

When am I like the widow, giving when it hurts? When am I like the scribe, taking advantage of others' generosity and rationalising it? When do I fail to recognise the generosity of God in my life?

SUNDAY THOUGHTS

Two years before Elijah met the widow of Zarephath, he made his first prophecy. Speaking in the LORD's name, he told the king, Ahab, that God would send a drought upon the land as a punishment for Israel's sins. The ensuing story reminds its listeners that not even Elijah was spared; had he not journeyed to Zarephath he himself would have died of thirst. God's providence and generosity in sending life-giving rain at long last are matched only by the widow's. It ends up that both she and Elijah are fortunate that they encountered each other on that day. Her generosity, and God's, allow her, her son, and Elijah to live through the final year of the drought.

The opening paragraph of the Gospel contains a damning indictment of the hypocritical scribes of Jesus' time who "swallow the property of widows" (Mark 12:40). They collected the temple tax from the treasury and used it to fatten their own wallets. Under the pretext of their public exhortations of the prayers they needed to recite, they took the last remaining coins from widows and others who lived on the edge of poverty. As wonderful as the lesson Jesus teaches his disciples about the value of the widow's self-sacrificial generosity, let us not ignore the other lesson he teaches. The greed of the scribes in this case is unjust, selfish, and potentially devastating to its victims.

In the poor widow who gives her last two coins, we have a model of the self- sacrifice Jesus teaches us to embrace. She gave her livelihood; he goes on to sacrifice his life. The analogy is even sharper in the first reading, as the widow in Zarephath sacrifices not only her final meal but also her son's. Centuries later, God sent the Son to be born into this world, where he would sacrifice himself on the cross for our sins. Through Elijah, God was miraculously able to save the widow's family from death. Through Jesus, God was miraculously able to raise the human family to new life.

FEAST OF THE WEEK St Edmund of Abingdon (1175-1240)

St Edmund Rich was born at St Edmund's Lane, Abingdon, in 1175. His father was a rich merchant, hence the surname (which he never in fact used himself).

He studied at Oxford and Paris, and became a teacher in about 1200. For six years he lectured on



mathematics and dialectics, apparently dividing his time between Oxford and Paris. He is the first known Oxford Master of Arts, and the place where he taught was eventually renamed St Edmund Hall.

Between 1205 and 1210, he changed direction, studying theology and being ordained a priest. He took a doctorate in divinity and soon won fame as a theological lecturer and extemporaneous preacher. Around 1219, he was appointed vicar of the parish of Calne in Wiltshire and Treasurer of Salisbury Cathedral. He finally became Archbishop of Canterbury in 1233. He was a notable and effective reforming Bishop. His love for discipline and justice aroused opposition, and he found himself ranged against Rome as champion of the national Church. Eventually, like his predecessors St Thomas Becket and Stephen Langton, he retired to Pontigny, where he is buried. He died at Soisy-Bouy on 16 November 1240. He is venerated as a vigorous and reforming bishop and as a peacemaker, as well as being a distinguished commentator on the Scriptures and an effective spiritual writer.

OPPOSE ASSISTED SUICIDE

In early September 2024, when parliament returned and a Bill on assisted suicide – so-called assisted dying – started its passage through the House of Lords, our Lead Bishop for Life Issues, Bishop John Sherrington, called for Catholics to unite in prayer and compassionate action.

Pray

We are a praying Christian community and, as Bishop Sherrington says, the legalisation of assisted suicide undermines the sanctity and dignity of human life. "The Catholic Church accompanies those suffering and nearing the end of their lives with hope and affection, but also reminds them that their life is precious until the very last breath," he says. "In preparation for these challenging debates, let us offer our prayers for those facing the end of their lives, that they may receive the care and support they need to live their final days with respect for their dignity.

"Let us also pray for our politicians and our country that wisdom and compassion may guide their decisions. I also urge all Catholics to become better informed about the serious problems associated with the legalisation of assisted suicide.

Cardinal Nichols wrote an excellent Pastoral Letter and Fr Mark has made copies, which can be found at the back of the church. It is also on the Parish website

Cardinal Nicholls has also called for Catholics in England and Wales to join him, and the Bishops of our countries, to pause for an hour at 5:30pm on Wednesday, 13 November to pray for the dignity of human life.

On that day, the Bishops will pause for an hour in the middle of their autumn plenary meeting to kneel in front of the Blessed Sacrament for a holy hour in light of the bill passing through the UK parliament that seeks to legalise assisted suicide.
