



**ST ROBERT
BELLARMINE**

In the Bible, important things happen on mountains.

Moses met God on a mountain. On Mount Sinai he received the Ten Commandments. It was a place of silence, awe and listening. Later, Jesus would go up a mountain to teach the Beatitudes. Again and again in Scripture, a mountain is a place where heaven seems close and hearts are changed.

On the Second Sunday of Lent, Jesus takes Peter, James and John up a high mountain. There He is transfigured before them. His face shines. His clothes become dazzling white. For a moment, the disciples see who He truly is.



Why a mountain?

Because mountains lift us above the noise. They help us see more clearly. From the top, the view is different. What seemed large below can appear small. What seemed confusing can begin to make sense.

Lent is a kind of mountain. It asks us to step away from distractions and climb a little higher in prayer, sacrifice and charity. It may take effort, but the view is worth it. On the mountain of the Transfiguration, the Father says, “This is my beloved Son. Listen to him.”

That is our task this Lent. To climb. To listen. To let Christ show us who He is — and who we are called to become.




For disarmament and peace

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Each Friday in Lent, we walk with Jesus on the road to Calvary. The Stations of the Cross invite us not simply to remember what happened long ago, but to stand close to the Lord in His suffering love. At every fall, every encounter, every moment of pain, we see how far God is willing to go for us.

The Stations teach us that we are never alone in our own crosses. Christ has walked this path before us. When we pray the Stations, we place our struggles, our families, our parish, and our world into His wounded hands. Lent gives us this quiet space to slow down, to reflect, and to let His sacrifice shape our hearts.

The Stations of the Cross will be prayed each Friday after the 10:00am Mass at St Robert Bellarmine and on Sundays at 4:00pm at English Martyrs.

There will be some occasions when Fr Mark is unavailable. If you would be willing to lead the Stations on one of those days, please give your name to the Parish Office.

What "mountain" can I climb this week — even in a small way — to step away from noise and truly listen to Jesus?

2nd SUNDAY OF LENT

The Second Sunday of Lent takes us up the mountain with Jesus at the Transfiguration. Peter wants to stay there — “Lord, it is good that we are here.” And who can blame him? Light. Clarity. Certainty. But Jesus leads them back down.

That’s important. Lent isn’t about escaping life. It’s about letting what happens on the “mountain” change how we live in the valley. So what might that look like — practically?

1. Choose one moment of light each day.

Five quiet minutes. No phone. No noise. Just sit with the Lord. Read the Gospel slowly. Let one line stay with you. The Father’s words are simple: “Listen to him.” Lent is a season of listening.

2. Bring the mountain into your home.

A small prayer corner. A candle at the dinner table once a week. A family decade of the Rosary. Faith grows when it is visible and shared.

3. Come down the mountain differently.

After Sunday Mass, ask: What am I taking with me? A word from the homily? A line from Scripture? Let it shape one decision during the week — a harder kindness, a forgiven hurt, a phone call you’ve been putting off.

The Transfiguration reminds us that glory is real — but so is the road ahead. Lent is not gloomy; it is purposeful. We glimpse the light so that we can walk through the darker places with hope.

This week, keep it simple:

Listen.

Carry the light home.

And walk back down the mountain changed.

Faith has been a constant inspiration in Rónán’s life, leading him to co-found the Emmaus Christian music band and community. The band has released 15 albums of worship and contemporary Christian music, and Rónán has become an international conference speaker and teacher on praise and worship.

It all began for Rónán – also affectionately known as Rojo – growing up in a musical family in Cabinteely, Co. Dublin.

“It was all about music from an early age,” Rónán says. “I played piano from the age of six and started writing songs from the age of seven. Dad and granddad were both musical, but everyone in the house played and we would sing in the car – music was part of who we were.”

Rónán is married to Joanne, a session vocalist and primary school teacher. They have two children, Naoise and Siún, and they live in Co. Wicklow where Rónán has a music studio.

FEAST OF THE WEEK

St David (520-589)

The earliest life of St David dates from five centuries after his death, probably in 589.

He became eminent as abbot and bishop at the site now known as St David's, but formerly Mynyw, from which the present diocese of Cardiff-Menevia is named. He is credited with a monastic rule based on the example of the Eastern Fathers, and also with a Penitentiary.

He was invited to preside at the synod of Llandewibrefi. Monks trained at his monastery evangelized South Wales and made foundations in Cornwall, Brittany and Ireland.



St David is said to have sent a Mass rite to Ireland. At his death his contemporary St Kentigern, founder of St Asaph's in North Wales, witnessed in vision his joyful entrance into the joy of his Lord.

His holy relics have been found hidden in the fabric of St David's Cathedral, where they are carefully preserved. He was canonized by Pope Callistus II in 1123.

St Robert Bellarmine School

LENTEN PRACTICES

Lent has a very particular feel to it – and that is quite deliberate.

From Ash Wednesday, the Church gently changes her tone. The sanctuary looks simpler. The rubrics are clear; flowers disappear, and we won't see any until Easter, although some pink flowers are allowed on the 4th Sunday. The Gloria falls silent. Even the music becomes more restrained and can only be used if it includes people singing. It can feel a little stark at first – especially if we're used to colour and celebration – but this simplicity is not about gloom. It is about focus.

The absence of flowers is not because beauty doesn't matter. It is because we are creating space. Just as we might clear a room before beginning something important, the Church clears away what is decorative so that we can concentrate on what is essential: prayer, repentance, and renewal. When the flowers return at Easter, they will speak all the more powerfully of resurrection and joy.

You may also notice that the Gloria is not sung during Lent (except on certain feasts), and the word "Alleluia" disappears entirely from the liturgy until the Easter Vigil. Music remains an important part of our worship, but it is simpler and more reflective. The organ is used more sparingly. Silence is allowed to breathe. All of this helps us enter more deeply into this sacred season.

Lent is not meant to be miserable. It is meant to be intentional. The Church, like a wise mother, adjusts the environment so that our hearts can adjust too.

Over these forty days, may the simplicity of our liturgy help us rediscover what truly matters – and prepare us to rejoice with full hearts when Easter dawns.
