### ***“Witnesses in a Wounded World”***

*In this Sunday’s Gospel, Jesus prays for unity: “May they all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you.” It’s a tender, intimate moment—Jesus knows the cross is near, yet He turns His heart outward, praying for those who would follow Him. He prays for us.*

*This week, the world was shaken again by violence—this time, close to home. The car attack in Liverpool has left the city in shock and a nation once more reminded of how fragile life is, and how deep the wounds of hatred and division still run.*

*In such moments, Jesus’ prayer for unity doesn’t feel abstract—it becomes urgent. The call to be “one” is not a poetic sentiment, but a challenge to become real witnesses of love in a fractured world.*

*The early Church, as seen in the Acts of the Apostles, faced persecution, violence, and fear, yet they responded not with revenge but with boldness in love. As disciples today, we are called to do the same. Not to turn away in despair, nor to lash out in anger, but to stand firm in compassion, in prayer, and in unity.*

*Let us pray this week for the victims of the Liverpool attack, for their families, for those affected by the events, and for all who are tempted by hatred. May our witness, as individuals and as a Church, be a healing balm. Let us not become numb or cynical, but bear one another’s burdens in love.*

*As we wait for Pentecost next week, may the Holy Spirit breathe peace into our troubled world, and may we become ever more one in heart, in purpose, and in Christ.*

## Walking the Synodal Path Together

The Synod on Synodality concluded last October echoing Pope Francis' words that synodality 'is the path that God expects from the Church of the third millennium.' The Final Synod Document lays out an expectation of how we walk this path at every level within the life of the Church.

We have some experience of beginning to walk this synodal path in recent years in our archdiocese. We were able to respond very directly to one of the calls in the Final Document with the process of consultation that led to the appointment of our new archbishop, who we look forward to welcoming in just over a week. The outcome of that consultation was sent to the then Cardinal Robert Prevost, now Pope Leo XIV, who responded personally with thanks for the work that had been done. Pope Leo's first remarks on the balcony of St Peter's have already affirmed his own commitment to this continuing journey.

The School for Synodality is a project working across the dioceses of England and Wales, and further afield, to support the lived experience of synodality in the life of the Church. The Archdiocese has been working with the School in developing programmes and resources to support this work, see: <https://www.schoolforsynodality.org.uk/>

To help unpack the Final Synod Document the School has brought together several speakers who were all participants in the Synod on Synodality for a webinar series which started Wednesday (21st May). Over 6 weeks Dr Jos Moons SJ, Professor Anna Rowlands, Dr Estela Padilla, Professor Cathy Clifford, Fr David McCallum SJ, Sandra Chaoul and Archbishop Jason Gordon, Archbishop of Port of Spain, will take us through a section of the document with time for questions afterwards.

## FEAST OF THE WEEK

### St. Boniface (675?-754)

For the first forty years of his life Boniface was known as Wynfrith. He was born in Devon and educated at the monastery at Exeter, and then joined the Benedictine abbey at Nursling, near Southampton. He was a teacher and preacher, but he desired to preach the gospel in a foreign land. In 718, Pope Gregory 11 commissioned him to do so, at the same time changing his name from Wynfrith to Boniface.

Boniface left England, never to return, and took the gospel to the heathen tribes of Germany, where he had great success.

He himself was created Bishop of Mainz, and he founded or restored dioceses in Bavaria, Thuringia, and Franconia. In his later years he worked with King Pepin the Short to reform the Frankish church, and then, over seventy years old, set out to evangelize Friesland (part of modern Holland) where he was set upon and murdered, on 5 June 754.

He is buried at Fulda, near Frankfurt, in the monastery he founded himself, and is honoured as the apostle of Germany. His feast day is celebrated on Thursday.

## WELCOME ARCHBISHOP JOHN

The Most Reverend John Sherrington has been installed as the tenth Archbishop of Liverpool during a Mass at the Metropolitan Cathedral of Christ the King.

It was announced in April, just a few weeks before his death, that Pope Francis had elected Archbishop Sherrington as the successor of Archbishop Malcolm McMahon OP who is retiring after 11 years as Archbishop.

Thousands of Catholics of all ages from across the archdiocese gathered at the cathedral for the celebration which included Apostolic Nuncio to Great Britain, Archbishop Miguel Maury Buendía, Cardinal Vincent Nichols, bishops and clergy from across England and Wales and civic leaders and representatives from other faiths.

Archbishop Sherrington said: "The Mass of Installation was a joyous occasion; it was wonderful to see so many people from across the diocese and beyond gather together in prayer as we continue to preach Christ to the people of our time.

"I give thanks to Archbishop Malcolm who has served the archdiocese with love and generosity, and I am honoured to succeed him.

"I look forward to serving as a shepherd to this historic and faith-filled archdiocese and to bring the hope and joy of Christ to all people."

## **WORLD COMMUNICATIONS DAY 2025**

The theme of this year's World Communications Day is: **'Share with gentleness the hope that is in your hearts.'**

In his last message to the Church before he died, Pope Francis said: "In these our times, characterised by disinformation and polarisation, as a few centres of power control an unprecedented mass of data and information, I would like to speak to you as one who is well aware of the importance – now more than ever – of your work as journalists and communicators. Your courageous efforts to put personal and collective responsibility towards others at the heart of communication are indeed necessary..."

Too often today, communication generates not hope, but fear and despair, prejudice and resentment, fanaticism and even hatred. All too often it simplifies reality in order to provoke instinctive reactions; it uses words like a razor; it even uses false or artfully distorted information to send messages designed to agitate, provoke or hurt. On several occasions, I have spoken of our need to "disarm" communication and to purify it of aggressiveness. It never helps to reduce reality to slogans. All of us see how – from television talk shows to verbal attacks on social media – there is a risk that the paradigm of competition, opposition, the will to dominate and possess, and the manipulation of public opinion will prevail...

Be witnesses and promoters of a non-aggressive communication; help to spread a culture of care, build bridges and break down the visible and invisible barriers of the present time. Tell stories steeped in hope, be concerned about our common destiny and strive to write together the history of our future. All this you can do, and we can do, with God's grace, which the Jubilee helps us to receive in abundance. This is my prayer, and with it, I bless each of you and your work".
