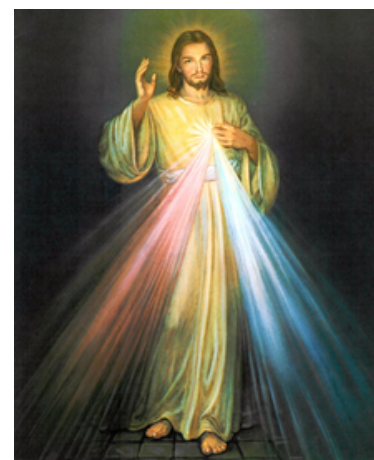
In the Gospel for this Sunday, we meet the disciples behind locked doors – afraid, uncertain, unsure of what comes next. And into that fear, the risen Jesus comes and stands among them. His first words are simple: “Peace be with you.” Not a rebuke, not a question – just peace. It’s a reminder that the Resurrection is not only about new life, but about a new kind of presence. Jesus comes to meet us exactly where we are, even when we feel closed in or unsettled.

Thomas often gets remembered for his doubt, but perhaps he is simply honest. He wants to see, to touch, to know for himself. And Jesus does not reject him for that. Instead, He invites him closer. “Put your finger here... do not doubt but believe.” Faith is not the absence of questions; it is the willingness to bring those questions to Jesus.

And then comes that beautiful moment: “My Lord and my God.” Thomas’ doubt becomes one of the clearest professions of faith in the Gospel.

This Sunday is also known as Divine Mercy Sunday, and that fits perfectly. The risen Christ shows His wounds – not hidden, not erased, but transformed. They become signs of mercy, not defeat. And He breathes that mercy out into the world through His disciples.

We are part of that same story. Like the disciples, we bring our fears. Like Thomas, we bring our questions. And like them, we are met by Jesus, who offers peace, mercy, and the quiet invitation to believe.

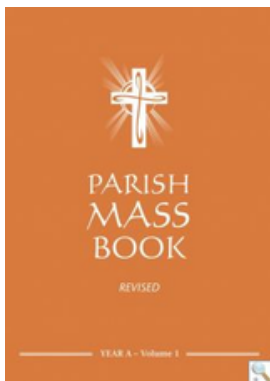

EASTER HOLY WATER- A SIGN OF NEW LIFE

At the Easter celebrations, the blessing of water is a quiet but powerful moment. This year, it took place both at the Easter Vigil and again on Easter morning, reminding us of our baptism—when we were brought into the life of the risen Christ.

Fr Mark blessed the Easter water with the new Paschal Candles—a beautiful sign of the light and life of the Risen Lord.

Each time we bless ourselves with holy water, we are not just recalling the past; we are renewing who we are now: people of the Resurrection.

The Easter water is available in both churches throughout the Easter season, and you are warmly invited to take some home. Let it be a simple, daily reminder: Christ is risen, and His life is alive in you.

FEAST OF THE WEEK

St Bernadette Soubirous (1844-1879))

Saint Bernadette Soubirous is known for the apparitions at Lourdes, but the Church honours her not simply for what happened to her, but for how she lived.

Two virtues stand out: suffering and humility.

Despite lifelong illness, Bernadette never used her suffering as an excuse. She endured it with patience and quiet strength — a challenge to us when we let smaller difficulties affect our attitude or responsibilities.

Even more striking is her humility. Though she became famous almost overnight, drawing crowds and attention, she never saw herself as important. Her famous image of the broom captures this perfectly: she was simply a tool used by Our Lady, then set aside. She was content to return to obscurity.

Her life reminds us that holiness is not about extraordinary experiences, but about how we respond to ordinary life — with patience in suffering and humility in success.
