

On the First Sunday of Lent, we are taken into the wilderness with Jesus. Before He begins His public ministry, before the miracles and the crowds, He faces temptation.

The desert is not just a place on a map. It is the place of hunger, loneliness, and testing. After forty days of fasting, Jesus is tempted in three familiar ways: to turn stones into bread, to grasp power and glory, and to test God's protection. In other words, He is tempted to put Himself first, to take shortcuts, and to avoid the slow path of trust.

The temptations are subtle. Bread is not wrong. Authority is not wrong. Trusting God is not wrong. But each suggestion invites Jesus to step outside the Father's will – to choose control instead of obedience.

Lent places us in that same wilderness. We may not hear dramatic voices, but we know the quiet pull to comfort, recognition, or self-reliance. We know how easy it is to justify small compromises. The Gospel reminds us that temptation often sounds reasonable.

Jesus answers each temptation with Scripture. He anchors Himself in the Word of God. He chooses trust over spectacle, service over dominance, faithfulness over convenience.

That is our Lenten invitation. Not simply to give something up, but to learn again how to trust. To feed on God's Word. To resist the urge to live on our own terms.

The desert is not a place of defeat. It is where faith is strengthened. And when Lent is lived well, it leads us – step by step – towards the joy of Easter.



Each Friday in Lent, we walk with Jesus on the road to Calvary. The Stations of the Cross invite us not simply to remember what happened long ago, but to stand close to the Lord in His suffering love. At every fall, every encounter, every moment of pain, we see how far God is willing to go for us.

The Stations teach us that we are never alone in our own crosses. Christ has walked this path before us. When we pray the Stations, we place our struggles, our families, our parish, and our world into His wounded hands. Lent gives us this quiet space to slow down, to reflect, and to let His sacrifice shape our hearts.

The Stations of the Cross will be prayed each Friday after the 10:00am Mass at St Robert Bellarmine and on Sundays at 4:00pm at English Martyrs.

Faith has been a constant inspiration in Rónán’s life, leading him to co-found the Emmaus Christian music band and community. The band has released 15 albums of worship and contemporary Christian music, and Rónán has become an international conference speaker and teacher on praise and worship.

It all began for Rónán – also affectionately known as Rojo – growing up in a musical family in Cabinteely, Co. Dublin.

“It was all about music from an early age,” Rónán says. “I played piano from the age of six and started writing songs from the age of seven. Dad and granddad were both musical, but everyone in the house played and we would sing in the car – music was part of who we were.”

Rónán is married to Joanne, a session vocalist and primary school teacher. They have two children, Naoise and Siún, and they live in Co. Wicklow where Rónán has a music studio.

## FEAST OF THE WEEK

Blessed Josepha Girbes (1820-1893)

Josepha Naval Girbés was born at Algemes in the Archdiocese of Valencia, Spain, on December 11, 1820. As a very young woman she consecrated herself to the Lord by a perpetual vow of chastity. Josepha's life was simple. She stood out for her ardent love, and she made progress along the way of prayer and evangelical perfection, while dedicating herself generously to apostolic works in her parish community. In her own home she opened a school where she taught needlework, prayer, and the evangelical virtues. She formed many young girls and women and shared with them her wisdom and spiritual understanding. She was a member of the Third Order Secular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel and Saint Teresa of Jesus, and had a special love for the Virgin Mother of God. Her holy death took place on February 24, 1893. She is buried in her parish church of Saint James in her native city.

## LENTEN PRACTICES

Lent has a very particular feel to it – and that is quite deliberate.

From Ash Wednesday, the Church gently changes her tone. The sanctuary looks simpler. The rubrics are clear; flowers disappear, and we won't see any until Easter, although some pink flowers are allowed on the 4th Sunday. The Gloria falls silent. Even the music becomes more restrained and can only be used if it includes people singing. It can feel a little stark at first – especially if we're used to colour and celebration – but this simplicity is not about gloom. It is about focus.

The absence of flowers is not because beauty doesn't matter. It is because we are creating space. Just as we might clear a room before beginning something important, the Church clears away what is decorative so that we can concentrate on what is essential: prayer, repentance, and renewal. When the flowers return at Easter, they will speak all the more powerfully of resurrection and joy.

You may also notice that the Gloria is not sung during Lent (except on certain feasts), and the word "Alleluia" disappears entirely from the liturgy until the Easter Vigil. Music remains an important part of our worship, but it is simpler and more reflective. The organ is used more sparingly. Silence is allowed to breathe. All of this helps us enter more deeply into this sacred season.

Lent is not meant to be miserable. It is meant to be intentional. The Church, like a wise mother, adjusts the environment so that our hearts can adjust too.

Over these forty days, may the simplicity of our liturgy help us rediscover what truly matters – and prepare us to rejoice with full hearts when Easter dawns.
