last breath," he says. "In preparation for these challenging debates, let us offer our prayers for those facing the end of their lives, that they may receive the care and support they need to live their final days with respect for their dignity.

"Let us also pray for our politicians and our country that wisdom and compassion may guide their decisions. I also urge all Catholics to become better informed about the serious problems associated with the legalisation of assisted suicide.

Cardinal Nichols wrote an excellent Pastoral Letter last weekend and Fr Mark has made copies, which can be found at the back of the church. The letter is short but important and you are encouraged to take a copy, read it and pass it on. It is also on the Parish website
