


**ENGLISH MARTYRS****ST ROBERT BELLARMINE**

“Whoever loves God must also love his brother.”

Those words could almost be a quiet summary of today’s Gospel. In Matthew’s Beatitudes, Jesus sits, looks out at an ordinary crowd, and describes what a blessed life really looks like. Not powerful. Not perfect. But gentle, merciful, hungry for justice, and willing to stand with those who suffer.

The Beatitudes turn the world upside down. They tell us that God is closest not to the loudest voices or the strongest hands, but to the poor in spirit, the meek, the peacemakers. In other words, God’s heart is drawn to those who know their need—and to those who recognise the dignity of others.

That is why this Gospel speaks so clearly on Racial Justice Sunday. Racism begins when we stop seeing one another as brothers and sisters and start seeing labels instead. It grows when fear replaces encounter, and silence replaces compassion. The Beatitudes challenge that directly. You cannot be merciful and dismiss another’s pain. You cannot hunger for righteousness and ignore injustice. You cannot claim to love God while refusing to love the person God places before you.

St John puts it plainly: “Whoever loves God must also love his brother.” Love of God is never abstract. It is tested in how we speak, how we listen, how we welcome, and how we stand alongside those who feel unseen or excluded.

This week, the Beatitudes invite us to a simple but demanding question: Who is my neighbour today—and how can I love them as God loves me? Sometimes justice begins not with grand gestures, but with a changed heart, a listening ear, and the courage to treat every person as truly blessed.



FEAST OF THE WEEK

Blessed Benedict Daswa (1946-1990)

Born on 16 June 1946 in Mbabe, near Thohoyandou in Limpopo, South Africa. Raised in the traditional religion of his parents, he encountered the Catholic faith as a teenager and was baptised at the age of seventeen. Inspired by a local catechist and by Saint Benedict, he chose the name Benedict and shaped his life around the motto *ora et labora* – “pray and work”.

A devoted husband and father, Blessed Benedict made his home a true domestic church, centred on prayer, Scripture, and a deep devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. He took seriously his responsibility to pass on the faith to his children. He was also an active member of his parish, serving as a voluntary catechist, youth leader, and regularly leading Sunday services when no priest was available.

Professionally, Benedict was a school principal and a committed advocate for the welfare of his local community. His Christian faith led him to take a public stand against witchcraft and sorcery, practices that often brought fear and violence to innocent people. Knowing the risks involved, he nevertheless chose to remain faithful to the Gospel.

On 2 February 1990, he was attacked and killed for his beliefs. He left behind his wife and seven children; an eighth child was born after his death. Blessed Benedict Daswa was beatified as a martyr on 13 September 2015. He remains a powerful role model of courage, faith, and Christian family life. His feast day is celebrated today, Sunday 1st February.



FR MICHAEL DE FELICE

Please pray for the soul of Father Michael de Felice, who died on Saturday, 17 January. he was in the 61st year of the priesthood. For many years, he was the parish priest of St Joan of Arc, Bootle.

Fr Michael was born in Fauldhouse, Scotland, on 26 May 1932. Educated in Glasgow, he later felt called to religious life and joined the Franciscans, being ordained to the priesthood in 1965. Alongside his priestly formation, he trained as a teacher and served in education and parish life in Edinburgh and London.

In 1975 he was appointed Guardian of St Mary of the Angels, Fox Street, Liverpool. After leaving the Franciscans, he was incardinated into the Archdiocese of Liverpool in 1982 by Archbishop Derek Worlock. Following parish appointments in Liverpool and Roby, he became priest-in-charge of St Joan of Arc, Bootle, in 1987, serving the parish faithfully until its closure in 2009.

Fr Michael was known as a gentle, kind and devoted parish priest, especially attentive to the sick and those who had drifted away from the Church. He was also involved in the Eldonian Village and committed to social justice.

After retirement, he continued to serve by supplying in parishes for many years. Proud of his Scottish and Italian heritage.

May he rest in peace.

The details you provide the online form will be shared with the Dean of the area of which you have applied, your local parish, and the Diocesan administration team. It may be shared with other parties associated with Diocesan sacramental preparation and relevant and appropriate Diocesan bodies and authorities.

Your local parish will be in touch after registration period ends on the 13 February (you will not be contacted beforehand) with details about meetings in your local area. You will likely be contacted after Easter. Please do not worry if you are not contacted immediately. If you have any queries, please contact your own parish priest.

The information you provide will be held for the sacramental year (which ends on the day new application forms go online for the succeeding sacramental preparation year) and your contact information may be used to contact you by email, text, letter or phone.
