## JUBILEE PILGRIMAGE - 8-15 September 2025

Places are still available for the Holy Year pilgrimage to Rome, San Giovanni & Assisi, Monday 8 September - Monday 15 September 2025. Fr Mark and the Pilgrimage Company have now finalised the last remaining details of the flights:

Monday 8 September 10:15 am depart Manchester on Ryanair 13:55 pm arrive Rome

Monday 15 September 21:30 pm depart Rome on Ryanair 23:30 pm arrive Manchester

The timing of the flights is excellent, as it gives us more time in Rome on our arrival day and a full day before we depart for home. The cost of the flight is between £310 £340, depending on the time of booking. Ryanair will not accept a group booking, so the Pilgrimage Company must book each seat individually, which they have started to do.

If anyone one is interested in booking, you need to take a booking form from the parish office as soon a possible, complete it and bring it back to guarantee the current cost of the flight.





#### **SUNDAY THOUGHTS**

Scripture scholars tell us that the Gospel of Luke was written fifty years or so after Jesus's death and resurrection. So Luke was not there with parchment and ink when John the Baptist traveled throughout the Jordan calling for a baptism of repentance. But he knew what a pivotal moment that was. So he begins his account by mentioning people like Lysanias and places like Trachonitis, names found nowhere else in the Bible. Why? He is setting the scene in exhaustive detail because of the dramatic difference between 'before' and 'after.' Just as our country memorializes 1066 or parents recall the year in which they had their first child, there is a life-changing difference between what came before and what came after. Just so for this proclamation of John's. The transformation Baruch prophesied about Jerusalem was now taking place. Luke paints a picture of exactly how the world had been before everything changed.

That said, each reading ultimately directs our focus onto the future. Baruch looks forward to the time when Jerusalem will be restored in glory. In Luke, John the Baptist calls everyone to prepare for Jesus' coming, when salvation will come to all people. Paul looks ahead to the day of Christ Jesus, the time of the Second Coming (Philippians 1:6). As Christians, we are called to anticipate the completion of the good work that has begun in us.

How are valleys filled in, mountains made low, paths made straight, and rough ways smoothed? Repentance. It is sin that throws up obstacles on our paths to salvation. Like a falling out between friends prevents that friendship from growing, our past sins prevent our love of God and love of neighbour from developing. Repentance allows us to put aside the past and focus on the future.

## FEAST OF THE WEEK

## The Immaculate Conception

The doctrine of the Immaculate Conception is the doctrine that the Virgin Mary was conceived without original sin, that twist in our nature that makes our will tend not to follow what it knows to be right. It was this grace that enabled Mary to give a true and considered "Yes" to the request,



conveyed by the Angel Gabriel, that she should consent to be the mother of the incarnate God.

Because it is so old, this is one of the Marian doctrines that Islam shares with the Catholic Church, though of course the theological details are very different. 'in a famous Hadith attributed to the Prophet, it is affirmed that: "Every child is touched by the devil as soon as he is born and this contact makes him cry. Excepted are Mary and her Son". From this Hadith and from verses 35-37 of Sura III, Moslem commentators have deduced and affirmed the principle of Mary's original purity.'

The doctrine of the Immaculate Conception was almost universally believed over the centuries but was only formally defined as a doctrine of the Church by Pope Pius IX in 1854.

#### **OUR NEW PARISH PATRON SAINT**

Fr Mark announced last Sunday that Archbishop Malcolm has approved the name of the new parish patron saint, St Josephine Bakhita. The name of the new parish took effect at midnight Sunday. The change of name does not affect the name of the churches within the Parish

St. Josephine Bakhita (1869–1947) was born in Sudan and kidnapped into slavery as a child, enduring years of cruelty. Eventually sold to an Italian family, she was brought to Italy, where she encountered Christianity and found freedom when






Italian courts ruled slavery illegal. Choosing a life of faith, she joined the Canossian Daughters of Charity and became a nun, known for her kindness, humility, and forgiveness. Despite her suffering, she embraced her past as part of God's plan and inspired many with her story of resilience. Canonised in 2000, she is a symbol of hope and the patron saint of Sudan.

The life of St. Josephine conveys a powerful message of hope, forgiveness, and the transformative power of faith. Despite enduring the horrors of slavery, dehumanisation, and immense suffering, she chose not to be defined by her pain but by her trust in God. Her journey from enslavement to sainthood demonstrates the dignity and worth of every human being, regardless of circumstances.

Josephine's ability to forgive her captors and embrace her painful past as part of God's plan for her life is a profound testament to the healing power of grace. Her story encourages resilience in the face of adversity and reminds us of the importance of compassion and freedom for all people.

As a saint, Josephine stands as a beacon of hope for those who feel trapped





She holds significance for Liverpool and for our parish, which is close to the port, particularly as a symbol of hope and action in the fight against human trafficking and modern slavery. Liverpool, with its history as a port city tied to the transatlantic slave trade, has embraced her story as a way

to confront its past and advocate for justice in the present.
