



### Living Love Together: The Most Holy Trinity

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It's one of the deepest mysteries of our Catholic faith: three Persons in one God. That might sound confusing, and that's okay! The Trinity isn't something we fully figure out—it's something we believe, experience, and try to live.

At the heart of the Trinity is love. The Father loves the Son, the Son loves the Father, and the Holy Spirit is the love that flows between them. God is not a distant being, but a living relationship. And since we are made in God's image, we are made for relationship too—for loving God and loving one another.

In our parish, we can live out the Trinity by growing in unity, community, and service. When we welcome others, support those in need, pray together, and share our gifts, we reflect the love of the Trinity. Every time we come together for Mass, a meeting, or a simple coffee after Mass, we have the chance to live as one body, many parts, united in love.

The world often encourages us to be self-focused or divided. But the Trinity shows us a better way: to be united in love, just as God is.

As we celebrate this beautiful feast, let us thank God for His love and ask for the grace to reflect that love in our parish life—so our community becomes a living image of the Holy Trinity.

### Walking the Synodal Path Together

The Synod on Synodality concluded last October echoing Pope Francis' words that synodality 'is the path that God expects from the Church of the third millennium.' The Final Synod Document lays out an expectation of how we walk this path at every level within the life of the Church.

We have some experience of beginning to walk this synodal path in recent years in our archdiocese. We were able to respond very directly to one of the calls in the Final Document with the process of consultation that led to the appointment of our new archbishop, who we look forward to welcoming in just over a week. The outcome of that consultation was sent to the then Cardinal Robert Prevost, now Pope Leo XIV, who responded personally with thanks for the work that had been done. Pope Leo's first remarks on the balcony of St Peter's have already affirmed his own commitment to this continuing journey.

The School for Synodality is a project working across the dioceses of England and Wales, and further afield, to support the lived experience of synodality in the life of the Church. The Archdiocese has been working with the School in developing programmes and resources to support this work, see: https://www.schoolforsynodality.org.uk/

To help unpack the Final Synod Document the School has brought together several speakers who were all participants in the Synod on Synodality for a webinar series which started Wednesday (21st May). Over 6 weeks Dr Jos Moons SJ, Professor Anna Rowlands, Dr Estela Padilla, Professor Cathy Clifford, Fr David McCallum SJ, Sandra Chaoul and Archbishop Jason Gordon, Archbishop of Port of Spain, will take us through a section of the document with time for questions afterwards.

### **JUBILEE PILGRIMAGE TO ITALY**

This September, members of our parish community will undertake a very special journey in celebration of the Jubilee Year—a sacred pilgrimage to Italy, visiting some of the most important sites in our Catholic heritage. Fr Mark has now finalised the itinerary with our Travel Company.

We depart from Manchester on Monday, 8 September at 07:45, with Rome as our first destination. For three grace-filled nights, we will stay in the Eternal City, celebrating Mass at the heart of our faith—St Peter's Basilica—and, we hope, also at the Venerable English College, a place dear to the history of the Church in England. The highlight of our time in Rome will be processing together through the Holy Door of St Peter's, entering the Jubilee with open hearts and renewed hope. We will visit all four Major Basilicas—St Peter's, St John Lateran, St Mary Major, and St Paul Outside the Walls—drawing us ever deeper into the spirit of the Holy Year. We will also join pilgrims from around the world for Pope Leo's General Audience, a powerful witness to the universality of our faith.

Leaving Rome, we journey into the peaceful hills of Lazio to visit Subiaco, where St Benedict first embraced the monastic life in silence and solitude. From there, we continue to San Giovanni Rotondo, the home of St Pio (Padre Pio), where we will spend two nights learning from his example of suffering, holiness, and deep devotion to the Eucharist.

Our next stop is Assisi, where we will spend two nights walking in the footsteps of St Francis and St Clare, embracing their message of simplicity, peace, and trust in God's providence. On the way, we will make a special visit to Lanciano, the site of a profound Eucharistic Miracle, reminding us of the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament.

Finally, we return to Rome on Monday, 15 September, filled with memories and blessings, arriving back in Manchester later that afternoon.

Please keep all our pilgrims in your prayers as we prepare for this journey of faith, encounter, and renewal during this Holy Year of Hope

### **FEAST OF THE WEEK**

St John Rigby (1570-1600)

St. John Rigby was a young layman who lived during the tumultuous time of the English Reformation, when practicing the Catholic faith was considered a crime. Born into a recusant family around 1570, he managed to live quietly as a servant in a noble household. His moment of witness came not through preaching or public protest, but when he delivered a message to a prisoner—an imprisoned Catholic—and openly admitted his own Catholic faith in the process.

For this simple act of honesty and fidelity, he was arrested, interrogated, and ultimately condemned to death

John Rigby did not seek martyrdom, but when it came, he embraced it with serenity and forgiveness. He was only about thirty years old when he was executed at Tyburn in 1600. His death is a powerful reminder that sainthood can be found in ordinary people living quiet lives of conviction. St. John Rigby calls us to be brave, faithful, and true in the small moments that reveal our deepest commitments. In a world that often values compromise over truth, his witness encourages us to stand firm in our beliefs, no matter the cost. May we, like him, be faithful in both word and deed

His feast day is celebrated next Saturday. St. John Rigby, pray for us

#### **PARISH NEWSLETTER & GDPR**

THE GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGULATION (GDPR), which came into effect on May 2018, has imposed some new ways of administration and management of information in different institutions and/or organisations. The Church is not an exception. As a result of this development, there have been some noticeable changes in the administration of our parish, especially when publishing names of the sick, deceased etc in parish newsletters.

It has always been best practice to obtain consent before putting someone's name on a sick list, as some people, for a whole variety of reasons do not want their name published. Changes in data protection law mean that it is now necessary.

1 Do I need the consent of the person before their name can be published in the Newsletter? Yes, if a 'sick' list is put up at church or published in the parish newsletter (whether or not that newsletter is posted on the parish website).

Why? Because a name on a sick list is special category personal data (because it reveals information about the person's health) and can only be disclosed outside the church with the consent of the sick person. Once a name is on a newsletter the church has no control over where that information may end up.

2 Do I need permission before I can add their name to a published list? If a person is well enough to do so easily, you can ask them to sign a simple form. If you do not think it appropriate to ask the sick person to sign a form, then you can ask them whether they want their name to be on the sick list. You should tell that person what happens to the sick list in your parish, ie whether it goes on the church wall/ newsletter/website. You should then make a note of the conversation as evidence of the fact that you obtained oral consent. Why? Because everyone has a right to know what the parish will do with their information.

We are pleased to restart a sick list, etc, in the weekly Newsletter, but permission MUST be obtained from the person or next of kin whose name you wish to submit. To do this, please take a form from the back of the church or the parish office, complete it, and return it. The published list will remain in the Newsletter for six months before it is removed.
