




In today's Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the persistent widow who never gives up seeking justice. Day after day, she pleads with an indifferent judge until, worn down by her perseverance, he finally grants her request. Jesus concludes: if even an unjust judge can be moved by persistence, how much more will our loving Father respond to those who cry out to Him in faith.

This weekend, we celebrate World Mission Sunday, when Catholics across the world unite in prayer and generosity for the Church's missionary work. Like the widow, missionaries often labour in difficult places, where progress is slow and hope seems fragile. Yet they persevere—trusting in God's promise that faithfulness will bear fruit.

The widow's persistence mirrors the Church's mission itself: patient, courageous, and rooted in hope. To "pray always and not lose heart" is a call not only to perseverance in prayer, but also to perseverance in love. Every Christian is called to be a missionary—through prayer, witness, and support for those who dedicate their lives to the Gospel.

Today we give thanks for all who serve the mission of the Church, especially priests like Fr Stephen and his brother priests, who bring Christ's presence to our parishes and communities, both here and abroad. Through their prayer, service, and sacrifice, the mission of Christ continues in our midst.

May we, too, be persistent in prayer and steadfast in faith, so that when the Son of Man comes, He will indeed find faith alive on the earth—and burning brightly in us.

2. Are we a parish that honours the vocation of all the baptised?

What are the most effective ways in which we honour the vocation of all the baptised? What groups or people might not feel that they are being honoured? What do we see as the potential for future development?

3. Are we a parish where synodality is embedded?

What are the most effective ways in which we have embedded synodality in parish life? What groups or people might not feel that they are being heard? What do we see as the potential for future development?

4. Are we a parish that renews its organisational structures and administers its property to serve its mission?

What are the most effective ways in which we use our resources for mission? What are the issues that prevent us from fulfilling this task? What do we see as the potential for future development?

5. Are we a parish where young people and young adults flourish?

What are the most effective ways in which we enable young people to flourish? What would young people say we are not getting right? What do we see as the potential for future development?

6. Are we a parish that cares for its priests?

What are the most effective ways in which we support our local priest(s)? What ways might our priests(s) feel unsupported? What do we see as the potential for future development?

7. Are we a parish that is aware of "green shoots". Positive signs for the future?

What are the encouraging signs of hope in our parish? What are we not getting right that we could with changes? What do we see as the potential for future development?

FEAST OF THE WEEK Saint John Paul II (1920-2005)

Karol Józef Wojtyła was born in 1920 in Wadowice, Poland. After his ordination to the priesthood and theological studies in Rome, he returned to his homeland and resumed various pastoral and academic tasks. He became first auxiliary bishop and, in 1964, Archbishop of Kraków and took part in the Second Vatican Council.

On 16 October 1978 he was elected pope and took the name John Paul II. His exceptional apostolic zeal, particularly for families, young people and the sick, led him to numerous pastoral visits throughout the world.

Among the many fruits which he has left as a heritage to the

Church are above all his rich Magisterium and the promulgation of the Catechism of the Catholic Church as well as the Code of Canon Law for the Latin Church and for the Eastern Churches.

In Rome on 2 April 2005, the eve of the Second Sunday of Easter, he departed peacefully in the Lord. He was canonized alongside Pope John XXIII by Pope Francis on 27 April 2014. The Canonisation Mass was unique as 4 Popes were involved: Pope Francis & Pope Benedict in attendance, with the remains of Pope John XXIII and Pope John Paul II in St Peter's Sq

CSSA PUBLIC CALL FOR SURVIVOR INPUT

As part of the Catholic Safeguarding Standards Agency's (CSSA) focus on survivor engagement and support, they have created a public survey inviting survivors to contribute their experiences.

The purpose of this public call is to gather information from anyone who has had recent contact with a diocese or a Religious Life Group. This includes experiences that are new or ongoing, as well as those connected to non-recent abuse.

Their primary focus is the period from July 2024 onwards, but they do not wish to limit what survivors choose to share. More information regarding this survey can be found here: Public Calls for Information
