Tomorrow the Church celebrates the feast of Saints John Fisher and Thomas More, two remarkable men who gave their lives for Christ and the truth of the Gospel. Their witness holds a special place in the history of our parish.



When English Martyrs Church was being built, Saints John Fisher and Thomas More had recently been canonised by Pope Pius XI in 1935. Their canonisation renewed interest in the courage and sacrifice of those who remained faithful to the Catholic faith during the Reformation. It was in that context that the new church was dedicated to the English Martyrs, honouring all those who suffered and died for their faith in England and Wales.

John Fisher, Bishop of Rochester, and Thomas More, Lord Chancellor of England, were very different men. One was a bishop, the other a husband, father and statesman. Yet both shared a deep love for Christ and an unwavering commitment to conscience. They refused to compromise their faith, even when it cost them their freedom and ultimately their lives.

Their example remains important for us today. We may not face the same dramatic choices, but we are still called to live our faith with courage and integrity. In a world where it can be tempting to follow the crowd, Fisher and More remind us that holiness often means standing firm in what is right, speaking the truth with charity, and placing God first in our lives.

As a parish, may we continue to draw inspiration from their witness, asking their prayers that we may be faithful disciples of Christ in our own generation.

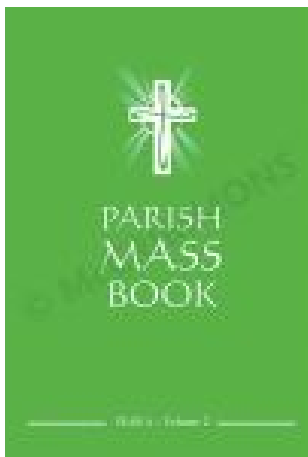

# Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time 21 June 2026

## **SALAMEH AZAR**

Fr Mark was delighted to receive some good news that, after a period of uncertainty, Salameh Azar, a seminarian from the Latin Patriarchal Seminary in Bethlehem, has been granted a visa to visit us in July.

Salameh is 26 years old and comes from the town of Beit Jala, situated just outside Bethlehem. He is currently studying for the priesthood for the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem and is looking forward to spending some time with us here in the parish.



Fr Mark and Salameh will arrive home on 7 July, and Salameh will remain with us until the final week of July. During his visit, he hopes to experience the life of the Church outside the Holy Land, improve his English, and enjoy a period of rest and relaxation before continuing his formation for the priesthood.

God willing, Salameh will be ordained to the Diaconate shortly before Christmas as he enters the final stages of preparation for his priestly ordination, hopefully in the Summer of 2027. We are privileged to accompany him for a small part of that journey and to support him with our friendship and prayers.

His visit is also a reminder of some of the realities faced by Palestinians in the Holy Land. Although Salameh lives less than an hour from Tel Aviv Airport, he is not permitted to travel through it. Instead, he and Fr Mark will have to travel into Jordan and fly from Amman, adding an extra day or two to their journey. It is one of the many practical difficulties that affect everyday life for Palestinians.

Over the ten years that Fr Mark has served in Litherland, the parish has welcomed many seminarians and priests from the Holy Land. Many parishioners will remember meeting them, sharing stories with them, and supporting them with prayers and friendship. Salameh will be the last seminarian to visit the parish before Fr Mark moves to St Paul's, West Derby, in September, making this visit particularly special.

The Christian community in the Holy Land faces many challenges, and opportunities such as this are both valuable and encouraging for seminarians preparing for ministry. We hope that Salameh will feel at home among us and will take away happy memories of his time in Liverpool.

Please join us in extending a warm welcome to Salameh when he arrives. Keep him in your prayers as he continues his journey towards ordination, and please make him feel very much part of our parish family during his stay.

Everyone is warmly invited to attend. We would be delighted to see a large congregation present for this special occasion. Please make every effort to join us and help give Salameh a warm Liverpool welcome.

## **FR MARK AWAY**

Fr Mark will now be away from the parish for a number of important Church commitments both in England and the Holy Land.

He will begin by travelling to London to attend meetings of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales and the International Affairs Department. From there, he will travel to Arundel Cathedral for the annual Investiture weekend of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem, where he serves as the National Ecclesiastical Master of Ceremonies and Spiritual Director. This year's Investiture will be a particularly special occasion for our parish, as one of our parishioners, Shaun Lavery, will be invested as a Knight of the Holy Sepulchre. We offer Shaun our congratulations and assure him of our prayers as he begins this new chapter of service to the Church.

After a brief return home for a couple of days, Fr Mark will then fly to Jordan to attend two ordinations before travelling on to Bethlehem for a further ordination. These visits form part of his ongoing work and support for the Church in the Holy Land.

Fr Mark and Salameh will return to Liverpool on 7 July. A huge thank you to Fr Stephen for looking after us.

## **DAY FOR LIFE**

This Sunday, 21 June, we mark Day for Life, the day in the Church's calendar when we come together to celebrate the dignity of all human life from conception to natural death.

This year's theme is 'The Wonder of the Child in the Womb'. A child is a gift from God to be nurtured and cherished, but the theme also recognises the tragedy of babies who died before birth and the grief experienced by their parents and families.

Pope Leo has said he "was pleased to learn of the theme chosen for this year, focused on the wonder of the full humanity of the child in the womb, as well as of efforts to support mothers and fathers who have suffered the loss of an infant."

## **Lay Board Members wanted for Archdiocesan Parish Centre Management Company (APCMC)**

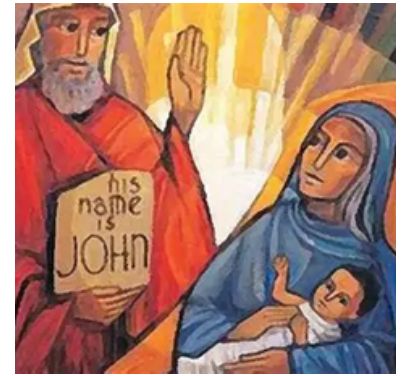
For the first time, APCMC is seeking to appoint two new lay board members to bring professional expertise and fresh perspectives to the management of our parish centres.

## FEAST OF THE WEEK

### The Nativity of St John the Baptist

On 24 June the Church celebrates the Nativity of St John the Baptist, one of the few saints whose birth, rather than death, is commemorated in the liturgical calendar. This reflects the unique role that John played in God's plan of salvation.



John was chosen by God from before his birth to prepare the way for Jesus. His mission was simple but vital: to point people towards Christ. Throughout his life he never sought attention for himself. Instead, he constantly directed others to the Lord, famously saying, "He must increase; I must decrease."

The feast falls close to the longest days of the year. As the daylight begins gradually to diminish after John's birth, the Church sees a beautiful symbolism in his words. John steps back so that Christ, whose birth we celebrate six months later as the days begin to lengthen, may shine more brightly.

In a world that often encourages self-promotion and recognition, John the Baptist offers a different example. He teaches us humility, courage and faithfulness. He was not afraid to speak the truth, even when it cost him dearly, and he remained steadfast in his calling to prepare hearts for the coming of Christ.

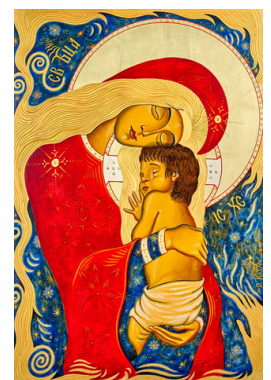
