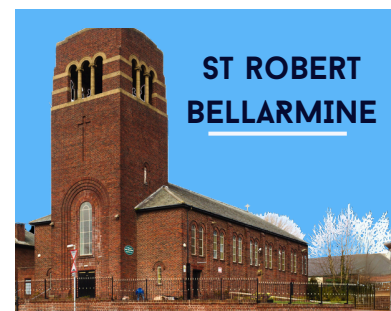

There's something deeply reassuring in the words of Jesus in today's Gospel: "Do not let your hearts be troubled." He knows how easily we can become anxious, uncertain, even discouraged. And yet he doesn't offer quick fixes or easy answers—he offers himself. "I am the way, and the truth, and the life." In other words, the path forward is not a plan, but a person.

That matters, especially when things don't go as expected. This week, I should have been travelling to Jerusalem to fulfil my duties as a Canon, a journey I had been looking forward to, not just practically, but spiritually. That visit, however, has had to be cancelled. And with that comes a certain disappointment, perhaps even a sense of being unsettled. Instead, I have been invited to Rome to attend meetings of the Bishops' Holy Land Co-ordination Group, an unexpected change, and one that reminds me that the Lord's work continues, even when it takes a different shape.

The Gospel gently brings us back to what really matters: our peace does not come from everything going according to plan. It comes from trusting that Jesus is still leading us, even when the road changes. "Do not let your hearts be troubled... trust in me."

Jerusalem holds a special place in the heart of the Church, but the presence of the Risen Jesus is not confined there. He is just as present here, in our parish, in our homes, in the ordinary rhythms of daily life. And perhaps that is part of the invitation this week, to rediscover that the "way" is not always about where we go, but how we walk, and with whom.

Even in disappointment, Jesus remains our guide. And if we stay close to him, we are never truly off course.

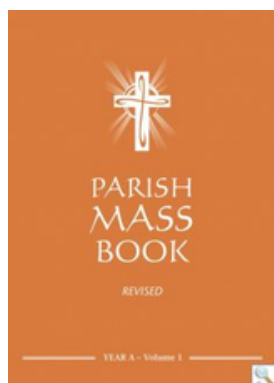

FEAST OF THE WEEK

The English Martyrs

There is something quietly powerful about the witness of the English Martyrs. They were not people seeking attention or drama. Most of them simply wanted to live their faith, celebrate the Mass, and remain faithful to Jesus and His Church in a time when doing so came at a very real cost. And yet, in that quiet fidelity, they showed extraordinary courage.



Think of St Edmund Campion, a brilliant scholar who could have enjoyed a comfortable life, but instead returned to England knowing what awaited him. Or St Margaret Clitherow, a wife and mother who risked everything to shelter priests. Their lives were different, but their faith was the same: steady, faithful, and rooted in love.

What strikes us is not just how they died, but how they lived. They were ordinary people placed in extraordinary circumstances. They didn't wake up one morning suddenly brave. Their courage was formed over time, through prayer, through the sacraments, and through daily acts of trust in God.

And here, in our own parish, their witness is not distant. We see it every time we look around our church. Their names adorn our walls, and we are rightly proud of that. Not as a decoration, but as a reminder. These were real people, who lived and suffered for the faith we share today. Their presence among us calls us to something deeper.

We may not be asked to face what they faced, but we are asked to live with the same faithfulness. In a world where faith can feel private or even inconvenient, the martyrs remind us that Jesus is worth everything, not just in moments of crisis, but in the quiet, hidden choices of each day.
