A main feature of the Easter season is our reading from the Acts of the Apostles at Mass each day, it offers us a timely and reassuring reminder about the life of the Church.

The Acts of the Apostles, written by Saint Luke around 80–90 AD, is the continuation of his Gospel. It tells the story of what happens after the Resurrection and Ascension – how the Church begins and grows under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

What stands out very quickly is that the Church is never static. From the very beginning, it is a community on the move. New situations arise, new communities are formed, and new challenges appear. The apostles and early Christians are constantly having to respond, to adapt, and to find their way forward.

And that feels very familiar.

We are living through a time when the Church is changing. We see it in the patterns of parish life, in communities coming together, and in the realities we are being asked to face. At times, that can feel uncertain, even unsettling.

But Acts reminds us of something essential: change is not a sign that God has abandoned His Church – quite the opposite. The same Holy Spirit who guided the early Christians through uncertainty, growth, and challenge is still present and active today.

They did not always have a clear plan. They did not always know what would come next. But they trusted, they prayed, and they moved forward with courage.

That is our call too.

As we listen to Acts in these weeks, we are invited not simply to look back, but to recognise our own place in that same story – and to trust that the Holy Spirit will continue to guide the Church, and each one of us, into the future.

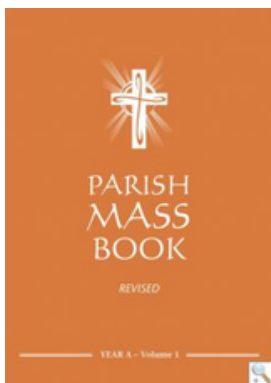

HOLY HOUR

The Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales has invited Catholics across the country to unite in prayer through a special Holy Hour for the dignity of human life, to be held on Sunday 19 April at 4:30pm.

Communities are encouraged to join spiritually with the bishops by holding a Holy Hour locally, offering a visible and prayerful witness to the sanctity of life. The initiative comes as peers in the House of Lords continue to debate proposed legislation on assisted suicide.

In a recent Lenten message, Archbishop John Sherrington, Lead Bishop for Life Issues, reaffirmed the Church's opposition to the Terminally Ill (Adults) End of Life Bill. He called on the faithful to pray particularly for those nearing the end of their lives, for their carers, and for all parliamentarians engaged in this important debate. Here in the archdiocese, Archbishop Sherrington has echoed this call, encouraging parishes to participate in the Holy Hour as a sign of unity with the wider Church in England and Wales. This shared moment of prayer offers an opportunity to commend the gift of life to the Lord and to seek His guidance for society at a critical time.

The Holy Hour in the Archdiocese will take place at Christ the King, Childwall, this Sunday at 4.30pm

EASTER HOLY WATER- A SIGN OF NEW LIFE

At the Easter celebrations, the blessing of water is a quiet but powerful moment. This year, it took place both at the Easter Vigil and again on Easter morning, reminding us of our baptism—when we were brought into the life of the risen Christ.

Fr Mark blessed the Easter water with the new Paschal Candles—a beautiful sign of the light and life of the Risen Lord.

Each time we bless ourselves with holy water, we are not just recalling the past; we are renewing who we are now: people of the Resurrection.

The Easter water is available in both churches throughout the Easter season, and you are warmly invited to take some home. Let it be a simple, daily reminder: Christ is risen, and His life is alive in you.

FEAST OF THE WEEK

St George (-c303)

Saint George is one of the most well-known and loved saints in the Church, and the patron saint of England. Although many of the stories about him have grown over time, the heart of his life is clear and compelling.



George was a Roman soldier, probably born in what is now modern-day Turkey, and served in the army of the Emperor Diocletian. During this time, Christians were being persecuted. George refused to renounce his faith in Christ and spoke openly about it, despite the danger. For this, he was arrested and eventually put to death around the year 303 AD.

His reputation for courage and faith spread quickly across the Christian world. By the Middle Ages, he had become especially venerated in England. He was declared patron saint of England in the 14th century, particularly under King Edward III, who placed England under St George's protection and founded the Order of the Garter in his honour. St George came to symbolise courage, chivalry, and the defence of the Christian faith.

The famous story of St George and the dragon is a later legend, but it expresses a deeper truth: the triumph of good over evil, and of faith over fear.

St George reminds us that holiness is not about extraordinary things, but about fidelity – standing firm in our faith, whatever the cost.

His feast day is celebrated on Thursday.
