


In today's Gospel (John 1:29–34), John the Baptist does something very simple and very brave: he points away from himself and says, "Behold, the Lamb of God." He recognises Jesus not through noise or spectacle, but through attentiveness — watching, listening, and trusting what God is quietly revealing. John speaks of seeing the Spirit descend and remain upon Jesus. That word matters. God is not distant or passing through. In Jesus, God chooses to stay, to dwell among us, especially in places marked by uncertainty, struggle, and hope held onto against the odds.

This week, I will be taking part in the Vatican's Holy Land Co-ordination meeting in Jerusalem. Today, we are visiting Taybeh, the last remaining entirely Christian village in the West Bank — a community of deep faith and resilience, but one living with real pressures and daily challenges.

Over the course of the week, we will also be meeting many people and institutions across the Holy Land to see how they continue to be people of hope, often in very difficult situations: parishes, schools, charities, and dialogue groups who quietly refuse to give up, and who continue to witness to faith, dignity, and perseverance.

Like John the Baptist, the role of the Holy Land Co-ordination is not to draw attention to itself, but to point — to Christ alive and active in His people. Our presence is an act of solidarity, a way of saying: you are not forgotten; you are not alone; God remains with you.

As we hear John's words this Sunday, may we learn again to recognise the Lamb of God — not only at the altar, but in the lives of those who continue to hope, believe, and love in His name.

Please keep the people of the Holy Land, and all whom we meet this week, in your prayers.



## FEAST OF THE WEEK

Blessed Cyprian Michael Iwene Tansi (1903-1964)

Blessed Cyprian Michael Iwene Tansi (1903-1964) was born in Aguleri, in eastern Nigeria. Baptised as a young man, he quickly developed a deep love for prayer, the sacraments, and disciplined Christian living.

Ordained a priest in 1937 for the Archdiocese of Onitsha, he became widely respected for his holiness, pastoral zeal, and firm but compassionate guidance, especially in strengthening Christian marriage and moral life.



Drawn to a more contemplative path, Fr Tansi discerned a vocation to the monastic life and, in 1950, entered

Mount Saint Bernard Abbey in England, becoming a Trappist monk and taking the name Cyprian. Despite fragile health, he embraced monastic life with humility, silence, and fidelity until his death in the Leicester Royal Infirmary on 20 January 1964, aged 61.

Blessed Cyprian Tansi was beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1998 and is remembered as a bridge between cultures and vocations, witnessing that holiness is found in faithful obedience, prayer, and quiet perseverance.
