






**ST ROBERT
BELLARMINE**

Palm Sunday always carries a strange mix of emotions. It begins with joy – palms raised, voices lifted, “Hosanna!” – and yet, almost immediately, the tone shifts. The same crowd that welcomes Jesus will, before long, cry out for his crucifixion. In a single liturgy, we are drawn into both triumph and suffering.

This year, I would like to offer a simple theme for Holy Week: “Stay with him.” It is something I will reflect on each day at Mass throughout the coming week. It is a quiet invitation, but a profound one – not to rush ahead or stand at a distance, but to remain close to Jesus as he walks the path of his Passion.

Holy Week invites us not simply to remember these events, but to enter into them. It asks each of us: will I stay with him? It is easy to be part of the crowd on Palm Sunday, full of enthusiasm when things feel hopeful. But the deeper call of this week is to remain when the mood changes – when the road becomes difficult, when love becomes costly, when faith asks more of us.

We stay with him in the Upper Room, where he gives himself to us in the Eucharist. We stay with him in Gethsemane, where he asks his friends to watch and pray. We stay with him at the Cross, where love is poured out completely. And we stay, too, in the silence of Holy Saturday, holding onto hope when everything seems lost.

Perhaps this week we can simply take a little more time – for prayer, for Scripture, for quiet presence.

Because the heart of Holy Week is not just what Jesus does for us, but whether we will remain with him in love.



FEAST OF THE WEEK

St John Payne

John Payne (or Paine) was born in Peterborough into a Church of England family but in his early adult life became a Catholic. He went to the English College at Douai in 1574 and was ordained priest in 1576; the short time he was at the college may suggest that he had studied theology elsewhere.



He returned to England in the company of Cuthbert Mayne (1st December). He went to Essex where he stayed at the home of the Petre family in Ingatestone Hall. From here he ministered to local Catholics, while apparently working as an estate steward.

In 1577 he was imprisoned for a short time, afterwards returning briefly to Douai. He came back to Essex and continued working as a priest until in 1581 he was once again arrested. He was imprisoned at Greenwich, being charged with conspiracy against the Queen, was racked in the Tower, and was sentenced to be hanged, drawn and quartered. He denied the evidence brought against him completely, stating at his trial “that he always, in mind or word, honoured the queen’s majesty above any woman in the world; that he would gladly always have spent his life for her pleasure in any lawful service; that he prayed for her as for his own soul; that he never invented or compassed any treason against her majesty, or any of the nobility of England.”

He was executed at Chelmsford on 2 April. He was so well known and respected in the neighbourhood that the crowd compelled the hangman to wait until he was dead before cutting him down.

CHRISM MASS

This very special occasion in the life of the Archdiocese takes place on Wednesday 7.30pm in the Metropolitan Cathedral. Bishops, Priests & Deacons will gather with Archbishop John to participate with him as he blesses the sacred oils.

The Church makes use of three holy oils: the oil of the sick, the oil of the catechumens and the holy chrism oil. The first two are blessed, and the Archbishop consecrates the third. The oils are then distributed to all the parishes in the Archdiocese to be used until Easter 2026. Please go along and be part of this wonderful celebration.

A Practical Way to Live for Holy Week

“Stay with him.”

Holy Week is the heart of our faith. We walk with Jesus through the most sacred days of all – from the Upper Room to the Cross, and into the silence of the tomb. This week is not about doing more, but about staying close.

1. Choose to be present

Holy Week can easily pass by like any other week. Make a simple decision: I will be present. Come to one extra liturgy if you can. Give a little more time to prayer. Stay with him, deliberately.

2. Sit with the Gospel each day

Take just a few minutes to read the Gospel of the day slowly. Place yourself in the scene. Watch what Jesus does. Listen to what he says. Let the story unfold – and stay there.

3. Stay with him in the Eucharist

On Holy Thursday, Jesus gives himself completely. If you can, spend a few quiet moments before the Blessed Sacrament. No need for many words – just be there with him.

4. Stay when it becomes difficult

In Gethsemane, the disciples struggled to remain. Notice the moments this week when prayer feels dry, or life feels heavy. Instead of walking away, stay – even briefly.

5. Stand at the Cross

On Good Friday, take time to pause. Whether at church or at home, spend a few moments in silence. Let yourself be there. This is what love looks like.

6. Wait in hope

Holy Saturday is quiet, uncertain, unfinished. Resist the urge to rush to Easter. Stay in the stillness.

God is at work, even when nothing seems to be happening.

7. End each day simply

Ask yourself: Where did I stay with him today? Where is he inviting me to remain tomorrow?

Because the grace of this week is not that we understand everything – but that we do not walk away.
