There's a quiet but powerful line in this Sunday's Gospel:

“If you love me, you will keep my commandments.”

At first hearing, it can sound a little demanding—almost like love has conditions attached. But Jesus isn't setting a test. He's describing a relationship.

Think of someone you truly love. You don't follow their wishes out of fear or obligation, but because your heart is already turned toward them. Love naturally shapes what we do. That's what Jesus is getting at. The Christian life isn't about ticking boxes or following rules from a distance—it's about staying close to Him.



And He promises something remarkable: we are not left alone. “I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate.” The Holy Spirit is given to us—not as a vague idea, but as a real presence, guiding, strengthening, and gently reminding us of who we are.

In a world that can feel uncertain and noisy, that matters. We're not left to figure everything out on our own. God is not distant. He is with us—closer than we sometimes realise.

Perhaps this week, the question isn't “Am I getting everything right?” but something simpler: “Am I staying close to Jesus?” Because when we do that—through prayer, through small acts of kindness, through quiet faithfulness—everything else begins to fall into place.

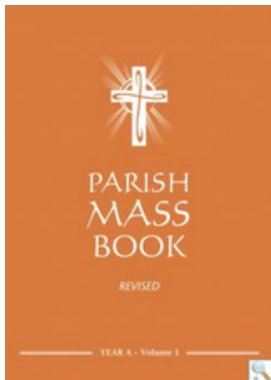

## FEAST OF THE WEEK

St Damien of Molokai (1840-1899)

There's something deeply moving about the life of Saint Damien of Molokai, a priest who quietly lived the Gospel in one of the most forgotten places on earth. In the 19th century, the Hawaiian island of Molokai became a place of exile for those suffering from leprosy (Hansen's disease). People were sent there and left, cut off from their families, often without proper care or hope. Into that isolation stepped a young Belgian priest, Damien de Veuster. What began as a temporary mission soon became his life.



Damien didn't just minister to the people, he lived with them. He built homes, organised schools, dug graves, and celebrated the sacraments. But more than anything, he restored dignity. Where others saw disease, he saw Christ. Where others kept their distance, he drew close. Eventually, he contracted the disease himself, and from that moment he no longer spoke of "my parishioners," but "we lepers." What makes his witness so powerful isn't just his courage, but his closeness. He didn't solve everything. He couldn't. But he refused to leave people alone in their suffering. He stayed.

In many ways, his life asks us a quiet but searching question: who are the "forgotten" people in our own world? They may not be far away. They might be the lonely neighbour, the struggling family, the person who feels unseen even in a crowded room. We may not be called to Molokai, but we are called to that same kind of presence, to draw near, to listen, to care, and to love without keeping our distance.
