



This week, as the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, we are reminded of two very different men united by one mission: to proclaim Christ to the world. Peter, the humble fisherman chosen to be the rock of the Church, and Paul, the zealous persecutor turned Apostle to the Gentiles, embody the transforming grace of God. Their lives—and deaths testify to the courage born of faith.

In a world fractured by division, war, and fear, their witness speaks powerfully. Just this past week, the headlines have been filled with stories of political upheaval, suffering in conflict



zones, and tensions among nations. How tempting it is to despair or to withdraw into silence. But Peter and Paul show us another way: not silence, but proclamation. Not despair, but hope.

Peter, even after his denial, found the mercy of Christ and led the fledgling Church through storms of persecution. Paul, blinded by pride, became a tireless evangelist once he encountered the light of the Risen Lord. Their journeys remind us that God's grace can work through our weakness, if we remain open to it.

As we watch the world struggle, let us take inspiration from these Apostles. The Church is not called to retreat from the world but to enter it with truth and love. Let us pray for the courage to speak and act, not from anger or fear, but from the deep conviction that Christ is Lord of history.

Peter and Paul laid down their lives in Rome, the heart of an empire. Today, may we lay down our comforts, our doubts, even our pride, to bring Christ to the heart of our own communities.

THE EQUESTRIAN ORDER OF THE HOLY SEPULCHRE OF JERUSALEM

Fr Mark was away last weekend, attending ceremonies of the Order of the Holy Sepulchre.

The Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem is one of the oldest Catholic orders of knighthood, with origins dating back to the Crusades. Today, it is a papal order of knighthood under the protection of the Holy See, with the Pope as the Sovereign of the Order. Its mission is deeply rooted in supporting the Christian presence in the Holy Land, particularly through the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem.

Members of the Order—lay men, women and clergy- commit to living out their faith through prayer, charitable works, and active support of the Church in the land where Jesus lived, died, and rose again. They are known as Knights and Dames of the Holy Sepulchre and are called to be witnesses of the Resurrection in their daily lives.


The Lieutenancy of England and Wales, established in 1954, is the regional body that oversees the Order's mission in our country. Members regularly gather for prayer, formation, and fellowship, and work to raise funds for schools, parishes, and humanitarian projects in the Holy Land. Their efforts help to sustain Christian communities often under pressure and to keep alive the living stones of our faith. There are approximately 550 members in this country.

While the Order has a distinctive ceremonial and historical identity, its heart is service, supporting peace, justice, and hope for Christians in the Holy Land. You may encounter members wearing a capes with a red Jerusalem cross, symbolising their commitment to Christ and His Church. Knights and Dames living in the North West regularly visit our parish to celebrate Mass with Archbishop Malcolm, the local Prior.

Fr Mark has been a Knight of the Holy Sepulchre for 20 years and now holds senior positions within the Lieutenancy of England and Wales. He is the Ecclesiastical MC and Spiritual Director and is the most senior cleric after the Grand Prior, the Archbishop of Southwark.

Last weekend, Knights and Dames from across England and Wales, along with visiting members from many other countries, gathered in St George's RC Cathedral, Southwark, for the Investiture of eight new Knights and one Dame. The weekend also saw the Installation of the new Lieutenant of England and Wales, His Excellency John McNally.

Knights and Dame<mark>s from across the world will gather in Rome</mark> later this year to celebrate the Holy Year with Pope Leo.

St Thomas the Apostle

THE PALLIUM

Today, our new Archbishop is in Rome to receive the Pallium from Pope Leo at a solemn liturgy in Rome. Rooted in the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul, this ancient woollen vestment symbolises the shepherd's yoke—echoing Christ the Good Shepherd—placed upon him by the hands of the Successor of Peter.



For the Church in Liverpool, the Pallium carries profound significance.

It affirms the full pastoral authority granted to Archbishop John as Metropolitan of the Northern Province, marking not only his unity with the Holy Father but his responsibility to guide, protect, and unite the local Church

The Archbishop is first and foremost the chief shepherd of his own archdiocese. Like any bishop, he teaches, sanctifies, and governs the faithful in his care, helping to ensure that the Gospel is preached and the sacraments are celebrated faithfully.

The Archbishop of a Metropolitan See also has certain responsibilities over an ecclesiastical province, which includes his own archdiocese (the metropolitan see) and several suffragan dioceses (neighbouring dioceses under his care in a limited, supportive way). There are 5 Metropolitan Sees in England & Wales, Liverpool is the largest which covers 6 diocese's

As he returns to Liverpool, this token reminds clergy and laity alike of our shared mission—to bear one another's burdens and witness boldly to the Gospel.

May Archbishop Sherrington, weighed by this symbol of unity and service, lead with compassion and conviction, fostering communion and evangelising hope across our communities.

There will be a special Mass in the Metropolitan Cathedral, possibly in the Autumn, when Archbishop John will have the pallium placed on him by the Apostolic Nuncio (the Pope's Ambassador in Great Britain).

JUBILEE PILGRIMAGE TO ITALY

This September, members of our parish community will undertake a very special journey in celebration of the Jubilee Year—a sacred pilgrimage to Italy, visiting some of the most important sites in our Catholic heritage. Fr Mark has now finalised the itinerary with our Travel Company.

We depart from Manchester on Monday, 8 September at 07:45, with Rome as our first destination. For three grace-filled nights, we will stay in the Eternal City, celebrating Mass at the heart of our faith—St Peter's Basilica—and, we hope, also at the Venerable English College, a place dear to the history of the Church in England. The highlight of our time in Rome will be processing together through the Holy Door of St Peter's, entering the Jubilee with open hearts and renewed hope. We will visit all four Major Basilicas—St Peter's, St John Lateran, St Mary Major, and St Paul Outside the Walls—drawing us ever deeper into the spirit of the Holy Year. We will also join pilgrims from around the world for Pope Leo's General Audience, a powerful witness to the universality of our faith.

Leaving Rome, we journey into the peaceful hills of Lazio to visit Subiaco, where St Benedict first embraced the monastic life in silence and solitude. From there, we continue to San Giovanni Rotondo, the home of St Pio (Padre Pio), where we will spend two nights learning from his example of suffering, holiness, and deep devotion to the Eucharist.

Our next stop is Assisi, where we will spend two nights walking in the footsteps of St Francis and St Clare, embracing their message of simplicity, peace, and trust in God's providence. On the way, we will make a special visit to Lanciano, the site of a profound Eucharistic Miracle, reminding us of the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament.

Finally, we return to Rome on Monday, 15 September, filled with memories and blessings, arriving back in Manchester later that afternoon. Please keep all our pilgrims in your prayers as we prepare for this journey of faith, encounter, and renewal during this Holy Year of Hope

PARISH NEWSLETTER & GDPR

THE GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGULATION (GDPR), which came into effect on May 2018, has imposed some new ways of administration and management of information in different institutions and/or organisations. The Church is not an exception. As a result of this development, there have been some noticeable changes in the administration of our parish, especially when publishing names of the sick, deceased etc in parish newsletters.

It has always been best practice to obtain consent before putting someone's name on a sick list, as some people, for a whole variety of reasons do not want their name published. Changes in data protection law mean that it is now necessary.

1 Do I need the consent of the person before their name can be published in the Newsletter? Yes, if a 'sick' list is put up at church or published in the parish newsletter (whether or not that newsletter is posted on the parish website).

Why? Because a name on a sick list is special category personal data (because it reveals information about the person's health) and can only be disclosed outside the church with the consent of the sick person. Once a name is on a newsletter the church has no control over where that information may end up.

2 Do I need permission before I can add their name to a published list? If a person is well enough to do so easily, you can ask them to sign a simple form. If you do not think it appropriate to ask the sick person to sign a form, then you can ask them whether they want their name to be on the sick list. You should tell that person what happens to the sick list in your parish, ie whether it goes on the church wall/ newsletter/website. You should then make a note of the conversation as evidence of the fact that you obtained oral consent. Why? Because everyone has a right to know what the parish will do with their information.

We are pleased to restart a sick list, etc, in the weekly Newsletter, but permission MUST be obtained from the person or next of kin whose name you wish to submit. To do this, please take a form from the back of the church or the parish office, complete it, and return it. The published list will remain in the Newsletter for six months before it is removed.

LIVERPOOL METROPOLITAN CATHEDRAL

Last week, the Metropolitan Cathedral of Christ the King in Liverpool was officially upgraded from Grade II* to Grade I listed status by the Department for Culture, Media and Sport, following Historic England's recommendation.

This distinction—reserved for buildings of "exceptional architectural and historic interest"—recognises Sir Frederick Gibberd's groundbreaking 1960s circular, modernist design, built atop Sir Edwin Lutyens' unfinished crypt. Once divisive, its conical concrete form and central lantern are now praised as a "revolution in cathedral design."

Archbishop John, City and Religious Leaders celebrated the move, declaring it a major cultural landmark that enriches Liverpool's skyline and spiritual life.

Both Cathedrals in Liverpool now have this unique status.
