

### ST ROBERT BELLARMINE



One of the deepest human thirsts is the thirst to be truly known and loved. In the Gospel for the Third Sunday of Lent, we meet the Samaritan woman at the well (John 4:5–42). She comes to draw water in the heat of the day, perhaps avoiding others, perhaps carrying the weight of her past. Yet it is there, in that ordinary moment, that she encounters Jesus.

Jesus begins with a simple request: “Give me a drink.” It is a striking moment. The Son of God asks something of her. He meets her where she is, not with condemnation, but with conversation.

Very quickly the discussion moves from ordinary water to something deeper. Jesus speaks of “living water” – the life of God within us. The woman initially thinks only of the well in front of her. But slowly she begins to understand that Jesus is speaking about the deeper thirst of the human heart: the thirst for meaning, forgiveness, hope and love.

Like the woman at the well, we all carry our own stories, struggles and disappointments. Yet the message of this Gospel is simple and beautiful: Jesus meets us there. He does not wait for us to become perfect before speaking to us. He meets us in the middle of ordinary life and offers us the living water of his grace.

Lent is a time to rediscover that living water. Through prayer, reconciliation, and time with the Scriptures, Christ gently draws us back to the well.

And when we truly encounter him, like the Samaritan woman, we cannot keep the good news to ourselves.



## FEAST OF THE WEEK

### St John Ogilvie (1579-1615)

John Ogilvie was born of noble Calvinist parents in 1579 at Drum-na-Keith in Banffshire, Scotland. As a boy he was sent to the continent to further his education. With the help of Father Cornelius van den Steen, he was received into the Catholic Church. He entered the Jesuits on the 5th November 1599, and was ordained priest at Paris in 1610. He returned to his native country, but his ministry was cut short by his betrayal and capture in Glasgow. After extreme suffering he was hanged on the 10th of March 1615. The principal cause of his martyrdom was his insistence on the primacy of the Pope in spiritual matters, a primacy he affirmed with great constancy to the very end. His last words were “If there be here any hidden Catholics, let them pray for me but the prayers of heretics I will not have.” After he was pushed from the ladder, he threw his hidden Rosary beads out into the crowd. One of his enemies caught them, and he became a devout Catholic for the rest of his life.



## **THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT – Thirst for Living Water**

On the Third Sunday of Lent we meet Jesus at the well with the Samaritan woman. It is a very ordinary place – a well at midday, a tired traveller, a woman coming for water. Yet in that simple moment something extraordinary happens. Jesus speaks to her heart.

He says: “Whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst.”

At first the woman thinks Jesus is talking about ordinary water. But Jesus is speaking about something deeper – the thirst within every human heart. We all know that thirst. The desire for meaning, forgiveness, peace, love. We try to satisfy it in many ways, but only God can truly fill it.

Lent is a time when we allow Jesus to meet us at our own “well”. So what might that look like in practice this week?

### **1. Notice your thirst.**

Take a moment each day to ask yourself: What is my heart really longing for right now? Peace? Strength? Forgiveness? Bring that honestly to the Lord in prayer.

### **2. Let Jesus speak to you.**

Spend a few quiet minutes with the Gospel story this week (John 4:5-42). Imagine yourself sitting beside the well with Jesus. Let one phrase stay with you during the day.

### **3. Share the water.**

After meeting Jesus, the woman runs back to her town and tells others. When our faith touches our hearts, it naturally flows outward. A kind word, encouragement, a simple act of patience – these can be ways of sharing that living water.

The Samaritan woman came to the well expecting ordinary water. She left with something far greater – hope.

This week keep it simple:

Bring your thirst to Jesus.

Listen to his voice.

And let his living water flow into the lives of others.

## LENTEN PRACTICES

Lent has a very particular feel to it – and that is quite deliberate.

From Ash Wednesday, the Church gently changes her tone. The sanctuary looks simpler. The rubrics are clear; flowers disappear, and we won't see any until Easter, although some pink flowers are allowed on the 4th Sunday. The Gloria falls silent. Even the music becomes more restrained and can only be used if it includes people singing. It can feel a little stark at first – especially if we're used to colour and celebration – but this simplicity is not about gloom. It is about focus.

The absence of flowers is not because beauty doesn't matter. It is because we are creating space. Just as we might clear a room before beginning something important, the Church clears away what is decorative so that we can concentrate on what is essential: prayer, repentance, and renewal. When the flowers return at Easter, they will speak all the more powerfully of resurrection and joy.

You may also notice that the Gloria is not sung during Lent (except on certain feasts), and the word "Alleluia" disappears entirely from the liturgy until the Easter Vigil. Music remains an important part of our worship, but it is simpler and more reflective. The organ is used more sparingly. Silence is allowed to breathe. All of this helps us enter more deeply into this sacred season.

Lent is not meant to be miserable. It is meant to be intentional. The Church, like a wise mother, adjusts the environment so that our hearts can adjust too.

Over these forty days, may the simplicity of our liturgy help us rediscover what truly matters – and prepare us to rejoice with full hearts when Easter dawns.
