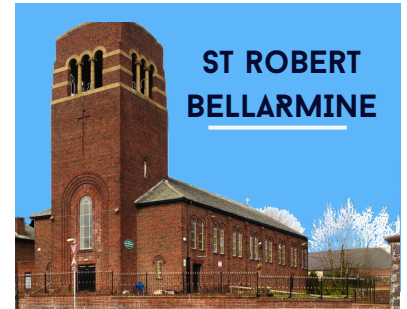

**ST ROBERT
BELLARMINE**

There's a lovely moment in today's Gospel when Jesus lifts His eyes to heaven and begins to pray for His disciples. It is a deeply personal prayer, spoken just before His Passion. Knowing all that lies ahead, Jesus does not focus on Himself, but on those He loves. He prays that they may remain faithful, united, and protected in the Father's love.

Perhaps one of the most comforting truths of our faith is that Jesus prays for us. Sometimes we imagine prayer as something we do for God, but in today's Gospel we are reminded that Jesus Himself intercedes for His people. Even in moments when we struggle to pray, when faith feels difficult or life feels uncertain, Jesus holds us before the Father.

A few years ago, Pope Francis spoke about this very passage and said that Jesus "never stops praying for us." It is a simple but powerful thought. We are never forgotten. Our worries, our families, our fears, our hopes, all are carried in the heart of Jesus.

This Sunday also falls between the Ascension and Pentecost, a time when the disciples were waiting, uncertain of what would come next. They had seen Jesus ascend to the Father, but the gift of the Holy Spirit had not yet arrived. They were living in that uncomfortable space between promise and fulfilment. Many of us know that feeling well. We wait for answers, for healing, for peace, for clarity.

Yet the disciples teach us something important: they stayed together and they stayed faithful. They prayed. They trusted. And in time, the Holy Spirit came with power and hope.

As we prepare for Pentecost next Sunday, perhaps we might ask ourselves a simple question: do I truly believe that Jesus is praying for me, even now? If we hold onto that truth, it can give us courage for whatever lies ahead.

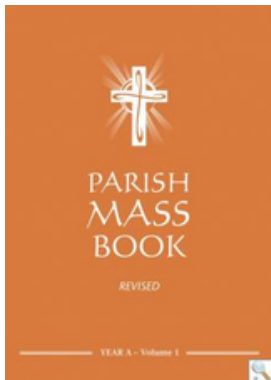

FEAST OF THE WEEK

St Bernardino of Siena (1380-1444)

Bernardino (“Little Bernard”) was born in Tuscany. His parents died when he was a child. While still a student at the University of Siena he took charge of the hospital there when an epidemic killed most of the staff. Later he looked after a bedridden aunt until her death; and then, at the age of 22, he became a Franciscan.



Inspired by St Vincent Ferrer, he was an energetic and popular preacher and spent years travelling on foot through Italy preaching to enormous audiences. He denounced usury, promoted peace among the warring Italian cities, and worked hard for the reform and discipline of the Franciscan order, and for church unity. Bernardino’s achievements before he became a Franciscan show what the young can achieve if given the chance. Let us try not to confirm them in a culture of enforced irresponsibility, but to encourage each of them to give to others whatever they have been called into this world to give.
