

Today's readings are a mixture of exhortations to be gentle and humble in our own lives, and to give practical hospitality to the poor.

Jesus's teaching in the Gospel is in the setting of a meal. His parable touches into our feelings of pride or shame and instructs us to be humble. Invitations to his banquet show a definite preference for the poor and lowly.

God is pleased with those who are humble. A humble person knows that all good comes from God and that any talents we have are gifts from God. Humble people do not think that they are better or more important than others.

The values of the Kingdom of God are rather different to some of the values of our culture. Instead of asking, "What's in it for me?" we're being called upon to deny ourselves and our status and seek the lowest place. Instead of accruing friends and followers, we should make our option for "the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind." Jesus calls us not just to help those in need but to invite them to the feast. When we have a meal, it is not just about sharing food. We spend time with people; we listen to their stories and share their hopes and dreams and get to know them.

In this Jubilee year, as Pilgrims of Hope, as we seek to share the good things of this earth, can we also make space and time to listen to the voices of people experiencing poverty, facing war and displacement, and impacted by climate change, and truly affirm their innate dignity?

How can we grow in humility in the coming weeks? We can recognise and praise other people's strengths. Be pleased about other people's successes and avoid criticising others. Apologise if we know we are wrong and admit our faults to God and ask for forgiveness.

JUBILEE PILGRIMAGE TO ITALY

Very soon, members of our parish community will undertake a very special journey in celebration of the Jubilee Year—a sacred pilgrimage to Italy, visiting some of the most important sites in our Catholic heritage. Fr Mark has now finalised the itinerary with our Travel Company.

We depart from Manchester on Monday, 8 September at 07:45, with Rome as our first destination. For three grace-filled nights, we will stay in the Eternal City, celebrating Mass at the heart of our faith—St Peter's Basilica—and, we hope, also at the Venerable English College, a place dear to the history of the Church in England. The highlight of our time in Rome will be processing together through the Holy Door of St Peter's, entering the Jubilee with open hearts and renewed hope. We will visit all four Major Basilicas—St Peter's, St John Lateran, St Mary Major, and St Paul Outside the Walls—drawing us ever deeper into the spirit of the Holy Year. We will also join pilgrims from around the world for Pope Leo's General Audience, a powerful witness to the universality of our faith.

Leaving Rome, we journey into the peaceful hills of Lazio to visit Subiaco, where St Benedict first embraced the monastic life in silence and solitude. From there, we continue to San Giovanni Rotondo, the home of St Pio (Padre Pio), where we will spend two nights learning from his example of suffering, holiness, and deep devotion to the Eucharist.

Our next stop is Assisi, where we will spend two nights walking in the footsteps of St Francis and St Clare, embracing their message of simplicity, peace, and trust in God's providence. On the way, we will make a special visit to Lanciano, the site of a profound Eucharistic Miracle, reminding us of the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament.

Finally, we return to Rome on Monday, 15 September, filled with memories and blessings, arriving back in Manchester later that afternoon.

Please keep all our pilgrims in your prayers as we prepare for this journey of faith, encounter, and renewal during this Holy Year of Hope

CAFOD: RESPONSE IN GAZA - FURTHER UPDATE

With your support, CAFOD is still working with partners in Gaza to deliver medical services, cash assistance and vital food supplies.



In the last month alone, the generosity of Catholics in England and Wales has:

- Supported 1,400 households with cash assistance, enabling families to meet their most urgent needs with dignity and choice.
- With a new supply of chronic illness medications available, helped ensure these life-saving treatments reach patients who need them.
- Helped Caritas Jerusalem to continue provide healthcare services to displaced families, despite recent damage to one of their buildings in Deir al Balah. Our support contributes to this resilience, helping ensure patients can still access treatment in the midst of disruption.

The situation on the ground is still unimaginably difficult for our partners and communities – but with your recent donations they are providing rice and bread to 2,000 people. This is just one of the life-saving interventions you've made possible. Your donations to Gaza since the start of the conflict have been a vital lifeline. Right now, CAFOD's partner, Caritas Jerusalem, is delivering essential medical treatment to displaced people and providing medicines to treat chronic illnesses.

With the attacks intensifying on the overcrowded Gaza city, where so many have taken refuge, we must not turn away from our neighbours in need. We must continue to raise our voices to our government to urge them to do all they can.

Earlier this month Cardinal Vincent Nichols called for peace: "Already too much innocent blood has been shed; too many lives destroyed; too much hunger and starvation. This war must be ended not increased."

Pope Leo this week also called us to pray and fast for peace on the commemoration of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which was celebrated on Friday, 22 August.

Please continue to pray for peace, and an end to the suffering in Gaza

CSSA PUBLIC CALL FOR SURVIVOR INPUT

As part of the Catholic Safeguarding Standards Agency's (CSSA) focus on survivor engagement and support, they have created a public survey inviting survivors to contribute their experiences.

The purpose of this public call is to gather information from anyone who has had recent contact with a diocese or a Religious Life Group. This includes experiences that are new or ongoing, as well as those connected to non-recent abuse.

Their primary focus is the period from July 2024 onwards, but they do not wish to limit what survivors choose to share. More information regarding this survey can be found here: Public Calls for Information
